Agreeably to statute act passed Oct 30. 1828.
 requiring and directing the overseers of the poor
 in the several Towns in this state, to make
 returns of the number of paupers &c. &c.
 we make the following statement, viz, that
 this Town supports at this time seven paupers,
 who are put out to the lowest bidder in the
 month of March annually, the bidder gives bond
 to the overseers of the poor, conditioned, that
 he shall board and clothe all the paupers then on
 the Town or may^d during the ensuing year,
 and to free the town from all expense arising
 from pauperism of whatsoever nature it may
 arise, ^{from} except the expense of law suits and moving
 them from other Towns, the expense of supporting
 our paupers this year is \$259. - (causes) -

- 2 aged females supporting good character one now the
 other formerly connected with intemperate husbands
- 1 - now living & one of the paupers
