Analysis of Bill

1. Summary of bill and issue it addresses.

Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to require the assessment of points against a person's driving record for a second or subsequent conviction of violating the law that prohibits handheld use of a portable electronic device while driving.

2. Is there a need for this bill?

Make consistent with other moving violations.

7. Rationale for recommendation:

This would add (2) points for second and subsequent offenses as currently it is zero points with increased fines. However, zero points for a moving violation is inconsistent in all VT MV laws. When the law was passed almost two years ago there this was a "soft" approach. However, data and violations issued show that many are still not complying with the law. It is believed adding points to a first offense in addition to a second offense may help deter operators from using their devices while operating.

8. **Specific modifications that would be needed to recommend support of this bill:** *Not meant to rewrite bill, but rather, an opportunity to identify simple modifications that would change recommended position.*

Add (2) points for first offense, consistency with other moving law violations and increasing the deterrent effect.
