Federal Surplus Property

Mission

To manage the transfer of Federal surplus property to eligible donees including: State agencies, municipal governments, schools, and eligible non-profit organizations.

Overview

The Federal Surplus program acquires and distributes surplus property from various federal sources. Public entities (towns, schools, districts, volunteer fire departments, etc.) and non-profit organizations conducting educational and health care programs may apply for eligibility. This property is not available to the general public.

The program is operated in accordance with Federal law and the General Services Administration's (GSA) regulations and policies. An Application for Eligibility form must be completed/submitted in order to establish eligibility for the Federal surplus property program.

Federal surplus property is available for donation to towns, municipalities, schools, eligible non-profits, veteran groups. Eligible donees pay only Administrative fees and shipping costs (when applicable).

Program Goals

Facilitate and manage the acquisition of federal surplus property for state agencies, municipalities and eligible non-profits.
