[The Agency also anticipates offering analysis of cannabidiol \(CBD\), the acid forms of both compounds \(THCA and CBDA\), and cannabinol \(CBN\) content as part of the analytical package](#). ~~The Growers who chose to participate will have~~ [this service will afford Vermont growers of industrial hemp the opportunity to obtain State of Vermont state certification of tetrahydrocannabinol \(THC\) content in their plants](#). ~~Additionally, we anticipate offering analysis of cannabidiol (CBD), the acid forms of both compounds (THCA and CBDA), and cannabinol (CBN) content as part of the analytical package~~. [This service will provide essential added value to Vermont hemp by certifying the material grown is within the statutory limit for THC content](#).

~~Although the Agency laboratory is still occupying temporary facilities (graciously provided by the University of Vermont), and resources remain somewhat limited, The Agency aims~~ [we hope to be able to perform analyses on about approximately 50 samples in 2017, but are. It intends to planning to ramp up increase its sampling capacity in future years the future once it streamlines the sampling process and has more resources](#). [The Agency's ability to increase its sampling capacity is also dependent upon the timing of the relocation of its laboratory from its temporary location at the University of Vermont to its new permanent home. The Agency currently expects this relocation to occur in 2018, as sample processing becomes more streamlined and other program details are addressed](#).

~~We Agency staff will perform propose to perform field sampling of hemp prior to harvest, The sampling will be~~ [scheduled to allow adequate time to provide sampling results before harvest. Results will be presented to growers as soon as they become are available. Growers Growers are are advised that in the event if the sampling results show the 0.3% THC \(dry weight\) statutory threshold is exceeded, we are the Agency is required to and will obligated to provide notice to local law enforcement enforcement \(Sherriff or municipal police, as appropriate\)](#).

~~Constituents analyzed Using high performance liquid chromatographic (HPLC) technology, the Agency plans to analyze constituents including THC, THCA, CBD, CBDA, and CBN will include THC, THCA, CBD, CBDA, CBN, using high performance liquid chromatographic (HPLC) technology. The Agency efficiencies increase, we may find we that it can offer additional analytes, possibly including such as terpenes in the future. C The service charges to participating growers for the 2017 program will initially be \$150.00 per sample, which may change as program costs and expenses become clarified~~.

~~In 2017, grower participation in the program will be on a voluntary basis.~~

~~Results and lessons learned from this preliminary sampling and analytical program will also be used. The Agency will draw upon its practical experience of implementing the 2017 program in its rulemaking for an industrial hemp rule, which it plans to begin in the upcoming year in support of the rulemaking process. An industrial hemp rule will formalize sampling and analytical practices and notification procedures, and provide additional guidance and structure for the future of the Vermont hemp program going forward. We propose The Agency hopes to work in close partnership with to engage in rulemaking after one year, drawing on combined experiences to inform the process. Rulemaking will draw heavily on input from registered growers, producers, consumers, law enforcement and other interested stakeholders in developing the rule and final program design. The Agency invites growers and members of the public to send comments, questions, or suggestions regarding rulemaking or other hemp related issues to XX. The final regulatory product will emerge from the experiences of these groups working in close partnership with the Agency. It is our hope this deliberative and thoughtful process will provide the most responsive and useful rule, one based in practical experience, and will best meet the needs of the Vermont hemp and associated communities.~~

Growers ~~wishing who would like~~ to participate in the preliminary 2017 sampling and analytical program should ~~contact XX the industrial hemp program as soon as possible immediately, in order to accommodate as many growers as we are able.~~ Likewise, we are actively soliciting input on an ongoing basis from interested parties on the rulemaking effort, and invite comment from the public.
