

Criteria for Vermont State Grant Programs

All state grant programs are based on financial need. For degree programs applicants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the Vermont Grant application. For the nondegree program, applicants must complete the nondegree grant application and attach a copy of their Federal tax return if they file one.

Who is eligible:

Vermont Full-time Grant

Vermont residents who:

- Are accepted or enrolled full-time (> 12 credits per term) in an undergraduate degree or certificate program that is approved by the U.S. Department of Education to participate in the Federal Title IV aid programs
- Do not already have a bachelor's degree, unless you're:
 - Enrolled as a medical student in the M.D. program at the Larner College of Medicine at the University of Vermont, **or**
 - Enrolled in an accredited Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program
- You can receive the equivalent of 10 semesters of full-time grants until you receive your first bachelor's degree—unless you're enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program at the University of Vermont Larner College of Medicine or enroll in an accredited Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program.

Vermont Part-time Grant

Vermont residents who:

- Are accepted or enrolled part-time (< 12 credits per term) in an undergraduate degree or certificate program that's approved by the U.S. Department of Education to participate in the Federal Title IV aid programs
- Do not already have a bachelor's degree, unless you're:
 - Enrolled as a medical student in the M.D. program at the University of Vermont Larner College of Medicine **or**
 - Enrolled in an accredited Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program
- You can receive the equivalent of 10 semesters of full-time grants until you receive your first bachelor's degree—unless you're enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program at the University of Vermont Larner College of Medicine or enroll in an accredited Doctor of Veterinary Medicine program.

Vermont Non-degree Grant

Vermont residents who:

- Are not enrolled in high school
- Are enrolled in a non-degree (non-matriculated) course or program that will improve your ability to get a job or that encourages further study
- You can receive a Vermont Non-Degree Grant for up to 2 courses per enrollment term—up to 2 enrollment terms per financial year (July 1–June 30) and 6 enrollment terms total.
