A Proclamation

WHEREAS, Jack Glazebrook began his career with the Woburn, Massachusetts Boys' Club in 1966. During this five year period he gained experience and confidence to help even more youth; and

WHEREAS, in 1971, he became Executive Director of the Taunton Boys' Club, the first ever Executive Director of that Club, and during his eight years there grew the membership from 238 to over 1,200; and

WHEREAS, in 1979, he began 18 years of service to the Lowell Boys Club in Lowell, Massachusetts as Executive Director. During his tenure, Jack grew the budget from \$200,000 to near \$700,000 annually and expanded partnerships with individuals, corporations, foundations and government; and

WHEREAS, recognized for his organizational and development skills and his never-ending drive to help young people, Jack was named a Regional Service Director with Boys and Girls Clubs of America in 1997. His leadership had an impact throughout the Northeast. New clubs opened, and additional resources and a strong board volunteer base were established; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Government Relations of the Boys and Girls Clubs of America reached out to Jack in 2004. As a Government Relations Director for the past eleven years he has helped grow pass-through financing to local clubs from \$30 million to more than \$100 million, ensuring success for clubs throughout the Northeast and Midwest for years to come; and

WHEREAS, for the past 49 years, Jack has inspired Clubs, Alliances, fellow professionals and volunteers to do their very best to help our youth; and

WHEREAS, he has clearly lived his life to work toward the mission of the Boys and Girls Clubs of America: "To enable all young people especially those who need us most to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens."
