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
AOE Draft Org Chart

Vacancies

- In August 2018, the AOE had approximately 25 vacancies with 6 positions under active recruitment.
- As of February 1, 2019, the AOE had 27 vacancies with 15 positions under active recruitment. Of these 15 positions, offers of employment have been made to 4 candidates.

Capacity is directly related to the complexity of the work.
