2 The Committee on Appropriations to which was referred Senate Bill
3 No. 250 entitled “An act relating to law enforcement data collection and
4 interrogation” respectfully reports that it has considered the same and
5 recommends that the report of the Committee on Government Operations be
6 amended in Sec. 4, study on deceptive and coercive methods of law
7 enforcement interrogation; report, by striking out subsection (b) in its entirety
8 and inserting in lieu thereof a new subsection (b) to read as follows:

9 (b) The Committee shall have the administrative, technical, and legal
10 assistance of the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Committee may have the
11 assistance of the Vermont Criminal Justice Council in drafting the report,
12 along with any other stakeholders interested in assisting. On or before
13 December 1, 2022, the Committee shall submit a report on the study providing
14 legislative recommendations, or whether no legislative changes are needed;
15 proposed next steps; or that the study is incomplete.
