S. Ed was a little rough. The general sentiment was no new programs (CSAs, Step Up) when we haven't adequately funded existing programs (dual enrollment, Early College, Vt Strong Scholars). I mentioned that CSAs and Step Up encourage kids to continue on to college, while Vt Strong Scholars is about completion i.e., two different problems. I didn't
