- ACCD Reallocated \$300K of housing funds to support the changeout of red-tagged above ground storage tanks
 - Transfer happened in late November
- DEC received support for the Joint Fiscal Committee to make more services available to Vermonters online

 - Both changes free up capacity to help underserved communities interact with our permitting processes



Getting Started

Welcome to the Permit Navigator!

Welcome to the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation Permit Navigator. Users of the tool should know that the burden to obtain proper permits rests with you, and an output of the tool that indicates that a permit may not be necessary can never be completely accurate. In instances where a permit is required notwithstanding the output created by the tool, the Agency can and will require permits and may assess penalties for lack of compliance, require remedial measures to be installed or take other actions. When in doubt, please contact program staff directly.

This tool currently provides information on only Agency of Natural Resources permits. Other permits may be required from other state agencies.

What to Expect

The Permit Navigator is a tool to help guide you in identifying various Agency of Natural Resources permit requirements that may apply to your project or business. You may use the Permit Navigator anonymously but doing so may limit our ability to help you later. You will be asked a series of questions and your answers will help to identify your permitting requirements. Once you have completed answering the questions you will have an opportunity to save a summary which will include: information you provided in your inquiry, list of permit(s) that you will most likely need, contact person you will need to talk to if you have questions about that permit, and links to other resources.

After you have answered all of the questions, you may print or download and save a copy of your summary.
