A Proclamation**

WHEREAS, for over half a century, beginning with the National School Lunch Program in 1946, the nation has steadily built an array of nutrition assistance programs to build a healthier generation of Americans; and

WHEREAS, during the school year, more than 73,000 Vermont students receive meals through the National School Breakfast and Lunch Programs; and

WHEREAS, when schools let out, children lose access to these healthy meals; and

WHEREAS, children need good nutrition all year long, and since 1975, the Summer Food Service Program has alleviated this burden by nourishing children and teens while school is out; and

WHEREAS, the Summer Food Service Program provides free, nutritious meals and snacks to youth 18 years of age and younger throughout the summer when school is out; and

WHEREAS, this month, we give thanks to the sponsors, site operators, volunteers, parents and communities that provide access to a healthy meal in a safe, supervised environment; and

WHEREAS, it is important to ensure that every child in the State of Vermont has access to nutritious meals during the summer as well as during the school year; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Peter Shumlin, Governor, do hereby proclaim July 2015 as
