- Exemptions include Public, pious, and charitable property, Cemeteries, Libraries, Nonprofit Medical and Hospital Service Corporations, Humane societies, Local Development Corporations, Housing Authorities, Vermont Housing Finance Agency, Vermont State Colleges, Vermont Student Assistance Corporation, University of Vermont, Congressionally Chartered Organizations, YMCA and YWCA, Owned by agricultural societies for agricultural fairs, federally qualified health centers or rural health clinics, Ski Lifts and Snowmaking Equipment
- Total projected value of exemption for FY 2022: \$102,829,000
