**Note:** Act 26/H.492 Capital Bill (2015) states that on or before January 15, 2016, the Secretary of Administration and the Executive Director of VIT, or its successor entity, shall examine and submit a report to the Institutions Committees on property funded in whole or in part by a capital construction act, and states that the General Assembly during the 2016 legislative session will determine ownership of VIT property based on the report.
