

















































Dear Kim:

Thanks for the update.

On my end, I have done what I can in terms of flagging potential issues for the Act 250 NRB, our own ANR Planning Group, and others in DEC. I think that everyone is aware of the impact of the grandfathering of slate quarries in Act 250. At this point, you have connected with the DEC Enforcement Division and with the NRB; those are the entities that may have jurisdiction or regulatory authority to address the problems. Fortunately, I think that the majority of rock quarries in Vermont went/go through Act 250 and do their best to adhere to their permits and reclamation plans.

For now, there's not more that I can do although I appreciate your updates and will try to keep track of progress made. I will forward this e-mail to others here who are working on the site.
