As many of you already know, CVU was defaced with racist and antisemitic hate speech, and such hate does not belong here, in our state, or at all. Even more recently, pride artwork was defaced at Hinesburg Community School, which prompted an incredible movement and rally in late May to reflect the strength of the LGBTQIA+ movement here in Hinesburg, and proves that, as I mentioned before, hate has no home in Hinesburg, or in Vermont. We will take what we've done here and move forward, as our work and movement towards true equality is far from over. Until every member of the LGBTQIA+ community and their allies feel safe, appreciated, celebrated, welcomed, in every sphere of their life, we will not stop. The work is hard, and the hate is sometimes persistent, but as a community, we will rise up until we are all equal.
