Dear Citizens of Waterbury:

I am writing in support of the incredible efforts of citizens and business owners in Waterbury to overcome the ravages of Tropical Storm Irene. On August 28, 2011, wind and rain flooded some 200 Waterbury homes and businesses as the storm tore through Vermont.
