An additional point that I want to raise is concerning the evolving needs for broadband around religious gathering. I am a District Lay Leader for the Green Mountain District of the United Methodist Church and have heard many small rural churches who have struggled to connect (online worship services, etc.) during this time of pandemic due to lack of broadband and/or cell service in some areas. As the demographics reflect, many of these folks are elderly and miss the connections of their spiritual home and are at high-risk of this disease. Making inability to connect via technology an additional challenge for maintaining connections.

As a teacher's wife, I am aware of the challenges of disparate broadband access for our younger population. I wanted to raise the issue of our older population as well.
