I find three sections of statute that would appear relevant:

- “Practice of funeral service” means arranging, directing, or providing for the care, preparation, or disposition of dead human bodies for a fee or other compensation. This includes: ... (c) arranging, directing, or performing the removal or transportation of a dead human body ...” 26 V.S.A. § 1211(4).
- “Removal’ means the removal of dead human bodies from places of death, hospitals, institutions, or other locations, for a fee or other compensation.” 26 V.S.A. § 1211(5).
- “Any person who desires to engage in removals shall register with the Board,” however “[u]nregistered personnel may accompany registered personnel to assist in removals so long as they have been instructed in handling and precautionary procedures prior to the call.” 26 V.S.A. § 1252(f).

Because “transportation of a dead human body” is specifically identified as an act within the scope of the practice of funeral service (*id.* § 1211(4)), I tend to think at least one Board licensee—whether a licensed funeral director or registered removal personnel—should be directly on hand for the various forms of transportation. Section 1252(f) clearly anticipates that unregistered personnel may assist registered personnel, so I don’t know that any particular function, such as driving, is prohibited, so long as a licensee or registrant accompanies the unlicensed employee.
