
**Analysis of Bill**

1. **Summary of bill and issue it addresses.** This bill establishes a free hunting license for those under 17
2. **Is there a need for this bill?** No. Current license system works fine. Those 15 and under are currently free, those 16-17 pay \$8. This would be unlikely to increase participation significantly, but would require adjustments to the licensing system and would cost revenue. This \$8 fee is the subject of few if any constituent complaints.
3. **What are likely to be the fiscal and programmatic implications of this bill for this Department?** This change will cost the Department roughly \$60,000 a year. This money is used to match roughly 3 times as much federal funding.
4. **What might be the fiscal and programmatic implications of this bill for other departments in state government, and what is likely to be their perspective on it?** None
