

Awards Earned in VT

\$17,003,696 in Ed Awards as of reporting date (2 years old)

\$19.6 M now (CNCS calculation)

\$1,4 M earned annually in Vermont (CNCS)

4,707 individuals have served in VT and received award (CNCS)

Awards Disbursed Overall

57% were used for education expenses / tuition

43% were used for loan repayment

Awards Disbursed in VT

\$7,723,172 has been disbursed to VSAC (Don't know what % of that went to State Colleges, Doesn't include other loan servicers. If we apply direct tuition payment % to VSAC figure, that would be

\$1,312,939 associated with loans from State Colleges.

\$9,280,524 has been paid directly to institutions of higher ed

\$1,596,955 has been disbursed to VT State Colleges – 9% of total disbursed, 17% of payments direct to schools. **VT State College - \$63,877 per year** (not including any loans from other loan servicers)

\$7,683,569 has been disbursed to non-state institutions of higher ed directly

\$2,909,894 in Ed Award loan repayments and tuition payments has been associated with State Colleges (with VSAC assumption)

Alumni in VT *anecdotal / annual

300 serve annually through all streams of AmeriCorps. At the conclusion of service 30 reenroll for a second term of service, 5+ serve in another service program, 13 are hired on at their service site, and 31 gain employment in the social sector in VT

Alumni Overall 2014 Study

88% believe AmeriCorps service was among the most significant professional experience of their lives.

45% over ages 36 strongly agree with that

64% strongly agree they gained valuable workplace skills

64% work in government or nonprofit sector (just 6% of college students plan to work for public sector, and only 2.3% want to work at federal level)

88% of AmeriCorps alums have a bachelor's degree vs. 77% at the time of service.
