Analysis of Bill

- 1. Summary of bill and issue it addresses.** *Describe what the bill is intended to accomplish and why.*
The Affordable Care Act requires small employers to follow certain market reforms once they lose grandfathered status. VEHI is losing grandfathered status next year, and these market reforms would split VEHI up into small employers and large employers, with small employers going into Vermont Health Connect. VEHI would like to maintain the status quo, so it is proposing that the organization itself is one large employer and will not be affected by these small employer market reforms.
- 2. Is there a need for this bill?** *Please explain why or why not.*
No. Authority to determine employer size is with CMS, not with Vermont. Vermont's state law would be preempted by federal law.
- 3. What are likely to be the fiscal and programmatic implications of this bill for this Department?**
Other associations may propose to be treated as large employers so they can avoid the small employer market reforms.
- 4. What might be the fiscal and programmatic implications of this bill for other departments in state government, and what is likely to be their perspective on it?**
DVHA—bill will not affect, but if VEHI is found to be large employer, then VHC will not get the schools as small employers.

DFR—currently, DFR regulates VEHI.

VSBIT and BCBSVT wants VEHI to remain intact.

Insurers who prefer to have direct enrollment with schools (BCBSVT). VSBIT & NEA are likely to support in order to minimize change to the education employees.
