Jennifer, attached please find records in response to your request for records reflecting state business conducted through Alex MacLean's Gmail account.

Most of these records are from current or former Governor staff who left the office less than three years ago, and therefore were not slated for deletion. We have also pulled records from accounts slated for deletion.

The Governor's Office disclosed records "produced or acquired in the course of agency business" from Alex's Gmail account while she was employed by the Governor's Office in response to public record act requests, and additional records reflecting use of Alex's Gmail account to conduct state business are reflected in the approximately 5500 pages produced by this office on Friday, April 29.

Although we are not the custodian of Alex's Gmail account, we have searched the accounts of the Governor's Senior Staff and sought to produce records not already produced. If you seek records from other agencies and departments, we recommend you follow up with them directly. Alex's Gmail address is currently on a distribution list for the Governor's public appearance calendar and press releases; we have not included those widely available records in this production.

In the interest of efficiency in responding to this request, we have not produced records from the transition, before Alex had access to a state email account. Many of the transition records are personnel communications about hiring, and would be exempt or would need to be redacted under (317(c)(7)). (Examples of transition communications were produced on Friday, April 29.)

We have withheld the following records: executive privileged emails involving the Governor from 2010 to January 2013 (317(c)(1) and (4) – the Governor does not have email communications with Alex following that time); executive privileged speech drafting that Bill Lofy shared with Alex via her Gmail account in 2011 ((c)(1) and (4)); and personal contact information (317(c)(7)). In one instance, we redacted non-agency business (a communication about a family member) contained in a record otherwise about agency business. We have withheld five emails from after the transition in which Alex

forwards a resume of a candidate received in her Gmail account to state addresses for consideration for employment (317(c)(7)). Emails involving Alex's Gmail account that relate to the scheduling of the Governor's 2013 trip to China with Bill Stenger, logistics of other EB-5 matters (created after her departure from state government), and records containing litigation hold search terms are under review by the Attorney General's Office for a determination as to whether they are relevant to litigation and therefore exempt under 317(c)(14). In addition, we have withheld as attorney client, attorney work product and personnel information one email involving Alex's Gmail account (Alex was cc'd with others while she was a state employee) that was sent to Sarah London as part of a VSEA-related litigation hold related to a now-former state employee from another agency (317(c)(3) and (c)(7)). We have also withheld portions of one email conversation from May 2012 involving Alex, Liz Miller, Bill Lofy, Sarah London, and Lisa Kunin regarding a request for a Governor's letter related to Entergy, towns, and the NRC as it contains legal advice, (c)(3), and one conversation from April 30, 2012, involving Commissioner Annie Noonan, Deputy Commissioner Erika Wolffing, agency counsel, Tim Noonan, Lawrence Miller, and both Alex's Gmail and state accounts as it contains legal advice of agency counsel and Tim Noonan, ((c)(3)).

If you feel records have been withheld in error, you may appeal to the Governor's Chief of Staff, Darren Springer.

Dear Robyn,

I feel that I need to express my frustration with the response that the Alliance has made to the Governor's proposal. The governor proposed investing \$17 million in child care! Those of us who have been advocating for child care for many years have waited a long time to see this! I feel that there should have been a public appreciation expressed over just that fact. Instead, and again, the legislators have heard conflicting and various voices, or an empty silence.

As you know, I was a provider who employed 10-12 teachers and caregivers for many years. That program, Robin's Nest Children's Center always has, and continues to provide care to families of all means. As a parent at RNCC you know that the program made a commitment early on to accept subsidy families without charging a co-pay. To do this tuition paying parents pay higher fees and the staff accept lower salaries. This was an continues to be a valuable commitment to serving all. Many of those families and staff, though are the folks who barely miss the cut off for programs such as Child Care Financial Assistance and the Earned Income Tax Credit.



The governor's proposal leaves the federal portion of the Earned Income Tax Credit intact, as well as a percentage of the state's portion.

Remember that the state's portion of the EITC has been increased a number of times over the years even as the child care subsidy rates lag far, far behind. A family who qualifies for the EITC and has children in child care would actually receive a greater benefit over time with this proposal. In addition, more families would qualify for child care subsidy. I am aware that families who receive the EITC and do not have children in care would lose a small portion of their tax credit. But, working families who have young children have greater costs than those who do not. Quality programs that serve families with young children are struggling. As the state continues to provide short sighted, band aid approaches to supporting family services such as a couple hundred dollars in a EITC instead of a broader investment in child care services, we continue to support low quality, warehouse programs. These programs accept high numbers of subsidy families, employ poorly trained young girls willing to work for low wages, and have high turnover of staff. This is a disservice to the children, families, those who work in the programs and those who live in the communities these programs serve.

We are missing an important opportunity and I am disappointed that there has not been leadership on the part of child care advocates in our state recognizing this publicly. I understand that Voices, a program that advocates for all family services felt the need to air concerns about this issue. But, instead of an immediate, negative response to an idea that has merit, I wish that there had been a positive response on the part of advocates for quality child care, the families who use it and pay for it, the children who are served by it, and the folks who provide it.

I appreciate the work that you all continue to do to support family services. And, thank you for letting me voice my concerns about the issue.

I bring this to your attention as we understand we are the largest commercial project in southern vt, however we are nearly completely stalled with permit review requests.

Permit applications sit in inboxes for sometimes 3-6 weeks before they get reviewed. If I could draw an analogy, think about the airlines pushing away from the gate, then sitting on the tarmac for 45 minutes before takeoff but somehow this maintains their on time gate departure? Well, the mail does get opened and stamped received, but it sits and this starts a snowball effect in further delays in hurdles. What our team hears often is that the State employees are swamped and...are working on projects that are a priority for the Governor.

Now, I know that probably won't sit well however that's what we get. That was the same

response we got in the issue we had with the delayed erosion control permit.

Peter, I know a priority of yours is job creation and we are doing the best we can, but we could be doing a whole lot more. Like you, when I hear from customers that service isn't right, whatever the root cause is, I want to know so I can fix it.

California Nuclear Backlash Hits Relicensing After Japan Meltdown: Energy

Two nuclear power plants perched near earthquake faults in California could struggle to get relicensed after a cascade of natural and nuclear disasters across the Pacific Ocean in Japan galvanized opposition groups.

Fukushima-inspired concerns have rippled through Orange County, where the cities of Laguna Beach and San Clemente asked regulators to decide whether Edison International (EIX)'s San Onofre atomic plant 60 miles (97 kilometers) southeast of Los Angeles could withstand an earthquake and tsunami before extending its permit to 2042 from 2022. Further north, PG&E Corp. (PCG) asked for a delay in relicensing Diablo Canyon pending seismic studies.

"An accident would be devastating" at San Onofre, Laguna Beach Mayor Jane Egly said in an interview in her home overlooking the seaside enclave. "If they don't do anything to address our safety concerns, I would support shutting it down."

Nuclear anxiety in the most populous state, a bellwether for political and environmental issues nationwide, is echoing in New York, Ohio, Virginia and Vermont, where local groups oppose operators' efforts to extend the lives of their plants.

Eleven U.S. power companies including Edison, PG&E, Entergy Corp. (ETR) and Progress Energy Inc. (PGN) seek 20-year license extensions to keep 15 atomic generators running through age 60.

At stake is whether reactors designed in the 1960s and 1970s, the same vintage as those overwhelmed by a 9.0-magnitude quake and 46-foot (14-meter) tsunami in Fukushima, Japan, should remain the foundation of a 104-reactor U.S. fleet through mid-century. The debate over atomic energy, which provides about 20 percent of the nation's power, extends even into new projects.

### **'Fukushima Never Happened'**

Gregory Jaczko, chairman of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, stoked concerns over costs and safety of new reactors Feb. 9 when he cast the lone vote of the five commissioners against granting Southern Co. (SO) the first reactor licenses in 30 years.

Jaczko warned the U.S. atomic regulator had proceeded "as if Fukushima never happened."

Failure to extend licenses would hurt PG&E and Southern California Edison, the utility owned by Rosemead, California-based Edison. San Onofre is among its largest and most valuable assets, and the 78 percent stake owned is valued at \$5.2 billion, according to a regulatory filing.

Shares in Edison have gained about 13 percent since the March 11, 2011, atomic disaster in Japan. PG&E has lost 9 percent in the period, while the Dow Jones Utilities Average index (UTIL) has gained 8 percent.

### **No Nuclear Revival**

Since a nuclear revival in the U.S. is at least a decade away, "one of the biggest concerns for industry and regulators will be to ensure that important systems, structures and components" at existing plants function safely for another 20 years, said Chris Gadomski, lead nuclear energy analyst for Bloomberg New Energy Finance in San Francisco. (FRC)

The NRC has extended licenses for 71 reactors since 2000 and has never shut down a plant that sought relicensing, although it has withheld permits until safety concerns were satisfied, NRC spokesman David McIntyre, said in an e-mail.

Plant operators don't think new safety concerns should have any bearing on relicensing because regulators and the industry are addressing them separately and continuously, Steve Kerekes, spokesman for the Nuclear Energy Institute, a Washington-based industry lobbying group, said in a phone interview. "It's a rigorous process," he said.

### **Older Plant Limitations**

Fukushima highlighted the limitations older reactors face in withstanding unusual events, such as prolonged blackouts or freak tidal waves, not anticipated by the original designers, said California seismologist Bruce Gibson. He serves on a state-appointed panel monitoring a seismic review of the Diablo Canyon plant on the central California coast.

New reactors, such as the AP1000 from Toshiba Corp. (6502)'s Westinghouse Electric unit that Atlanta-based Southern is erecting in Georgia, are designed to safely shut down 72 hours after a station blackout without any human intervention, Scott Shaw, a Westinghouse spokesman, said in an e-mailed statement.

"I felt like this was the moment to get something done," said Ben Davis, Jr., 58, a semi-retired home health care worker who leads a state ballot initiative to close the plants. Davis was emboldened by his previous success in a 1989 drive that led to shutting down the Rancho Seco nuclear plant near Sacramento.

If Davis gathers 504,760 signatures on his petition by next month, California voters will be able to vote to close the plants in November. He wouldn't say how many he has collected.

### **More Relicenses Coming**

Relicensing is under way for some of the nation's most contested plants. In New York, Democratic Governor Andrew Cuomo has vowed to shut down Entergy's Indian Point reactors, 24 miles north of New York City.

Also seeking a 20-year extension is FirstEnergy Corp. (FE)'s Davis-Besse plant, 21 miles southeast of Toledo, Ohio, which was shut from 2002 through 2004 because of leaks and reactor corrosion. Progress Energy is seeking to relicense a unit of its Crystal River plant, 80 miles north of Tampa, Florida, even though the reactor has been closed since 2009 for repairs.

License renewals look at potential environmental impacts and a plant's ability to keep decades-old components in good operating condition, Scott Burnell, an NRC spokesman, said in an e-mail. Issues such as seismic risks and blackout precautions are considered normal operating matters covered by the regulator's continuing oversight process.

New Fukushima-related rules, expected to be released by March 9, likewise "will apply to every operating reactor, regardless of whether a reactor's license has been renewed," Burnell said. Plant operators will have until 2016 to comply with the orders, which will cost U.S. utilities about \$100 million, according to the Nuclear Energy Institute.

### **Diablo Delay**

Following the Fukushima catastrophe, San Francisco (FRC)-based PG&E asked the atomic regulator to hold off relicensing Diablo Canyon, 190 miles north of Los Angeles, until the company finishes a new study of the earthquake risks, including a fault discovered in 2008 that runs 600 meters offshore from Diablo Canyon's reactors.

San Onofre and Diablo Canyon are on the ocean in areas prone to earthquakes. They are the only plants in the U.S. with geography similar to Fukushima, where three reactors melted down when the station lost power after unprotected diesel generators were swamped by the tsunami.

"This plant has been and will be run safely in the future," Anthony Earley, Chief Executive Officer of PG&E, said of Diablo Canyon in a Feb. 23 interview. Edison has told state regulators its plant could withstand an earthquake and tsunami, based on updated data, and plans a further study of its seismic risks.

### **Equipped For Disaster**

Utility officials say California's reactors are better equipped for disaster. San Onofre, which rises from a strip of land between a beach and a freeway, has four back-up generators stored 30 feet above sea level and a seven-day supply of diesel fuel in earthquake-fortified underground vaults. Batteries with eight hours of back-up power are kept 50 feet above sea level, while the utility has

4.5 million gallons of water on site that can be used to cool the reactors, according to Southern California Edison (SCE)'s website.

Diablo Canyon is similarly fortified and built atop an 85-foot cliff, almost three times higher than the greatest anticipated wave in the area, said James Becker, site vice-president, in a phone interview.

Southern California Edison will decide this year whether to ask state regulators to fund renewing San Onofre's operating licenses, which expire in 2022, said Stephen Pickett, a spokesman for the utility. Repairing steam generators after a small radiation leak shut the plant in January will not affect the timing of relicensing, Pickett said by telephone.

### **'Open Safety Issues'**

"It will be difficult to go before the commission to ask them to make a decision to pursue relicensing and at the same time have open safety issues at the plant that have heightened community concern and introduced the potential for additional costs," said Anne Selting, a San Francisco-based credit analyst for Standard & Poor's (SPY), in a telephone interview.

PG&E's Earley described Diablo Canyon as a crucial asset to his company and the state of California, and said he is prepared to spend hundreds of millions of dollars on safety upgrades, if needed to keep it running.

Closing the plants abruptly would also have environmental and consumer consequences: greater smog, rolling blackouts and higher electricity bills reminiscent of the energy crisis in 2001, according to a November 3, 2011 legislative analyst report on the nuclear ballot initiative.

Losses to the two utilities could total more than \$4 billion, which they would attempt to recoup from customers through higher rates and from state taxpayers by suing, the report said.

The San Luis Obispo Mothers For Peace, an anti-nuclear group, says residents of their community are more concerned by the economic toll from an accident at Diablo Canyon, 12 miles to the west.

"No utility or regulator can claim they know the worst-case scenario," said Jane Swanson, a board member of the group, which has opposed the plant since the early 1970s.

This appears to be another personnel "mistake" at VY. Yesterday we had someone who mistook the Alpha train for the Bravo train on the diesels. Today, we learn that breakers were manually opened when they should not have been, causing loss of cooling of nuclear fuel. The Oversight Panel felt pretty strongly about the need to improve VY's procedures to include human factors issues as the plant staff ages and retires. Taken together, these latest problems at VY cause me to remain concerned about issues that were identified by the Oversight Panel three years ago. What is going on at VY on procedural compliance issues? Is the NRC looking at both of these problems as evidence of a common root cause?

## Event Text

### LOSS OF VITAL AC POWER WHILE SHUTDOWN

"This 60-day telephone notification is being made pursuant to 10CFR50.73(a)(2)(iv)(A) and 10CFR50.73(a)(1) to describe an invalid actuation of a containment heat removal system.

"On October 11, 2011, with the reactor shutdown for refueling, a partial loss of vital AC power was experienced which resulted in a loss of shutdown cooling as well as PCIS group 2, 3, 4, and 5 half isolations. The actuation was determined to be invalid as *it occurred because a breaker supplying power to the 'A' vital AC was manually opened*, resulting in actuation of the associated PCIS logic circuitry. The Group 4 actuation resulted in a complete isolation of the single train Residual Heat Removal shutdown cooling suction path. The shutdown cooling path was isolated for approximately 12 minutes resulting in a coolant temperature increase of approximately 2 degrees F. At the time of the event, the reactor cavity was flooded with the spent fuel pool gates removed and the normal fuel pool cooling system in operation to provide reactor cavity cooling. Based on this, there was no impact on public health and safety."

The licensee notified the NRC Resident Inspector.

On your behalf, I explored the Green Ribbon Schools program as suggested by Alex MacLean of Governor Shumlin's office (see first email in string). My recommendation is that Vermont not participate during this first pilot year, for several reasons, including timing, resource allocation, and alignment with other related efforts within the state.

I approached Efficiency Vermont (EVT) as a potential partner in the work involved to nominate schools for the Green Ribbon School (GRS) recognition. My EVT colleague, Richard Donnelly, met with me Friday afternoon to discuss the best ways to channel limited resources into the promotion of good environmental stewardship in public schools. Richard summarized our discussion in an email (below).

Three EVT programs:

- Whole School Energy Challenge – Teams within the schools study current energy usage, identify reduction goals, and learn/implement savings measures. The five schools currently piloting the Challenge are Twinfield, Waits River Valley School, Lake Region UHS, Champlain Valley UHS, and Spaulding HS.

- Energy Literacy Project – EVT is working with Vermont Energy Education Program (VEEP) to increase energy literacy in schools. This has been ongoing but is being significantly ramped up.
- K-12 Energy League – Hoping to kick-off next year with the five current Challenge schools and with VPA support, the Energy League will be a sports-parallel competition among schools to reduce carbon footprint.

My brief summaries don't do justice to the thoughtful, detailed work being put into these programs by Richard D. and his staff at EVT. Since the Governor's staff approached us about the Green Ribbon Schools program, would you mind if I share my enthusiasm and support for EVT's public school initiatives with Ms. MacLean?

Good Day Cathy,

Thanks for coming to Burlington Friday and meeting to discuss the new federal Green Ribbon School (GRS) program recommended by the Governor's office.

Here are my thoughts and suggestions.

- As a stand-alone program, the GRS is in some aspects outside our organizational focus. However, as a part of three major K-12 initiatives we will launch in 2012 (namely the K-12 Energy League, the Whole School Energy Program, and the Energy Literacy Project), the GRS could add significant value for the participating schools. As such, all Vermont Schools could be introduced to GRS and enjoy support for achieving GRS designation as we engage the market with our three programs. There is value in co-branding and coordinating with the GRS program (and Energy Star) and it could shed some very favorable light on all of us working hard to help the schools in the realm of sustainability.
- I realize that the GRS pilot is being trotted out now to launch in Spring 2012. Perhaps we could pass on the initial pilot round and incorporate GRS into our League idea (possible launch in fall 2012). This slight delay is appealing from a planning perspective. Obviously we are open to supporting this program in a way that works for both our market planning perspective and from the perspective of the Vermont Department of Education.
- I suggest that we jointly meet with the Governor's office to discuss the GRS and introduce the new Efficiency Vermont program initiatives to see if there is support or interest in the above approach. Certainly having the explicit endorsement of the DOE and the Governor's office would greatly increase our chances of getting these innovative statewide programs off the ground.

Again, thank you for reaching out to us on this. I look forward to continuing the discussion. Please let me know how I can help or if you have any questions.

Dear Jane,

Wanted to thank you for your public statements of support on behalf of the fuel assistance program and mention an idea that I think is worth pursuing. While the prospects out of DC are more promising than they were earlier, we may still be looking at an effective cut of 30% in purchasing power. As such, we must do everything we can to hold folks harmless; and I'm sure all would like to limit the amount of general funds needed.

As you probably recall, the fuel gross receipts tax can be used for Fuel assistance as a secondary purpose if appropriated weatherization services are not curtailed as a result. see 33VSA 2502 (d) (e). I checked with Richard Moffi and there would be no statutory duty to repay the trust fund as some have suggested.

The new idea I have is to push for a quick or interim implementation of the new electric affordability program. Again Richard thinks this is great idea and could easily save the fuel assistance program over \$1million in monies that would otherwise be spent for restoring/preventing electric/disconnects under the crisis program

I am told that,absent some political pressure, the new electric affordability program recently approved by the public service board wont be up and running until after this heating season. That would truly be a shame as one of the required features is an arrearage forgiveness program , which could minimize the need for fuel recipients going to the crisis program to prevent or restore disconnects.

I will be following up with the 5th floor on this , but wanted you to be aware of the same.

#### **Michigan Rest Areas Get Solar Upgrade**

The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) will be installing solar photovoltaic (PV) panels at three state rest areas to reduce energy costs and demonstrate the benefits of distributed solar PV generation in the state. A Michigan-based company will install three ground-mounted solar PV arrays, two of which will have the capacity to generate 10 kilowatts (kW) each and a third that can generate up to 16 kW.

The three installations are expected to save the state approximately \$4,000 annually in energy costs and reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 26 tons. Each installation will also include a lobby kiosk that displays real-time information on energy use, generation, and savings at the rest area.

#### **New York Expands Net Metering Eligibility**

New York is expanding the energy resources eligible for net metering. Net metering is the process through which customers with distributed energy resources such as solar. Customers are able to sell excess power back into the electric grid when they generate more than they are able to consume.

Governor Andrew Cuomo signed two bills as part of this effort: the first bill makes fuel cell batteries up to 1500 kilowatts (kW) in capacity owned or operated by non-residential customers eligible for net metering. Fuel cells at residential sites with a capacity of up to 10 kW are already eligible for net metering. The second bill allows micro-hydropower generation to be eligible for



net metering. Residential customers may utilize net metering for systems of up to 25 kW; while commercial and industrial customers may install systems of up to 2000 kW for net metering purposes. Previously the New York law applied to residential solar, farm waste, non-residential solar electric generating systems and micro-combined heat and power generating equipment. Governor Cuomo has expanded it to include fuel cell and micro-hydroelectric generation.

#### **Nevada Offers New Lending to Small Businesses**

Nevada will offer more than \$138 million in small-business loans to support state-level, small-business lending programs by leveraging \$13.8 million through the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Small Business Credit Initiative. Nevada expects to generate at least \$10 in new private lending for every \$1 in federal funding to support the Nevada Microenterprise Initiative and a new Nevada Collateral Support Program. The potential impact on job growth by the program is estimated by the state to be 1,035 new positions throughout Nevada, with an emphasis on manufacturing, utilities, construction, and health services.

#### **Washington State Consolidates Back-Office Functions of Agencies**

Washington has combined all or some back-office functions of five formerly separate agencies into a single, consolidated Enterprise Services agency. The consolidations could save \$18 million over two years and create a more responsive and efficient way to deliver common services to other agencies. Those services include:

- State payroll;
- Human Resources and recruitment/training;
- Legal contracts;
- Real estate management;
- Vehicle fleet management;
- Purchasing and keeping accounting and budgeting tools;
- Custodial and grounds keeping functions;
- Printing; and
- Information-technology.

#### **Oklahoma Governor Sets Goal to Increase College Graduation Rates**

Oklahoma Governor Mary Fallin announced a new goal to boost the number of college degrees earned in Oklahoma by 67 percent over the next 12 years. The plan involves a variety of initiatives, including:

- Redesigning remedial education;
- Strengthening the rigor of high school courses;
- Providing more support to students; and
- Enhancing current state degree completion programs.

The state has also adopted the principals of the National Governors Association Complete to Compete initiative, an effort aimed at the number of students completing their higher education and improving the cost effectiveness of state efforts to achieve this goal.

#### **Michigan Privatizing Prisoner Health Care**

Michigan Governor Rick Snyder plans to turn over all prison health care and mental health

services from the state to a private contractor. The move comes as part of a larger effort to meet the state's fiscal year 2011-2012 budget requirement that the Michigan Department of Corrections (DOC) achieve savings through competitively bidding facility operations or other measures to reduce the custody, treatment, clinical, and administrative costs associated with housing prisoners. A recent analysis focusing on moving prisoner health care management to a private contractor found that a private contractor could provide adequate services and potentially save the state \$30 million in 2012, which amounts to 10 percent of the DOC's health care expenses. The state is releasing a request for proposals to allow private organizations to bid on providing the services.

#### **California to Classify Sex Offenders by Risk Level**

California Governor Jerry Brown has signed several bills into law related to sex offenders, including one that requires the state to adopt an empirically validated instrument to identify sex offenders at higher risk for committing another violent crime. Specifically, the purpose of the bill is to develop a new containment model that will better assist the state in identifying and treating sex offenders who are at risk of committing new crimes. Some of the prescribed tools to deal with high-risk sex offenders include more supervision, increased use of polygraph tests, and psychological exams.

Other bills signed into law include: making the state eligible for \$12 million to pay for medical examinations and treatment for victims of sexual abuse; ensuring that all sex offenders who move to California register after they relocate to the state; providing protection from civil liability to certified professionals for any criminal acts committed by persons on parole or probation who receive supervision or treatment; and authorizing crime victims to receive notifications of pending parole or release of a prisoner through email or other electronic means.

#### **Washington Medicaid Program Limits Non-Emergency ER Visits**

The Washington State's Medicaid program will limit coverage for non-emergency use of hospital emergency rooms. Medicaid will pay for three non-emergency visits per client per year; clients will be billed for services provided in subsequent visits. Certain exceptions to the rule include instances where beneficiaries are delivered to the emergency room by ambulance, police, or EMT, and visits that result in an inpatient admission, admission for observation, or emergency surgery.

Washington's Medicaid program also has been working with providers and hospitals to establish alternatives to emergency rooms. Alternative options include walk-in clinics near the hospitals staffed with primary care providers, as well as state case managers to work with emergency rooms, primary care providers, and hospitals to identify the most appropriate source of care for enrollees.

#### **Wisconsin Details State's Health Proposals Online**

Wisconsin's Department of Health Services launched a website that outlines proposals being considered by the state to reform its Medicaid program. The website provides a platform that allows the public and other stakeholders to view the initiatives and submit comments for consideration before the state formally submits its proposed changes to the legislature and the federal government for approval.

Summaries of each proposal are listed individually by program and by four reform categories on the website: service delivery, payment reforms, benefits, and eligibility. Additional reforms will be added to the site over the next several weeks.

#### **Iowa Targets Teacher, Principle Effectiveness**

Iowa Governor Terry Branstad released a blueprint for comprehensive education reform that focuses in large part on building teacher and principal effectiveness. The plan's recommendations include:

- Attracting and supporting talented educators by increasing starting pay for teachers, developing selective teacher preparation programs, and improving recruiting and hiring practices;
- Creating educator leadership roles in schools and a four-tier teacher compensation system with Apprentice, Career, Mentor and Master levels;
- Developing a meaningful peer-based evaluation system;
- Tying job protections to assessments of teacher effectiveness; and
- Providing value-added measures for all districts, schools, grades and educators.

The plan also aims to develop an assessment framework aligned to the Common Core State Standards and sets goals for student outcomes, including all students being able to read by the end of the third grade and a 95 percent high school graduation rate. Gov. Branstad and his top education advisers will host a series of town-hall meetings to solicit feedback on the blueprint before submitting it to the General Assembly in January.

There is some opinion that the price and risk associated with such a deal would not make it positive but I can investigate and report further.

Velco is looking into investment noted below. NYISO has stated that the project to separate the lines and fix the double contingency problem also is on the books for 2011/12. This is beneficial for reliability and to eliminate the contingency protection currently required due to the double line problem (if you want tech briefing I'll get it for you). The worth of the upgrade across will depend upon the outcome and analysis of the upcoming "solutions" report re: VY, due in April. 



Vince told me you are opposing the final language from S.95:

Sec. 4. 21 V.S.A. § 496a is added to read:

§ 496a. STATE FUNDS; UNION ORGANIZING

On an annual basis, an employer that is the recipient of a grant of state funds shall certify to the state that none of the funds will be used to interfere with or restrain the exercise of an employee's rights with respect to unionization and upon request shall provide records to the secretary of administration which attest to such certification.

Obviously, this bill doesn't do very much, but makes the important statement for us that state funds shouldn't be diverted from their intended use (e.g. services) to illegal anti union activities .

State grant recipients would simply be required to say they wont break the law with the use of state funds. It is already illegal to interfere or restrain workers rights with respect to union issues.

It doesn't require you to do anything, as it is merely enabling language with regard to your collecting any records.

The issue started with our discovery through IRS documents, that HCRS , the designated agency in SE Vt, spent \$525k on an out of state union busting law firm in 2008 -2009.

The issue is a priority for Working Vermont (coalition of all labor unions) and I would have thought it would be an easy ask. If there are some tweaks you need, I'm fairly sure they could be accommodated.

**WASHINGTON, DC**—U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Lisa P. Jackson and David O'Neill of the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) joined Mayor Vincent C. Gray and Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes-Norton of the District of Columbia this morning at Marvin Gaye Park to announce the creation of The Anacostia River Revitalization Fund. The fund, which will invest \$1 million in restoration activities this year, with a total goal of investing \$5 million over the next three years, will be used to protect and restore the Anacostia River and to create a national model for watershed conservation. NFWF, in partnership with EPA and the DC Department of the Environment and with funding from corporate sponsors, created the fund, which will award grants to local partnering organizations.

"Clean waters and outdoor recreation can boost urban communities' human, environmental and economic health," said EPA Administrator Lisa P. Jackson. "Through the Anacostia River Revitalization Fund, we're able to partner with state and local government agencies, private foundations and corporate sponsors to make the most of our resources and ensure our restoration efforts are as effective as possible."

"We are proud to be partnering with EPA, the DC government, and our corporate sponsors to help restore this important river – for fish and wildlife, for clean water, for the residents of DC and for its neighborhoods where people live, work and play," said David O'Neill of the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation. "It is our goal to build this Fund so that it attracts new investments that will accelerate the restoration of the Anacostia and result in meaningful and measurable improvements to the river and to the communities that rest along its banks."

"I'm excited and pleased that the Environmental Protection Agency is joining the District of Columbia and regional partners in our ongoing efforts to revitalize the Anacostia River," D.C. Mayor Vincent C. Gray said. "This important natural resource was neglected for too many years -- but it is central to our city's geography and increasingly to its identity as a beautiful, sustainable, livable city with miles of waterfront ripe for public use and private development."

"This important funding comes at a critical time, with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the District and Maryland in the early stages of implementation of the 10-year Anacostia River cleanup plan mandated by my bill, the Anacostia Watershed Initiative Act", said Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes Norton. These funds will move the District forward with the message that the city is serious about cleaning up the Anacostia River."

Specific grant selection criteria will be mutually agreed upon by NFWF, EPA, DDOE and other funding partners. Priority will be given to projects focused on key tenants of the fund – improving water quality in the Anacostia River and its tributaries; achieving habitat restoration priorities for the Anacostia; engaging, employing and educating local residents and businesses; connecting the public to the Anacostia and its tributaries through enhanced outdoor recreation and volunteer opportunities; leveraging public and private funding to make the greatest conservation impact; and emphasizing the neighborhood benefits of watershed restoration to local economic development, public health, livability and as a neighborhood asset.

The establishment of the Anacostia River Restoration Fund is another step in advancing President Obama's



America's Great Outdoors (AGO) Initiative. Through AGO, the administration is opening up access to millions of acres for recreation, designating thousands of miles of new land and water trails, increasing youth employment in conservation jobs, helping parks and green space become more accessible and clean in urban areas, and making historic investments in large landscapes such as the Everglades.

The Anacostia River is one of seven pilot locations as part of the Urban Waters Federal Partnership, an innovative union of 11 federal agencies, led by EPA, that focus on both natural resources and economic development and aims to use environmental restoration to protect people's health and maximize economic growth.

Today's announcement in Anacostia is one of several conservation announcements made nationwide over the past two weeks as part of the White House Conference on Conservation—Growing America's Outdoor Heritage and Economy. Last Friday's conference convened hundreds of boaters, hunters, anglers, farmers, ranchers, land conservationists, historic preservationists, outdoor recreationists, small business owners, local governments, tribal leaders and other key stakeholders, strengthening partnerships and identifying next steps in tackling issues surrounding conservation and the great outdoors in urban cities and rural communities. During the conference, Washington, DC Mayor Vincent Gray participated in a panel discussion led by EPA Administrator Lisa Jackson and White House Council on Environmental Quality Chair Nancy Sutley, highlighting the importance of rivers and clean water to our cities.

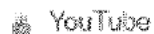
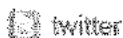

2. Money for Something.

Vermont Training Program (VTP) supported health care comment.

- A.) At time of initial site visit with the company, the VTP staff reviews the eligibility criteria (see attached VTP one pager) with employer which includes wage and benefits. If the employer tells us he/ she complies with the criteria we take them at their word and we continue to develop the training contract.
- B.) At time of signing the contract under Attachment A: Scope of Work, #5, (see below example from the contract boiler plate) the section on wages and benefits are again stated but this time the employer will sign the training contract verifying/ testifying that they comply with the criteria.

3. Moneyback Guarantees for Taxpayers.

The Vermont Training Program (VTP) has written Performance Based Contracts for the past 25 years. Therefore, the only time a payment/ award is made to an employer is when the employer complies with the performance as stated in the Attachment A: Scope of Work. This payment is only paid /awarded through an invoice submitted and signed by the employer. All invoices are screened against the Scope of Work for accuracy and signed off by the Director of VTP before going to fiscal for payment.

1. The Grantee, \_\_\_\_\_, shall provide:
2. The job descriptions and curriculum outlines are on file at the Department and are the training formats for each person. The purpose of this training is to provide the employees with sufficient training experience to meet the acceptable work standards of the Grantee. At the end of training, the trainees shall have received the necessary personal instruction and supervision by the trainer to be productive employees for the Grantees.
3. The job descriptions and curriculum outlines shall be used as guides for the purpose of verification of training when this office conducts site visits with the Grantee.

A recent report on VEGI by the Agency of Commerce & VEPC opened with a reference to a report from *Good Jobs First* (GJF) that ranked Vermont #1 for its incentive programs. This sounds great but as with all such rankings there's more here than meets the eye. There are several reports on this topic from GJF and, not surprisingly, Lawrence & Fred chose the one most favorable to Vermont. In general, we look comparatively good because most of the rest are so

bad. A quick summary:

1. **Show Us The Subsidies** (2010): Deals with public disclosure. VT tied for 13th but received a D+ (not just VEGI). Although VEPC discloses the companies that receive incentives, we are not permitted to know how many or what type of jobs are promised or actually delivered or the wages paid. And we don't know how long the jobs last. This is important because many jobs supposedly created by these programs have been lost during the recession but VEPC never updates the jobs figures in the annual reports.

2. **Money for Something** (2011): Deals with wage & benefit standards for incentive programs. VT is ranked 3rd but received a B- (again, this is for more than VEGI).

Note that VEGI gets high marks for wage standards but ACCD & VEPC are asking (again) to lower the wage standards outside of Chittenden County. Note also that the VT Training Program gets points for requiring company-supported health insurance but we know that VTP never checks to see if participating companies are in compliance. This is the type of detail that can easily be missed in a 50-state study. Furthermore, the review included the old EATI program which was eliminated five years ago. A more in-depth analysis would have resulted in a lower score for VT.

3. **Moneyback Guarantees for Taxpayers** (2012): Deals with monitoring performance and non-compliance. On paper (and largely in fact) Vermont looks pretty good here, although there is considerable discretion in statute re. VEGI clawbacks which should have reduced our score. Vermont is ranked 1st but was graded a B-.

Unfortunately, the criteria used by GJF missed the fatal flaws within the program (devil in the details). That is, how are applicants reviewed and how does VEPC determine how much money to award? It's good for the Tax Dept. to ensure performance before allowing payments, but that ignores the enormous waste in the program from the flawed background growth rate methodology (to say nothing of the "but for" requirement). And once again the review included EATI which no longer exists and the VTP which has very serious problems but looks OK on paper. It's not surprising that GJF missed these types of details because they don't have the time or resources to become that familiar with 238 programs in 50 states.

1. How will this affect or be received by local merchants? Are we competing with local merchants and drawing business away from them?
2. Is this and What is, the image that we want to present to the traveling public? How dissimilar is this to gambling and alcohol tastings that were floated years back?
3. How will pay outs be handled? How much cash will we expect employees to handle? Are these simply the weekly drawing tickets or does this include instant tickets?
4. Are there bonding requirements for staff? What happens to staff that might have issues in their past?
5. What security precautions will be taken to protect staff as the information centers are remote and not easily reached by law enforcement? Clearly these can be targets of least resistance for people looking to score money to fuel their drug habits and access and egress are simple

Since we spoke last night, I've spoken with a local merchant and lottery vendor and the reaction was not positive. Also, I spoke to Senator Mazza this morning. He does not, in any way, support this. So, I might suggest that some more discussion should occur before deployment

By last week's end i had heard from a number of individuals from northeast kingdom to mass border each saying they told fema they were ok with housing when in fact that "ok" was very temporary usually until it gets too cold to stay in campers and houses with no utilities for heat or electricity. It should be noted that the waterbury no. of 29 people has beld steady needing housing. When one family drops off another comes on. This is tough because we are never going to get real numbers state wide. I suggest we use wtby numbers per population and then apply that percentage

to each community stricken. That is a challenge but at least it will give us a more scientific no. than fema numbers. The brattleboro area still reports 100+ people needing housing. I think that no. could be halved and be accurate. But rember that brattleboro lost much low income housing in april with fire. Thanks for the reply to my Ideas. I have written to the leaders in the Emails you provided and Cc'ed them in this Email. Vermont needs to join the 21st century with an optional License to Carry Concealed improving on the current "no license needed" only option. NY, NJ, MA, CA & IL are the other extreme where no one but the rich and politically connected can protect themselves. I think we should put forward an initiative for an "Enhanced" Vermont License to Carry a Handgun and sell it as a OPTION so Vermonters can have reciprocity with other states. It would require the following: Training with live fire, fingerprint based background check, and a mental health check. This advanced permit would allow William Sorrell to negotiate reciprocity with other states. The stricter the requirements - the more states would accept the VT License for the Vermont traveler. Concealed carry is a huge movement with most states now offering it after strict standards are met. The only states that have retrogressed are Alaska, Arizona and now Wyoming. They have kept their licensing system for reciprocity, but are "constitutional carry" now. If we adopt a license option and publicize utilizing the reciprocity as a "carrot" more people will be trained. It would also exempt these trained people from school zones - a Federal law that allows those with licenses to pass within 1000 Ft of a school. One would still not be able to enter school grounds unless the State of Vermont allows it. There could be an exemption for teachers & administrators to enter school grounds PROVIDED they get the enhanced training a license like Louisiana. In states that allow this you just don't hear of teachers going berserk. No one would force a teacher to carry, and in fact the publicity would make a criminal intent on harming children think twice that someone MIGHT be armed there. In fact there may be no teachers who get the license or carry, but the criminals will be kept guessing. This is a great deterrent! This has to be presented as NOT another form of gun control, but a benefit for concealed and open handgun carriers. Craft the PR side of it properly and it would pass muster. In the aftermath of the horrible tragedy in Sandy Hook we should "strike while the iron is hot". The more people PROPERLY TRAINED the safer we all are! Let's get the ball rolling and model Louisiana. The template is already there on the Louisiana website.

Dear Governor Shumlin,

I am writing this note at the request of Ge Wu who read an Email I had sent her. I am a common sense gun owner and concealed carry advocate (for level headed persons with proper training). Everyone is talking about gun control and Vermont should also discuss some sensible solutions since we are a free state with many level headed people. I would like to request a re-visitation of the Child Access Protection Law (CAP) that should have been passed when it was introduced. Even though we have "constitutional carry" in Vermont we need an optional Concealed Carry License for reciprocity that will also exempt us from Gun Free School Zones, and so Mr Sorrell can negotiate reciprocity with other states. It could be a money maker, and you can assure the whining extreme right gun owners they will not lose "constitutional carry". There will be less scrutiny of the police stop you and you have a Vermont CCW with a fingerprint and training requirement. I think \$45 would be a fair fee plus fee for fingerprinting. As the attached map shows CCW is now the law of the land with most states. I don't think Vermont should eliminate it (we can't), but we should offer a Concealed Handgun Carry License option to get more people trained and thinking safety. I do think the age to carry a handgun should be 21 in Vermont - not 16. THAT is a crazy law that has no place with all the video game kids moving here from NJ, NY & MA. That age may have worked when VT was a dairy state, but times have changed! I am not talking about taking away the right of a responsible boy or girl to take a .22 rifle or .410 shotgun in the woods.

I am a gun owner and to me there is no reason why someone needs over 10 rounds in a personal defense handgun. There is also no reason to have a 30 round magazine for deer hunting, or more than 10 rounds for a home defense shotgun.

My family is from Mexico where gun violence way more routine than the US but it is nearly impossible to own most guns, so I am not sure that banning guns accomplishes anything other than making innocent people victims. They find the beheaded bodies of my fellow Mexicans every day in Veracruz and Guerrero and the citizens are powerless to protect themselves. There are a lot of good people who use guns to save lives - however, With 2 shot being the average to end most confrontations why do we need these hi capacity magazines? Most of the the US is not a war zone like Mexico. Why do we not require guns to be locked up when kids are present in the home?

Here in Vermont I carry a Ruger .38 Snub and would feel just as safe carrying a 7 round .45 1911 - I just don't see the need for a 17 round Glock or 30 round AR Magazine in every day personal protection IMHO. I don't think banning AR's or AK's would work at this late stage. I am a member of the Pink Pistols a gay firearms organization, but will not join the NRA.

How much is enough? My opinion is probably not going to convince anyone against their will, but I would like to share some facts and theory that has informed my opinion and maybe help you make up your mind if you are considering a defensive handgun purchase. In general I'll suggest that you carry as much gun as you can use effectively. Here are some guidelines

The first and foremost consideration is your level of skill. Automatics offer higher magazine capacity and are faster to reload. But they are also more prone to malfunction, require more use of fine motor skills. If you are comfortable with the skill of arms and training to shoot your chosen semi-auto will be an ongoing part of your life, then I'd definitely go with the semi-auto. Many people don't like guns, are scared of them, and may purchase one "just in case." If you are in that category and will have little if any training and experience with your handgun then I suggest that you stick with a small revolver.

Why? In a recent analysis of incidents involving the use of defensive firearms by civilians showed that the average number of rounds fired by the defender was 2, those that fired more seemed to fire until empty, and the immediate reaction of most attackers was to immediately flee or die upon being shot. So **most of the time** your small revolver will serve you just fine. Again I don't want to train for "most of the time" and so I choose to carry a full size automatic, but I can do that because I have spent the time to become intimately familiar with its operation and am comfortable deploying it in high stress situations.

So in the end how much gun you need is determined by how much training you are willing to do with that gun. You should carry as much gun as you have earned the ability to carry. **Remember your gun is only as good as you are!**

Administration's announcement of first step toward public participation in state budget process receives mixed review from People's Budget Campaign

Burlington, VT - After advocating for meaningful public participation in the state's budget development process, the People's Budget Campaign today cautiously welcomed the Administration's announcement of two public participation hearings via Vermont Interactive Technologies (VIT) sites.

The Campaign, which is part of the Put People First movement spearheaded by the Vermont Workers' Center, stressed that a public participation process is now a legal requirement, resulting from a new provision in Vermont law. However, campaign leaders expressed disappointment that a process consisting of just two hearings would not allow for meaningful public input into the Administration's budget priorities. The new law, a key Campaign achievement in the 2012 legislative session, set an October 1 deadline for the Administration to design and implement a public participation process for developing the state's spending and revenue policies.

"Participation from the people is crucial to ensure that people's needs are put first, rather than neglected in the drive to cut our budget," said James Haslam, Director of the Vermont Workers' Center.

Nicole LeBlanc, of Green Mountain Self Advocates, added, "We question the announcement in light of budget exercises going on that will require a 3% cut to existing services to pay for new people coming into the system. This is not putting people first. We are once again balancing the budget on the backs of our most vulnerable Vermonters without assessing people's real needs."

"We demand a meaningful process of participation, which includes a review of unmet needs," said Haslam.

In a letter to the Secretary of Administration, the People's Budget Campaign stated that two public hearings do not provide sufficient opportunities for meaningful public participation in decision-making related to the development of the FY 2014 budget. Two hearings are a poor surrogate for a serious public participation

process. Instead, the Campaign calls for a process to be developed that includes a real needs assessment in our communities and greater participation in decision-making.

"We also have very practical concerns about whether most people will even hear about these opportunities for participation within the limited timeframe given," said Haslam. "We ask the Administration to make it a priority to inform the public about these hearings.

Moreover, to ensure that everyone can easily participate on an equal basis, we request that all information provided is in an easy-to-understand, accessible format and that childcare is made available at all sites."

The new legal provision requiring public participation in the budget process was passed as a budget bill amendment pushed by the People's Budget Campaign. Another provision was also added requiring the state budget to address the people's needs and advance equity and dignity among Vermont residents (Section E.100.1 of Act 162).

Dear Governor:

I'm writing with grave concern about the state of our Veterans' Home in Bennington. I have been following the situation over the past couple of months with the VSEA, staff members, the advocate for VVH, and had a brief conversation with Kate Duffy yesterday.

As I'm sure you are aware, our nurses at Fletcher Allen are acutely aware of the problems caused for patients when staffing is inadequate and/or inappropriate. What I have seen/heard of the VVH staffing situation and management's description of how they are addressing it, appears to be inadequate all the way around. Moving staff around in a schedule with many holes is what we refer to as "squeezing the balloon" - it doesn't address the root cause: not enough staff.

I know that Kate Duffy has been working on this and therefore I normally would not reach out to you directly; however the severity of the problem moves me to do so. I'm very concerned about the working conditions of the staff members, and dignity, security, and daily living issues for the residents in what is their home. 20 years ago I was assistant director of nursing for the Greensboro Nursing Home for 5 years under the excellent administration of Dave Yacovone, and am very familiar with what is required to care for elders and other vulnerable community members well, to avoid survey citations, and ensure that workers have positive and safe working conditions. It was tough work then, but I loved it. It is much more difficult now; residents have much more complex health issues, and the regulations about how to provide quality care have toughened and improved (a good thing) - having the effect of making the work more challenging.

Other serious issues:

- management instructing an unlicensed, untrained employee to administer medications to a resident because lacking in staff; sending a resident with incontinence out of the facility

with a staff member untrained/not allowed to assist with toilet hygiene, causing skin problems. Both of these are worthy of citations.

- staff being blamed for the citations and the potential that the home will need to be closed, including publicly (in the media); regular dismissal of issues brought to mgmt by staff
- father of the director of nursing is on the board/conflict of interest (I also witnessed the mother of the DON verbally attacking the VVH staff in public forum)
- frequent citations, including about staffing
- mobility scooter removed from resident's room by VVH management without talking with him first, sent to outside shop with his personal belongings and cash - now cash is missing. Mobility and independence are huge issues for these folks - this was at least unthinkable (especially from mgmt), and worthy of another citation.
- verbally assaultive behavior of Jim Reardan toward VSEA ED Mark Mitchell in board meeting - witnesses say unprovoked (Mark was asking how they could work together)
- the management of the mold issue, impact on health of residents and staff, dismissive treatment of staff by management when mold situation brought to their attention months ago; no training or personal protective equipment given to housekeeping to clean mold

I know this is a very stressful situation for all involved - management, staff, and residents. I trust that everyone is concerned and wants to do the right thing - and wants to prevent the home from closing and the eviction of residents. I believe that if the staff were listened to and allowed to be active participants in addressing the problems, and if there were truly enough direct care staff (not just 'squeezing the balloon'), that the Vermont Veterans' Home would not only survive this difficult period but become a model for other homes and facilities of what we want from health care reform.

I will continue to stay involved and help however I can, and appreciate - in advance - your valuable time and attention to this matter.

**Gov. Shumlin: Vermont farms up and running one year after Irene**

*Storm-related challenges still facing the state's farmers*

**MIDDLESEX** – Gov. Peter Shumlin today announced that virtually all of the 476 Vermont farms that reported losses as a result of Tropical Storm Irene are still operating. However, restoring damaged farm land, repairing buildings and equipment, replacing lost feed, and strengthening resilience are all challenges these businesses still face, the Governor and other agriculture leaders said at a press conference held at The 1782 Settlement Farm in Middlesex.

“Irene’s winds and floodwaters left at least \$20 million of damages in its wake. Fields and crops were washed downstream or buried under boulders, sand, and silt. Barns and greenhouses were flooded and damaged.

Stored feed and firewood were swept away,” Gov. Shumlin said. “But volunteers, emergency services, grants and loans helped Vermont’s independent farm families get back on their feet.”

The Governor was joined by Secretary of Agriculture Chuck Ross, Vermont Community Foundation President & CEO Stuart Comstock-Gay, State Executive Director of the USDA Farm Service Agency Robert Paquin, and Settlement Farm owner Cyrus Scribner to provide an update on farmers’ progress as the state prepares for the one-year anniversary of the devastating storm.

“This support, combined with the remarkable determination and spirit of our farmers, is why these businesses are still here and getting stronger by the day,” said Sec. Ross.

“Federal and state agencies worked closely with businesses, the nonprofit sector, and the philanthropic community to assure both crisis assistance and longer-term recovery funds remain available,” he said. “Irene recovery demanded an unprecedented level of coordination amongst all the partners. This experience strengthened our ability to collaborate quickly and effectively, which will benefit all our programs going forward, not just when emergencies strike.”

Within weeks of Irene, the Vermont Farm Disaster Relief Fund (VFDRF) was established by the Vermont Agency of Agriculture, in partnership with the Vermont Community Foundation. Total contributions to the VFDRF approached \$2.5 million and almost \$1.9 million has been distributed to 198 farmers so far. The deadline for the next round of applications is August 27.

“Farmers provide so much that we appreciate—delicious local food, dairy products, the working landscape itself,” said Comstock-Gay. “They remain the cornerstone for so many of our communities and we are glad we could play a pivotal role in getting these farmers back on their feet.”

“A year ago Irene flooded our lower pumpkin and corn fields, just as these two key cash crops were ready to harvest,” recalled Scribner. “The loans from the Farm Disaster Relief Fund and others were critical in our clean-up and spring purchases that kept the farmstand running.”

The USDA and the Vermont Agency of Agriculture are assessing the remaining and ongoing needs related to Irene farm recovery. Sec. Ross announced at the press conference that the Agency is hiring a case manager specifically to help farmers determine what damage still needs to be addressed and assist them with finding available resources. The one-year position is funded by a grant from the VFDRF.

## **Obama Administration on Idle Earmark Projects: Use It or Lose It "We Can't Wait" Action Helps States Put People to Work, Improve Infrastructure**

WASHINGTON, DC – The Obama Administration today announced that it won't allow infrastructure funds to sit idle as a result of stalled earmark projects at a time when hundreds of thousands of construction workers are looking for work. U.S Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood is making over \$470 million in unspent earmarks immediately available to states for projects that will create jobs and help improve transportation across the country.

"My administration will continue to do everything we can to put Americans back to work," said **President Barack Obama**. "We're not going to let politics stand between construction workers and good jobs repairing our roads and bridges."

"We are freeing up these funds so states can get down to the business of moving transportation projects forward and putting our friends and neighbors back to work," said Secretary LaHood.

President Obama has vowed to veto any bill that comes to his desk with earmarks and would support legislation to permanently ban earmarks. But \$473 million in highway earmarks from FY2003-2006 appropriations acts remain unspent years later. Those acts contain provisions that authorize the Secretary to make the unused funds available for eligible surface transportation projects. Effective today, state departments of transportation will have the ability to use their unspent earmarked highway funds, some of which are nearly 10 years old, on any eligible highway, transit, passenger rail, or port project.

States must identify the projects they plan to use the funds for by October 1, and must obligate them by December 31, 2012.

"Particularly in these difficult fiscal times, states will be able to put these dollars to good use," said Federal Highway Administrator Victor Mendez. "These funds will create jobs in the short term and help bring about what President Obama called 'an America built to last.'"

To ensure that this funding is quickly put to good use to improve our nation's infrastructure, funds not obligated by the December 31 deadline will be proportionally redistributed in FY 2013 to states that met the deadline.

### **Gov. Shumlin announces Irene Anniversary commemorative celebration and events**

MONTPELIER – Gov. Peter Shumlin today announced a four-day series of commemorative events to celebrate how far Vermont has come in recovering from Tropical Storm Irene since Aug. 28, 2011, and acknowledge the work still needed to fully recover and build Vermont back stronger.

“Vermonters have a lot to celebrate on the one-year anniversary of Irene,” said Gov. Shumlin, noting that 500 miles of roads have been repaired, dozens of bridges replaced or repaired, more than 1,000 families have found

housing, and flood-damaged businesses have reopened. "But we also need to recognize that many people and communities still need our help."

Irene Recovery Officer Sue Minter agreed. "The one-year anniversary marks an important step in the healing process from Irene's devastating impacts and is also an opportunity for Vermonters to reinvigorate the amazing Vermont Strong spirit to maintain the long term recovery process," she said.

The Governor announced the following as part of the anniversary commemorative:

Gov. Shumlin will spend four days from Aug. 25 to 28 visiting as many of the communities severely impacted by the storm as possible. He will be presenting officials in each town with an I Am Vermont Strong license plate, which are being sold to raise money to help Vermonters hit by the storm.

The Governor is calling on all churches, town halls and others to participate in a statewide bell-ringing for one full minute, beginning at 7 p.m. on the night of Aug. 28.

A free statewide commemoration event featuring music, storm videos, and more will be held on Aug. 28 at 7 p.m. at the Chandler Center for the Arts in Randolph. An exhibit of artwork and photography will be on display at the Chandler starting at 4:00. Randolph was among the more than 200 towns impacted by Irene and was chosen because of its central location and proximity to many of the hardest hit areas in the state.

Gov. Shumlin and Chris Graff, board member of the Vermont Long Term Disaster Recovery Group, urged Vermonters to purchase the VTStrong license plates to acknowledge the recovery efforts over the past year and support those who still need help.

Vermonters can visit the new Build Up Vermont web site ([www.BuildUpVT.com](http://www.BuildUpVT.com)) to view photographs taken by Vermonters of the storm and the disaster recovery efforts. Visitors to the site are also asked to vote for the best photograph; the winner will receive free tickets to the Grace Potter concert as part of the in Grand Point North Festival at Burlington's Waterfront Park in September.

I was not there at the time but heard they went around the room at one point to gauge where the members were and most people appeared to be on board with the bill as written so far. My deputy Rebecca Heintz and staff Nick Nichols seem to me to be doing an outstanding job being in the committee, providing information, suggesting language, working with legislators and testifying. I am impressed by their work. This is good because apparently my mere presence seems to bring out the best in a certain committee member. I stay in touch with the chair, and still appear and testify, and am talking with legislators outside the room and this seems to be a good recipe for right now.

There is concern about mental health care in DOC. We are proposing language that DMH will conduct an evaluation of who in DOC has a mental health condition and what services they might need, along with some additional training for DOC staff. Hopefully that will suffice for this bill.

One change I anticipate is moving some of the intended "step down" beds in the Governor's plan to Rutland. It makes sense from a service distribution perspective and I think this will be helpful in garnering support.

There will be a new version of the bill on Monday. I'll send you a copy.

Chair Pugh has stated they will be voting out a bill on Friday.

HHS is holding a public hearing on Tuesday, 4:30 to 6:30. I am certain there will be quite a crowd. The DA's and peers will be there in force. Of course so will the VSEA.

In the meantime, I continue to work with House Institutions. So far, so good, I think, but some of their members also want a bigger hospital. FEMA and Risk Management were in that committee this week giving them the details on FEMA.

On the operations front, we have instituted our DMH care management team this week, to track everyone in custody of the commissioner to be sure they are getting the right care at the right time, which includes not be hospitalized unnecessarily and not getting stuck in a bed.

We are working fast with BGS to determine what the possibility is for having the 5 bed secure residential in Barre. The site has been reviewed, waiting for time and money estimates from BGS. This would be preferable in some ways to Windsor, if for no other reason than Medicaid reimbursement will be less of an issue than a site on a Correctional campus. The mayor and Rep Poirier are on board.

I am getting responses from the hospitals about when they anticipate not to need our staff any longer. BR says the end of February. I think the others will come in around the same time.

We are still working on getting the information we need from the hospitals for the CON. It's tough to do with the overwhelming legislative schedule.

I am working on a contract to bring a leader from WCMH, Mary Moulton, on board to help with the expansion of the DA services, which are critical to our success. We are walking the sole source contract around so she can start on Feb 1.

I ended my week in a meeting with 10 psychiatrists from the Vermont Psychiatric Association. I never thought I would be that popular. It went ok; for the most part, they want more beds in the new hospital. One also suggested we look into converting a former nursing home in Morrisville, which is now an office building, into a temporary hospital. I will look into this on Monday, but it is pretty darn late in the process and there are plenty of obstacles. Presumably, if this worked, we would not need to rely on the FAHC beds and they could go back to regular psych beds. Even if we could pull off such an endeavor, we would still need to get it certified or pay all GF. Many challenges but I need to at least investigate.

With all that face time with psychiatrists you'd think I'd be more well adjusted, but I'll let you be the judge of that.

Yesterday I met on the above with Annie, the Building Trades and the Teamsters.

It was our fourth meeting stemming from the Spring meeting we had with you and the Governor.

I think it is fair to say that the collaboration and interest in this topic by various state agencies has yet to quite gel.

As such, Annie is trying to bring together key players from these agencies in early November.

Anything you can do to help this happen, and more importantly to impact the approach/attitude going in, would be most helpful.

As you know, other states (mostly, if not all, with Democratic Governors) have addressed this with Executive Orders requiring agency collaboration and coordination to minimize illegal misclassification of workers - which works to the detriment of workers, state finances, and law abiding employers.

Obviously, as there would be no E.O.s forthcoming from the Douglas Administration, we had the difficult task of passing a series of laws designed to beef up enforcement tools and efforts. We successfully did that over the last 4 years, and we now need the collaboration and coordination of these agencies and departments to make our laws most effective.

On a corollary matter, I understand Heidi Scheurman and others continue to press for definitional changes as to what is considered an employee in some of our basic worker protection programs. I am happy to discuss this with you and others at any time, as this is an area of fundamental concern to labor. We have had to fight hard over decades to protect against diluting who is considered an employee, which is why the above misclassification laws are so important to us.

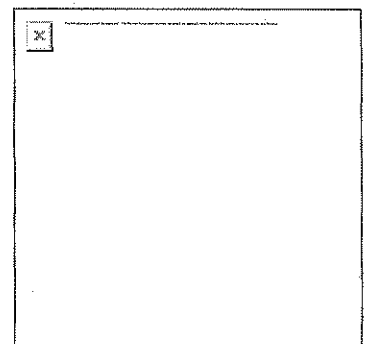

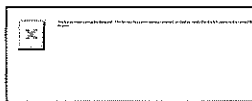

Here is the status of the MCP as of 15:30 hours

1. National Guard has demobilized and returned to Camp Johnson. There are 2 high water vehicles fueled and on standby as are 4 VTNG personnel. They are on quick call for any needed deployments. There is approximately a 1 hour recall for high water vehicles and 2.5 hour recall for the Medivac helicopter
2. The red cross has begun demobilizing their portion of the staging area

3. Franklin County and Chittenden County CERTs were both activated for sandbagging in St. Albans. As of 15:15 hours that operation has ended and Franklin County CERT is staying active for a preplanned event at the Collins-Pearly Arena in St. Albans. The VTANG sandbag crew informed the JOC that they are done and will be returning
4. At 15:30 hours Alburg Fire picked up an additional 2000 sandbags for use in Alburg/Isle La Motte. They do not need any additional assistance at this time.
5. National Weather Service in Burlington reported that the lake level had dropped slightly (1/10th of an inch) and appears to have crested. Additional rains are not forecast.
6. The MCP is being demobilized as of 1700hrs tonight
7. AOT will be keeping a skeleton crew on overnight. VSP will be doing ride throughs of 129 in Isle La Motte looking for debris across the road and will coordinate with AOT

Hi Alex, I wanted to get your thoughts on H. 41: A bill requiring employment breaks for at least 30 minutes during each six hours of work. Commissioner Noonan testified on this bill and noted DHR's concerns during her testimony. However, I see that the bill is on the calendar as being voted out as favorable with amendment. While the amendment attempts, I think, to address the concerns raised, I don't think it actually does. Our primary concern is that employees in residential facilities like DOC and the State hospital and public safety personnel like firefighters have "encumbered lunches," *i.e.*, we don't have to give breaks and permit the person to leave the premises because their presence

in necessary for *potential* emergencies. This is addressed under our collective bargaining agreements and in policy. The amended language indicates that the employer can reschedule the break or require a shorter break if the break “would pose a threat to property, life, public safety, or public health.” This language does not appear to address our situation, which is availability in case of emergency. Another part of the amendment indicates that nothing in the bill “shall be construed to diminish an employer’s obligation to comply with any collective bargaining agreement...that provides greater breaks...” Thus, a CBA is simply the floor not the ceiling and this provision only protects employees not employers. I think we need to work to get this language changed to permit an employer to rely upon a CBA and that the breaks legislation should apply only where no collective bargaining agreement addresses the issue of breaks. This is particularly necessary because the amendment includes treble damages and attorneys’ fee awards for failures to comply where there was “notice,” without defining the type of notice or requiring written notice. Please let me know whether it is ok for DHR to weigh in on this one or whether we should ask Commissioner Noonan to address our concerns. Thanks, Kate

Q – Why will this project take three years?

A – We anticipate that the roadway work will take two construction seasons. There is significant underground utility work (drainage, water line, electric/phone/cable) that must take place before the roadway reconstruction work can begin. Much of the utility work will require significant coordination with various outside parties (the utility owners), so our contractor will not be in full control of the schedule and delays are very possible. Due to this, we've allowed the contractor the full two construction seasons. Our specified completion date for this work is 10/19/2012. The contractors are given the flexibility to be more aggressive and complete the project.

sooner, if possible. The only work to be accomplished in the third year is the planting and maintenance of trees, shrubs, etc. and turf establishment, which should cause minimal disturbance to the traveling public and adjoining property owners.

Q – Will VTrans meet with the owners of the Diamond Hill Store to discuss construction and access issues?

A – Yes. Once VTrans' on-site representative (Resident Engineer) has been assigned we will coordinate a visit with Tom and John to discuss their concerns. There will be further coordination and communication when we have a contractor on board. The contract will require the contractor to have a person on staff specifically for Public Relations. One of the duties of that person will be the continuous communication with the adjoining property owners, the town, emergency services, etc. on issues such as traffic control, access, service interruptions, etc.

US 2 and the roadways around the Green are planned for full depth reconstruction. **Utilities: New Hydro-Québec contract to start below current contract price**

Vermont utilities' new contract with Hydro-Québec will begin in 2012 at rates below the existing contract, which phases out over the next five years. Central Vermont Public Service (NYSE-CV) and Green Mountain Power today filed information with the Vermont Public Service Board that shows a starting price of \$58.07 per megawatt-hour. The PSB will hold technical hearings on the proposed contract beginning on Wednesday, Jan. 19, 2011.

"We are extremely pleased with the deal we negotiated and with the starting price we will pay," CVPS President Bob Young and GMP President Mary Powell said in a joint statement. "We pride ourselves on providing a low-carbon, high-renewable power supply at affordable rates, and this contract will help us retain a competitive position in the region while helping control the air impacts of our supply."

Under the agreement, which the PSB is reviewing, Vermont utilities will purchase up to 225 megawatts of energy, predominantly hydroelectricity, from H.Q. Energy Services (U.S.) Inc. (HQUS) starting in November 2012 and ending in 2038. HQUS markets electricity from Hydro-Québec's generating fleet, whose output is 98 percent hydroelectric.

While the contract was negotiated by CVPS and GMP, HQUS is also selling energy in selected amounts to every other Vermont utility. Those utilities are Vermont Electric Cooperative Inc., Vermont Marble Power Division of Omya Inc., Washington Electric Cooperative, the Town of Stowe Electric Department, the City of Burlington, Vt., Electric Department, and Vermont Public Power Supply Authority on behalf of its 13 municipal electric utility members.

The agreement includes a price-smoothing mechanism that will help shield Vermont customers from volatile market prices. This starting price, while for a somewhat different category of power service, is about 12 percent lower than the existing contract's expected 2012 price.

"Any time we can replace something that has served us exceedingly well for decades under pricing terms that are lower while being shielded from the market's high volatility, that is an improvement and a significant accomplishment," Young and Powell said.

"The agreement will provide reasonable price stability and an initial small reduction in the cost of one slice of our power portfolio," Young and Powell said. "This is a very attractive deal for Vermont and a significant accomplishment on behalf of our customers and the customers of the other participating utilities."

Young and Powell thanked the Douglas Administration for its help in working with Québec in the months leading up to the contract signing this past summer, and the Shumlin Administration for its continued support to gain approval from the PSB. "Governor Douglas, Lt. Gov. Dubie and Governor Shumlin have been uniformly supportive of our efforts to produce a valuable contract for Vermonters," Young and Powell said. "There has been a tremendous collaborative effort between utilities, the two administrations and officials in Québec."
