National Vote At Home Institute to Host Press Call Highlighting Pro-Voter Policies to Increase Accessibility & Security

WASHINGTON — Wednesday, the [National Vote At Home Institute](#) (NVAHI) will host a press call to detail the pro-voter policies and processes they will be advocating for in state legislatures across the country as states work to fine tune their voting laws after the 2020 election. These tools and policies include risk-limiting audits (RLAs), ballot tracking systems, same day voter registration laws paired with vote centers and more. The call will feature NVAHI CEO Amber McReynolds and election officials from Florida, New Jersey, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Vermont and Maryland as they do a deep dive on the ways that election administration can be enhanced to make more efficient, more accessible elections.

In 2020, many states expanded systems and increased access to vote-at-home options that led to a record number of Americans casting their ballot by mail. ***This year, the focus is two-fold: securing pro-voter policies that continue to offer accessibility and security for voters, as well as supporting election officials in their operations at every level of mail ballot administration.*** These policies must provide voters with multiple, convenient methods of participation and allow election workers to continue administering smooth, secure and efficiently-run elections.
