


Department of State's Attorneys & Sheriffs
 State's Attorneys Budget
 FY 2020 Governor's Recommend Budget

MISSION: The Dept. of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs has the statutory responsibility to provide budgetary and administrative structure and oversight for the 14 State's Attorneys' offices and the 14 Sheriffs' offices in each Vermont county. State's Attorneys are the chief prosecutors in each county, statutorily charged with enforcing state and local laws, and protecting the public and victims, through prosecution and other administrative actions. Our SA and DSA staff prosecute a myriad of offenses including homicides, sexual assaults, drug trafficking, robberies, crimes against children, impaired driving, etc. They determine charges and diversion options.

FY20 SUMMARY & HIGHLIGHTS

- 3.4% increase in General Fund
- 136 positions:
 14 State's Attorneys: 12 full-time State's Attorneys and 2 part-time State's Attorneys (Essex and Grand Isle counties);
 58 Deputy State's Attorneys (DSA) in the 14 offices. Six (6) are grant-funded (CCVS/USDOJ STOP, Governor's Highway Safety, WomenSafe);
 26 Victim's Advocates funded by state and federal funds received by the Center for Crime Victim Services;

- Pressures on field offices include need for additional deputy attorneys; significant caseloads; increase cases dealing with complex and violent crimes, abuse and neglect of children, vulnerable populations; post-conviction relief cases.
- The Department will likely be engaged in negotiating a first-contract agreement with VSEA covering the field staff; as discussed with the Legislature in 2017 when it passed S.131, increased/unbudgeted costs are expected as a result of the contract.
- Increased costs for experts in fields of child psychology, addictive personality, competency issues, impaired driving.
- Prosecutors are engaged in significant case file review to examine appropriate alternate sanctions/treatment programs based upon defendant's mental health, substance abuse or poverty issues.
- Need to continue Phase II of Criminal Case Management System to improve data-sharing with Judiciary, DPS, DG, others.
- Challenges in recruitment and retention of attorney staff.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE'S ATTORNEYS and SHERIFFS

The Department of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs (SAS) was statutorily created in 1974 to provide a unitary structure and oversight for the budgetary and administrative functioning of the 14 State's Attorneys' Offices and for the 14 Sheriffs' Offices. In 2006, the Legislature added the Office of Special Investigation Units (SIU) to the Department. These three entities share an Executive Director who provides centralized support services to the Offices and their staff. The Department also administers statewide and local grants for the offices, (e.g. Victim Advocates, STOP Prosecutors, Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutors, WomenSafe Prosecutor), funded by federal and/or state dollars.

The services from SAS Executive Director and central office staff include submission of all State financial management reports; preparation of annual budgets and budget administration; timesheets and payroll; invoice payments; Vision and Vantage systems work/reports; procurement; training; litigation support; policy development; assistance with office management; IT and HR/LR structure and support.

The Executive Director shall prepare and submit all budgetary and financial materials and forms that are required of the head of a department of State government with respect to all State funds appropriated for all of the Vermont State's Attorneys and Sheriffs. At the beginning of each fiscal year, the Executive Director, with the approval of the Executive Committee, shall establish allocations for each of the State's Attorneys' offices from the State's Attorneys' appropriation. Thereafter, the Executive Director shall exercise budgetary control over these allocations and the general appropriation for State's Attorneys. The Executive Director shall monitor the Sheriff's transport budget and report to the Sheriffs on a monthly basis the status of the budget. He or she shall provide centralized support services for the State's Attorneys and Sheriffs with respect to budgetary planning, training, and office management, and perform such other duties as the Executive Committee directs. The Executive Director may employ clerical staff as needed to carry out the functions of the Department.

Department Central Office Staff Structure:

Central Office staff include the Executive Director, Fiscal Manager, IT Manager, Executive Assistant and Labor Relations Manager who assist all 14 SA and 14 Sheriffs offices. Connected to central office are the Appellate attorneys and Traffic Safety Prosecutors who assist with prosecutorial work for all 14 State's Attorneys Offices.

STATE'S ATTORNEYS

Vermont's State's Attorneys, as county-elected prosecutors, diligently work to ensure that the concerns and voices of their communities, constituents, local partners, advocacy and community organizations are addressed through fair and equitable administration of Vermont's criminal justice system. State's Attorneys are statutorily-charged with enforcing state and local laws through prosecution and administrative actions. The State's Attorneys offices deal with a myriad of criminal justice issues: homicides, sexual assaults, domestic violence, drug trafficking, robberies, kidnapping, DUI, violation of abuse prevention orders, crimes against children and other vulnerable populations, and many other issues. They provide critical assistance and services to victims of crime and their families through services of the Victim Advocate program. State prosecutors have significant responsibilities and work stress, as they deal with the tragedies, misfortunes and impacts of crime on the people in their counties. Vermont State's Attorneys and their staff are dedicated public employees, committed to protect their communities from those who violate the law and endanger their fellow citizens.

State's Attorneys Unit Structure:

The State's Attorneys Offices are comprised of the following staff:

- 14 State's Attorneys: 12 full-time State's Attorneys and 2 part-time State's Attorneys (Essex and Grand Isle counties);
- 58 Deputy State's Attorneys (DSA) in the 14 offices. Six (6) of these positions are grant-funded (CCVS/USDOJ STOP, Governor's Highway Safety, WomenSafe) with specialized focus area (domestic abuse, sexual assault and domestic violence, impaired driving);
- 26 Victim's Advocates funded by state and federal funds received by the Center for Crime Victim Services;
- 31 Administrative and Secretarial support positions;
- 2 Appellate Attorneys who work out of SAS HQ to assist all 14 offices;
- 5 Central Office staff (Executive Director, IT Manager, Fiscal Manager, Executive Assistant, Labor Relations Manager).

FY20 Budget and Programmatic Pressures:

1. Loss of funding for STOP Prosecutors and Investigators in Franklin, Windham and Bennington Counties:

The FY20 federal STOP grants awards from the Vermont Center for Crime Victim Services (CCVS, Waterbury) resulted in the loss of funding for the Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Prosecutors in Franklin and Windham Counties, and the loss of funding for the STOP Investigators in Windham and Bennington Counties. Chittenden and Rutland Counties will continue to receive funding under the FY20 CCVS awards. Caledonia County will receive new funding starting in July for a DV Prosecutor to be filled through a limited service (3-yr) position.

The loss of these positions will adversely impact the ability to protect victims and effectively investigate and prosecute sexual assault and domestic violence in those counties. According to a February 2019 report from the SIU Grants Manager, Franklin County has the 2nd highest incidence of sexual assault cases and Windham County has the 4th highest. Bennington County's investigator has supported the effective prosecution of sexual assault and DV in the county. Our STOP Prosecutor in Franklin County has 20 years of experience in DV/SA prosecution, and is a key mentor to DSA staff statewide. Windham County's DV Prosecutor currently has 92 cases, and has prior experience in working with high-risk youth. These DV/SA Prosecutors and Investigators are integral partners with other state agencies and community organizations that are working to combat domestic violence and sexual assault.

2. Anticipated Increased Costs in FY20:

\$\$: Unknown: SA Offices' Staff Unionization will require additional budgetary support for the costs related to staff unionization (approximately 105 staff) and contract negotiations and implementation. This is most likely going to result in unbudgeted costs, as discussed during the 2017 session when S.131 was passed by the Legislature. .

\$261,000 increase in Retirement costs

\$199,000 increase in Health Insurance costs

\$16,000 increase in Worker's Comp costs

\$60,000 increase in rent (Grand Isle, Caledonia and Windham Counties)

\$30,000 fit up costs for changes in office locations

3. Expert witness costs – the Department is faced with more demands for competency evaluations and for expert witness testimony in areas that are often specialized and/or in relatively-new fields of study – all of which has substantial cost impact. SAS has only \$135,000 for the 14 offices for expert testimony.

4. Case Issues:

Increase in Serious Felonies, Drug-Related, and CHINS cases, which are complex and resource-intensive cases involving serious crimes including murder, manslaughter, sexual assault, robbery, and aggravated domestic assault. These cases frequently require the use of medical and scientific experts, particularly in response to defense counsel's increased reliance on experts' testimony.

Post-Conviction Relief Petitions continue to increase each year, based upon a claim from an inmate that their attorney provided ineffective representation resulting in conviction. Some of these cases were originally tried decades ago. They are time consuming and often require an expert.

Cases involving individuals suffering from mental health issues – and how best to properly respond to their actions that brought them into the criminal justice system. In many situations, there is lack of statutory or procedural clarity and lack of agreement among the agencies relating to authority.

Opioid and other substance abuse often results in criminal activity, as our caseload increases in certain areas may demonstrate. The Department believes that increasing the availability and utilization of treatment programs can, very often, effectively serve the community and the individual.

Youthful Offender Case Expansion: Youthful Offender cases are resource intensive and require more oversight. A case that might be disposed of at arraignment in criminal court requires at a minimum several hearings in a YO proceeding.


6. Recruitment and Retention of Attorney Staff: With the average law school debt nationwide at \$112K, many law school graduates have to choose private sector employment over public sector work. The entry-level salary for the Deputy State's Attorney is \$25.49, (equivalent to a paygrade 24 in the State classified system). In almost all of our offices, we have significant challenges in recruiting attorneys, and often receive applications only from new graduates with no trial experience. When defense attorneys know that a prosecutor has little experience, they are more likely go to trial than enter into a plea agreement, which increases costs to the entire system.

- Training all State's Attorneys Offices' prosecutors in YASI
- Training and education for SAO prosecutors and Vermont law enforcement agencies in drug recognition (DRE) and other impaired driving issues
- Revision of SAS Department policies relating to administration, fiscal and personnel matters.
- Implementing more data-driven research, best practices and results-based evaluation.
- Training for all SAS prosecutors and Vermont law enforcement, "Understanding the New Marijuana Law" on 9/28/18 with nationally-recognized expert Christopher Halsor.
- Training for SAS prosecutors and victim advocates, SIU staff, state agencies (DCF, AG, DMH, VSP), law enforcement in June 2018.






**FY20 State's Attorneys Budget -

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



Special Investigation Units

SIU Program Description

Special Investigation Units are established in each region of the State pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 1940 to address the unique needs of victims and investigators in cases involving sexual offenses, domestic violence, and crimes against vulnerable persons. At the core of each SIU is a multi-disciplinary team of dedicated detectives, medical professionals, victim advocates, DCF workers, and DOC personnel – who collectively strive to provide a seamless support network for victims and a quality investigative result for criminal or family court action where appropriate. There are currently twelve SIUs around the State, serving areas roughly contiguous with county borders. Each SIU is an independent, non-profit entity. The SIUs are supported in substantial part by two types of grants funded by the State SIU budget: program support grants and law enforcement grants. The program support grants are intended to defray SIU operational costs. The law enforcement grants are intended to fund dedicated and specially-trained law enforcement officers who work out of the SIUs but are employees of a municipal or county police agency.

Key Budget Issues for FY20

SIU funding remains at FY18 levels. Since FY18, the loss of grant funds from the National Children's Alliance has created a shortfall of funds for seven of the twelve SIUs. This represents a \$49,000 gap among the seven accredited programs. The remaining five SIUs have continued to develop and are finding that the need for full-time or nearly full-time staff positions is the norm. The executive director and an administrative/case manager (2 FTE) are the positions supported by SIU funding. In some instances, this staffing expense is also supported through funds from the Center for Crime Victims' Services. Although the funding streams are combined, the development of the units has required more staff hours than what were required several years ago. The increased demand for funding the program support grants will likely impact the law enforcement grants by requiring a reduction in the funding level of those awards, or a reduction of the total number of awarded law enforcement grants, as determined by the SIU Grants Board.



MISSION: The Dept. of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs has the statutory responsibility to provide budgetary and administrative structure and oversight for the 14 State's Attorneys' offices and the 14 Sheriffs' offices in each Vermont county. Sheriffs are county-elected officials whose salaries and benefits are paid by the State GF under 32 VSA § 1182, providing law enforcement services for the State involving transporting prisoners, mentally-ill persons and juveniles who are in State custody. They are responsible for all criminal process deliveries, security services during high-risk hearings and trials, and law enforcement work including prevention, detection and investigation of crimes.

SHERIFFS FY 2020 SUMMARY & HIGHLIGHTS

- General Fund increase 3.4%
- 40 positions: 14 Sheriffs; 25 Transport Deputies; 1 Executive Staff Assistant. Sheriffs receive budgetary, fiscal reporting, timesheets, invoices and administrative support from SAS central office staff.
- Pressures: There are not enough State Transport Deputies to conduct the number of requested court transports without the use of per diem staff. To improve the system of scheduling and transports with the courts, the Inmate Transportation Study Work Group recommended a dedicated Transport Deputy position as a coordinator, and the use of Transport Manager tracking system.
- The Sheriffs are requesting an increase in the per diem rate established by 32 V.S.A. §1591 (2)(A), from \$22 to \$24 to offset costs they incur relating to transports.
- The Sheriffs need reauthorization for the Per Diem Pilot monies, which was originally authorized under 2017 Budget Bill, section E.207(a)(3), for FY18 and FY19, at \$441,688. These funds support the work of the per diem deputy sheriffs who are also engaged in inmate transportation and prisoner extraditions.

SHERIFFS

The Vermont Constitution established our Sheriffs' positions (see Elections; Officers; Terms of Office § 43), elected by the voters of "their respective district", for a four-year term of office commencing February next after their election (§50).

In addition, the Vermont Statutes also confirm the establishment of a sheriff's department in each county:

- § 290. County sheriff's department:

(a) A sheriff's department is established in each county. It shall consist of the elected sheriff in each county, and such deputy sheriffs and supporting staff as may be appointed by the sheriff. Full-time employees of the sheriff's department, paid by the county, shall be county employees for all purposes but shall be eligible to join the State Employees Retirement System, provided the county shall pay the employer's share. The sheriff's department shall be entitled to utilize all State services available to a town within the county.

In addition to law enforcement duties required of the Sheriffs, a statutory review of the assignments given to the Sheriffs include:

- 12 VSA 691: serving civil or criminal process
- 12 VSA 696: receive, execute and return writs or precept
- 13 VSA 4948: serving warrants
- 13 VSA 7554: electronic monitoring (Windham Co)
- 15 VSA 800: child support enforcement
- 16 VSA 1125: ex officio truant officers
- 18 VSA 617: assistance to local health officer
- 20 VSA 27: auxiliary state police in emergencies
- 20 VSA 1847: assistance in missing persons, search rescue missions
- 20 VSA 2053: assistance in supporting uniform criminal recordkeeping and checks
- 20 VSA 2221: governor-called assistance for preservation of public peace
- 21 VSA 225: serve VOSHA citations or WC misclassification citations
- 24 VSA 299: general reference to peace officer
- 24 VSA 296: transportation of prisoners
- 24 VSA 307: employment of deputy sheriffs

24 VSA 290 outlines the Sheriffs' work in the transportation of prisoners:

"Full-time deputy sheriffs whose primary responsibility is transportation of prisoners and persons with a mental condition or psychiatric disability shall be paid by the State of Vermont. The appointment of such deputies and their salary shall be approved by the Governor or his or her designee. The Executive Committee of the Vermont Sheriffs Association and the Executive Director of the Department of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs shall jointly have authority for the assignment of position locations in the counties of State-paid deputy sheriffs and shall review the county location assignments periodically for efficient use of resources"; and,

24 VSA 296: "All commitments to a State correctional facility or to any other place named by the Commissioner of Corrections or committing court shall be made by any sheriff, deputy sheriff, State Police officer, police officer, or constable in the State, or the Commissioner of Corrections or his or her authorized agent."

Sheriffs employ both State-paid Deputy Sheriffs ("State Transport Deputies", or "State-paid Deputies"), and non-State employees Deputy Sheriffs that work directly for the Sheriff's local department as either permanent or per diem deputies. These non-State employees assist the Sheriff with the many and wide-ranging work tasks, (see above), and in fulfilling the Sheriff's private contracts for services.

A sheriff may appoint persons as deputy sheriffs to serve civil process, including child support enforcement as provided in 15 V.S.A. § 800, whom the sheriff shall train and supervise. Such deputies need not be qualified law enforcement officers, but if not so qualified shall not have arrest powers, and shall not carry firearms in performance of their duties in serving civil process.

In addition, the statute provides that "The powers of deputy sheriffs with respect to criminal matters and the enforcement of the law may be exercised statewide."

Prisoner Transport Process

As 24 VSA 290 outlines the Sheriffs' work in the transportation of prisoners:

“Full-time deputy sheriffs whose primary responsibility is transportation of prisoners and persons with a mental condition or psychiatric disability shall be paid by the State of Vermont.” The Sheriffs and the Court staff manage and coordinate the movement of prisoners to and from the courts from the correctional centers; and with DMH for the movement of persons with mental or psychiatric disability to and from various facilities.”

²Note: The Sheriffs have been disparaged for their contract-services work, despite the fact that this “public-private” enterprise for the Sheriff departments was specifically conceived and authorized by the Vermont Legislature under 24 VSA 291, 32 VSA 1591 and 32 VSA 3109. The contracts include services “with the State of Vermont, an agency of the United States, one or more towns within or without the county, or any nongovernmental entity, to provide law enforcement or other related services including security services, central dispatching for police, fire, or ambulance services, and centralized support services”. Specific salary and reimbursement rates are established for this work, including 24 VSA 291a allowing the sheriff to charge contracts up to 5% “for administration of the contract and related services”, which is similar to the Indirect Cost Rates (often above 20%) charged by State departments to federal grants for the oversight, administration, review and compliance with the grant terms. This money helps support the operations and staffing for the Sheriff’s operations.

Note: The work that the Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriffs perform for the Courts in transport work is not similar to the work that the DOC Transport Team is performing for the movement of prisoners to other facilities or medical appointments.

System Pressures and Other Concerns:

- We have a 14 County Court System, (some with additional courts), and 25 Transport Deputies to service all the Transport Orders. The Sheriffs are ‘supplementing the labor supply’ with their Per Diem Deputies and own Deputies.
- Vermont, like most labor markets, is having a difficult time filling vacant positions. Law enforcement agencies, in particular, are struggling to recruit and retain certified law enforcement staff. According to Police Chief magazine, “a recruitment crisis is at hand for law enforcement, especially since millennials are far less likely to stay in a job until retirement. As veteran officers retire, and younger officers move between agencies or careers, a critical employee gap seems likely.” Research in 2009 showed that only 50% of adult workers surveyed at the time had been at their job for more than five years; and it is estimated that many workers will now have 10-14 jobs before they are 40 years old.

Budget Requests for FY20


The Sheriffs are not asking for any additional funding from the Administration's proposed budget. However, the Sheriffs are requesting the per diem rate established by 32 V.S.A. §1591 (2)(A), increase the rate, from \$22 to \$24, to offset costs they incur relating to transports. The Department believes that we can accommodate this increase within the proposed FY20 budget.

Budget Note: The per diem pilot language that was originally authorized under 2017 Budget Bill, section E.207(a)(3), for FY18 and FY19, at \$441,688 has expired. The Department is scheduled to receive \$356,326 in our FY20 budget. These funds support the work of the per diem deputy sheriffs who are also engaged in inmate transportation and prisoner extraditions. This is reduction in per diem money of \$85,362. We anticipate being manage the per diem budget within these reduced monies.

Proposed Efficiencies


- The Department of SAS and the Sheriffs have agreed that each Sheriff's Department needs to use the automated program Transport Manager. This will help with data collection and analysis, as well as budgeting, invoicing and projecting expenditures.
- The Sheriffs and the Courts should each identify and assign a Scheduling Liaison (and backup personnel) in order to avoid scrambling to find available staffing for transports.
- The Courts should examine their system to determine if certain counties are more organized and successful in their transport requests and scheduling, and if so, what makes their system work more efficiently.
- It would be very helpful if the judges would take into account the significant costs to Vermont taxpayers when the private defense counselors' clients are moved to the head of the schedule, while staff from the Sheriff's Department (on the taxpayers' expense) are waiting with prisoners.

\$4,631,695



- (a)(1) Notwithstanding any provision of 32 V.S.A. § 1591(2)(A) to the contrary, during fiscal years 2018 and 2019 the Executive Director of the Dept. of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs shall set rates not to exceed \$22 per hour for deputy sheriffs that provide necessary assistance in arresting or transporting prisoners, juveniles, or persons with mental illness. In addition to the rate established in this subdivision, a sheriff's Dept. shall be reimbursed for the actual costs for Social Security and Medicare taxes, workers' compensation premiums, unemployment contributions, and other reasonable expenses, provided the costs are attributable to the services provided, documented in a manner required by the Executive Director, and approved by the Executive Director.
- (2) A law enforcement officer shall not receive compensation pursuant to this subsection if otherwise compensated for the hours during which transportation services are performed.
- (3) The amounts paid pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed \$441,688 in fiscal year 2018 or 2019.

(b) On or before January 15, 2019, the Executive Director of the Department of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs shall submit a written report to the House and Senate Committees on Judiciary and on Appropriations as to the actual monies spent pursuant to this section, the impact on prison transport and the Departmental budget, and any specific recommendations for statutory changes and budget expenditures for the following fiscal years.

This report provides information on the following: (I) Overview of the statutory language relating to sheriffs and transportation work; (II) Actual monies spent and Impact to Department budget pursuant to this section; (III) Impact on Prison Transport; (IV) Specific recommendations for statutory change and budget expenditures for the following FYs.

I: Overview:

The Sheriffs' positions, created by the Vermont Constitution, are elected by the county voters to a 4-year term. The statute also sanctions the establishment of sheriff departments, 24 VSA § 290: "A sheriff's Dept. is established in each county consist(ing) of the elected sheriff in each county, and such deputy sheriffs and supporting staff as may be appointed by the sheriff"; 24 VSA §290: "Full-time deputy sheriffs whose primary responsibility is transportation of prisoners and persons with a mental condition or psychiatric disability shall be paid by the State of Vermont. The appointment of such deputies and their salary shall be approved by the Governor or his or her designee. The Executive Committee of the Vermont Sheriffs Association and the Executive Director of the Dept. of State's Attorneys and Sheriffs shall jointly have authority for the assignment of position locations in the counties of State-paid deputy sheriffs and shall review the county location assignments periodically for efficient use of resources"; and 24 VSA 296: "All commitments to a State correctional facility or to any other place named by the Commissioner of Corrections or committing court shall be made by any sheriff, deputy sheriff, State Police officer, police officer, or constable in the State, or the Commissioner of Corrections or his or her authorized agent."

The statute also establishes a ‘not to exceed’ rate of \$22/hr. for per diem billing, but allows for the sheriff to be reimbursed for “Social Security and Medicare taxes, workers’ comp, unemployment contributions, and other reasonable expenses, provided the costs are attributable to the services provided, documented in a manner required by the Executive Director and approved by the Executive Director”. The Sheriffs are annually required to submit their worksheet with costs for review and approval. Their rates, as approved by the SAS Executive Director for FY18 and FY19 are as follows (FY17 included for historical reference):

24 VSA §367 (c)(1) allows the Department to monitor the sheriff’s transport budget: “The Executive Director shall monitor the sheriff’s transport budget and report to the sheriffs on a monthly basis the status of the budget. He or she shall provide centralized support services for the State’s Attorneys and sheriffs with respect to budgetary planning, training, and office management, and perform such other duties as the Executive Committee directs. The Executive Director may employ clerical staff as needed to carry out the functions of the Department”.

III. Impact on Prisoner Transport:

This November 2018, the Inmate Transportation Study Report was submitted to the House and Senate from Matt D’Agostino of the Vermont Dept. of Corrections. The study committee consisted of representatives from the key stakeholder groups: Matt D’Agostino, Financial Director, Dept. of Corrections; Karen Godnick Barber, General Counsel, Dept. of Mental Health; Cullen Bullard, Director of Classification, Dept. of Corrections; John Campbell, Executive Director, Dept. of State’s Attorneys and Sheriffs; Candace Elmquist, Budget Analyst, Dept. of Finance and Management; Lora Evans, Administrative Services Manager, Office of the Defender General; Judge Brian Grearson, Chief Superior Judge; Adam Greshin, Commissioner, Dept. of Finance and Management; Kirk Martin, Orleans County Sheriff; Kevin McLaughlin, Chittenden County Sheriff; Lisa Menard, Commissioner, Dept. of Corrections; Matt Nault, Director of Facility Operations, Dept. of Corrections; Annie Noonan, Labor Relations Manager, Dept. of State’s Attorneys and Sheriffs; Judith Rex, Director of Policy and Planning, Dept. for Children and Families; Tari Scott, Chief of Trial Court Operations; Dean Shatney, Caledonia County Sheriff; Mike Touchette, Deputy Commissioner, Dept. of Corrections; Susan Zeller, State’s Chief Performance Officer, who assisted with process improvement strategies.

Notes: The data, below, outlines the FY18 full year, and the FY19 Year-to-Date for Transports. Note that Essex and Grand Isle Counties have no State Deputies, so they are fully reliant on Per Diems. Lamolle has experienced significant turnover in the State Deputy position with attrition to other departments that offer better retirement systems, and in FY19, (currently), the State Deputy is at the Training Academy for law enforcement certification.
