**E911 Board and Public Safety Department Joint Statement**

**MONTPELIER** – Administration officials met today with the Chair and Vice Chair of the E911 Board as well as the Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner of Public Safety to discuss budgetary issues around 911 service raised by the Board and the Department yesterday.

Participants in the meeting included Secretary of Administration Justin Johnson, Chief of Staff Darren Springer, Finance Commissioner Andy Pallito, E911 Board Chair Gary Taylor, E911 Vice Chair Roger Marcoux, Public Safety Commissioner Keith Flynn, and Deputy Commissioner Joe Flynn. The group collectively agreed to a further deliberative process before pursuing any changes to 911 service.

E911 Board Chair Gary Taylor and Vice Chair Roger Marcoux, and Secretary Johnson and Commissioner Flynn issued the following joint statement:

“We want the public to know we are committed to working together to resolve any lingering budgetary or policy differences. Most importantly, everyone should know that regardless of any disagreements on policy, when you dial 911 you will have a dedicated state or local official on the other end of the line ready to respond. That is what we have today and we are committed to ensuring that continues to be the case going forward.”

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
