- Get cost of screen from managers
- Get quote from at least a couple of managers we're not currently working w/
- Get cost and parameters of current screens we have in place
- Get CA Treasurer, Controller, and/or Pro Tempore out here

By May 2, we ask that you provide the public and the subcommittee with the following:

- An analysis of the costs required to divest from coal and Exxon by an agreed upon external expert.
- A report on the cost and function of current screens in place for Sudan and Tobacco, if applicable.
- A progress report on interaction with California (treasurer, controller, Pro Tem) on process and cost as well as an update on interaction with other states or municipalities who are considering divestment.
- As outlined in Senate letter, a report to the Senate and House Committees on Government Operations by May 2, 2016, concerning your recommendations and time frame and process to be followed to complete the analysis.
