As we know, if we put Colchester, Franklin County and the Islands into play, there would be opportunities to achieve lower deviations from the ideal-sized districts, but being less faithful to county lines.

I looked at 2016 census estimates. Burlington's population was flat. South Burlington was up 900. Winooski was down a little. Milton was up 500. Essex was up 1,200. Shelburne was up 600. Williston was up 700. The rest were up slightly.

Standing by itself (i.e., including Colchester), Chittenden County could have 7.75 Senators (2010 population). That figure could be now closer to 8 by 2020.
