Alex, Sarah and Bill,

Attached is a draft letter the maple industry would like the Governor to send to the AG in California requesting she squash the effort to sue VT maple importers to label their products as being injurious to human health or stop importing maple products. This prospective suit stems from Prop 65 which has forced a great deal of labeling of a wide range of products.

The issue for VT maple is the allegation that VT maple (and other maple too) contains potentially dangerous levels of lead and therefore needs to be labeled accordingly in compliance with Prop 65. There is an exemption to the Prop 65 requirement for "naturally occurring" presence of lead. The VT maple producers want to exercise this exemption and want the Governor to send a letter like the one attached to the AG.

Diane Zamos, the Agency's attorney, is redrafting the letter to get it to one page and reflect VT's maple interest.

Diane Zamos will have a new draft by Thursday. I have copied her so she can send it to all of you.

THE QUESTION: Is the Governor willing to send such a letter?

Diane is also working to see if AG Sorrell might be willing to send such a letter.

I am willing to sign such a letter if that is more comfortable but a letter from the Gov likely to be more impactful.

The VT Maple producers also want Senator Leahy to send such a letter as well. I am not sure he will but you should know the request is pending.

I have been in touch with David Marvin and an attorney they are using. They are working with a broad array of maple producers including international association which includes Canada.

They are anxious to get a sense from us and send the letter soon.

I am taking a few days off but can be reached on my cell (522 6666) and will be checking emails in spite of the automatic message from my computer.
