A Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** Fabry Disease is a rare, progressive, destructive, and life-threatening disorder that causes children and adults to suffer a cascade of painful, life-altering symptoms, and can cause premature death in adults due to heart attacks, strokes and kidney failure; and
- WHEREAS,** Fabry Disease is caused by deficient activity of the lysosomal enzyme alpha-galactosidase A, causing insufficient breakdown of lipids—causing lysosomal and cellular dysfunction; and
- WHEREAS,** while treatable, Fabry Disease remains severely under recognized and misdiagnosed; and
- WHEREAS,** increased physician and family education is critical to increasing disease recognition; and
- WHEREAS,** an enzyme assay test for males and a molecular DNA test for females can confirm Fabry Disease;
- NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Peter Shumlin, Governor, do hereby proclaim April 2011 as

**FABRY DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH**

in Vermont, and encourage residents to educate themselves and assess family risk for this tragic but treatable disease
