Sorry for confusion earlier, here is latest on DLS day. I am trying to get TJ's office to connect directly with DMV so everyone can agree on the details (how much the fines will be reduced by, etc). Meanwhile, all seem to agree that it makes sense for GPS to only attend the pre-March 20 press conference to publicize the event. (Amnesty Day itself will basically be a bunch of people coming through traffic court.) So, the request is to plan a press conference for either the first or second week of March to publicize amnesty day. I am assuming our office can take lead on that once the terms of "amnesty" are worked out by the relevant agencies. Hope that makes sense. For now, let me know which days in the first two weeks of March work for us and we can start running those with the other folks involved.
