## Broadband

Economic Development Director Bill Moore said he set aside money in the budget, and as a broadband project, they would receive federal ARPA funds. Those opposed said they were not sure if the start up costs would be met by federal funds, and thus they could not predict if it would be cost effective in the long run.
