6. Executive Director's Report:

Phyllis Mitchell reviewed the February 2020 Executive Director Report with Board members present.

7. Education:

Nursing Education Committee:

- Deborah Swartz shared an update from the Education Committee's February meeting with Board members present.

8. Practice:

APRN Sub-Committee:

Jennifer Laurent shared an update from the APRN Sub-Committee's February meeting with Board members present. The Sub-Committee heard a question from Jeff Lourie, FNP regarding ketamine and transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS) treatment for refractory depression and considered whether this was within the FNP scope of practice and if so, under what circumstances should it be administered. The Sub-Committee agreed to bring this issue before the Board for further discussion. OPR General Counsel suggested clearer guidelines for the 4 APRN specialties licensed in Vermont.

Mr. Lourie was present and answered questions from Board members about his current practice. He estimated treating 45 patients with ketamine through nasal spray or subcutaneous administration. Several of Mr. Lourie's patients were also present and shared their personal experiences with the Board.

The Board agreed to take this matter under advisement for further discussion.

Practice Committee:

The Committee has not met since the last Board meeting.

Alternative Program Committee:

The Committee has not met since the last Board meeting.

9. Other Business:

- Obstacles to Recruitment and Retention of Qualified Nurse Educators

The Board heard from stakeholders including representatives of VT nursing education programs (Norwich University, Vermont Technical College, University of Vermont, and Castleton University) regarding OPR's legislative report and creating a waiver process for Administrative Rule 4.23(b). Those present voiced support for eliminating the provision in Rule 4.23(b) that requires BSN-prepared clinical educators to be enrolled in and complete a MSN program within 3 years. Kevin Scott of Norwich University shared his experience and research. He has found no significant difference in student outcomes with MSN-prepared clinical instructors vs. BSN-prepared clinical instructors. Representatives from all programs acknowledged that recruiting/retaining nurse educators is a multi-faceted issue however all felt that Rule 4.23(b) further limits their pool of potential clinical educators to draw from.

Douglas Sutton moved to **retain the current Administrative Rules and make a recommendation to the academic community that it convene a group to collaborate on issues regarding optimal use of clinical sites and educators.** Virginia Hudson seconded. Motion passed.

- Phyllis Mitchell shared an email notification from Sarah Billings-Berg of VTC advising that their clinical partner, Southern VT Medical Center, dismissed all student experiences for the week of 3/10 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Should this become indefinite, the school is concerned about their ability to meet Administrative Rule requirements for clinical and simulation lab education. Gabriel Gilman, OPR General Counsel, reminded Board members of provisions in Open Meeting law that allow for Special and Emergency meetings to address emergent issues if necessary.
