REAPPRAISAL:

The City of Rutland was issued an order by the State of Vermont Tax Department to complete a city-wide reappraisal. I am working through that process with the State and expect to have more information in the coming months on what the time line is to complete the reappraisal.

REMINDERS:

BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY: All businesses need to return to the Assessor's office their business personal property Return to ensure that you are being billed accurately. The rendering or request for filing is sent out by the Assessor in January and is due by April 20th; please keep an eye out for the mailing from the Assessor's office.

HOMESTEAD: Taxpayers that own and occupy a residence as their primary dwelling on April 1st must file their HS-122 Homestead Declaration every year.

VETERANS EXEMPTIONS: Veterans that meet the criteria for an exemption as defined by the Office of Veterans Affairs must complete the application every year to qualify. Please contact www.veterans.veterans.gov for more information.



PLANNING & ZONING DEPARTMENT REPORT

During FY 2022-2023 the number of zoning permits issued decreased from 128 permits to 109 Permits.



Over the past fiscal year, the Building & Zoning Department, in addition to the Department of Public Works and the Clerk’s Office, has worked diligently towards digitizing its permit applications through GovPilot. Please visit the City’s website and click “Permit Applications & Forms” on the left side to access those applications forms. The Department also continues its efforts to register Short-Term Rentals through GovOS.

Over the course of the next fiscal year, the Planning & Zoning Department will be seeking to add another member – an assistant zoning administrator, thus allowing the Staff to providing more planning assistance and services. Moreover, the Department continues to oversee the proposed revisions to the City’s zoning regulations. The Commission is making substantial progress on the revisions with efforts to finish the rewrite next year. As a reminder for zoning permit applicants anticipating review by the Development Review Board (DRB); applicants are strongly encouraged to coordinate with the Department of Public Works prior to submitting a DRB application in an effort to resolve issues at the beginning of the process rather than towards the end.

We also welcome Michelle Delpha from the Treasurer’s Office to our team (Mike Brookman, Rhonda Hart, Mark Sadakierski, Kevin Blongy and Katie Langlois). Thank you, Susan Clark (who has moved to the City’s Clerk’s Office), for all of your help over the past years in the Building & Zoning Department.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY COMMISSION

To the Mayor of Rutland, Honorable Board of Aldermen and the Citizens of the City of Rutland:

Rutland City has the responsibility for the maintenance of the following city cemeteries; West Street Cemetery, North Main Street Cemetery, House of Correction's Cemetery located behind Northwest School, and the Poor Farm Cemetery located at the transfer station off Gleason Road. Access to the West Street and North Main Street Cemeteries are available upon request from Rutland City Hall, Rutland Recreation Center, or from the city cemetery commissioner upon request.

In October of 2022, individual(s) entered the West Street Cemetery and damaged close to 50 monuments. Many of them had been newly-repaired by the cemetery commissioner and local volunteers. They also pushed stones off the front of the vault and destroyed a large nearby monument. It is unfortunate that this cemetery continues to be the target of vandals.

The City of Rutland was fortunate to have several community organizations volunteer their time in Rutland's historic burial grounds. Rutland Rotary South and Rutland City Rotary combined forces and spent a morning working in the Rutland North Main Street Cemetery. They cleaned monuments, straightened/repared stones and did a general cleanup of this historic Rutland burial ground.

The General Electric Veteran's Network, led by Rosanna LaCross, spent a work day at the West Street Cemetery. Having close to 100 volunteers working at the cemetery on the Friday before Memorial Day was incredible! They repaired much of the vandalism damage from last October, raked and bagged a few hundred bags of leaves and filled a city dump truck up twice, with brush and debris. The GEVN also paid for and installed a state-of-the-art solar light on the veteran's flag pole in front of the cemetery. A barbeque lunch was provided by the GEVN for all the volunteers.

Rutland Moose Lodge 1122, for the **3rd year in a row**, had their members working in the West Street Cemetery. The volunteers cemented monuments to bases, epoxied stones and cleaned many monuments in the cemetery. They also provided a well-received barbeque at the Moose Lodge for all the volunteers. The Moose have already scheduled another work day for 2024. Thanks to Moose Lodge 1122 President, Len Downy, for his continual support this yearly cemetery event.

Rutland Dismas House has been mowing the House of Corrections Cemetery for the last two years. Thanks to Dismas Director, Eric McGuire, and the residents of Dismas House for maintaining this city burial ground.

The Rutland Middle School Enriched Studies Program, which has been on hiatus due to Covid issues, once again spent time working in North Main and West Street Cemeteries. Thanks to Rutland Middle School Social Studies teacher, David Cornwell, for his willingness to continue this program with RMS students.

The Ann Story Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution continues to place the flags on the veterans' graves before Memorial Day. This year they had assistance from the Rutland Rotary South, Rutland City Rotary and the General Electric Veteran's Network.

We have had visitors to the city cemeteries. One family came from California to find their ancestors in the West Street burial ground. Keeping the cemeteries maintained does give out of staters a positive view of the city.

Rutland City Parks Director, Tyler Dahlin, and his crew have been outstanding in providing materials and support for all the projects that have been happening this year in the city burial grounds. They are also repairing one of the large monuments that was broken into many parts due to the recent vandalism. Most of the work that was accomplished this year in the city's burial grounds could not have been accomplished without the exceptional assistance from the Rutland City and Parks employees.

The large pine tree that has been documented as an issue in this report for over a decade has been pruned and hopefully is no longer a threat to the monuments in the West Street Cemetery. Thanks to Rutland City Forester, Tim Smith, for tackling the pine tree and for his attention to the trees in the city cemeteries.

There continues to be concerns that need to be addressed by city officials. The existing fences in North Main Street and West Street need to be replaced. The House of Corrections Cemetery fence had tree damage and needs to be repaired. The vault in the West Street Cemetery is collapsing and needs immediate attention from the city. It has become a hazard to anyone in the cemetery. The recent vandalism to the façade of the structure has increased the probability of the wall to fail.

Rutland's old burial grounds are still in the long and tedious process of being restored. The old marble stones tell much of the history of our city. Veterans from all the colonial wars and many of the original settlers of Rutland are resting in these city's cemeteries. The commissioner encourages city residents or anyone interested in the history of Rutland, to assist in the restoration efforts. If any individual and/or group wishes to volunteer, please contact the cemetery commissioner.

To the Citizens of the City of Rutland:

It is my pleasure to respectfully submit the following Annual Report for the Rutland City Clerk’s office, for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2022 and ending June 30th, 2023.

Revenue:

The Clerk’s Office revenue for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 was \$216,448.00.

Vital Records:

All certified copies of Birth certificates, Deaths certificates and Civil Marriage licenses are available for \$10.00 per copy as set by the State of Vermont. Uncertified copies are available for \$2.00/copy.

Vital Records Recorded in Fiscal Year 2022-2023:

Births.....	355
Deaths.....	493
Civil Marriages.....	120

Land Records:

All land records are available for \$1.00/page for each copy. Certified land records are \$10.00/page and vault time is charged at \$4.00/hour.

Recording Fees:

10,655 pages of land records were received and recorded. There were 624 Property Transfer Tax Returns (PTTR). The cost of recording land records is \$15.00/page, (excluding PTTR which is \$15.00 per document) as set by the State of Vermont. Of this \$15.00/page, \$3.00/page is set aside for records preservation.

Business Licenses:

The City Clerk issued over 125 business licenses for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Business Licenses are valid from May 1st until April 30th of each year.

Dog Licenses Issued:

871 dogs were registered. Dogs must be registered by April 1st of each year and a current rabies certificate is required. After April 1st, late charges apply.

Dog License fees are as follows:

Spayed/neutered fee before April 1st \$15.00; After April 1st \$35.00
Un-spayed/un-neutered fee before April 1st; \$20.00; After April 1st \$35.00.

The Clerk’s Office would also like to thank Animal Control Officer Tim Jones with whom we work closely to ensure all dogs are registered and vaccinated according to State law.

One project we've returned to is the yearly purchase of firefighter protective clothing. By purchasing a certain number of garments each year, we avoid the sticker shock of buying all members gear, together. COVID, and the associated material supply shortages have made this challenging, but with the help of the City Treasurer Markowski, we were able to get this done by June 30, 2022.

In January 2022, I asked the Board of Alderman for \$250,000 from the City's ARPA Money for the replacement of the stations radio system, which had failed in the previous fall. DC Daniel Gedney, assisted by other officers and firefighters, worked to remove the outdated console, consolidate the fire alarm system equipment, update the stations fire alarm system, phone system and prepare the dispatch room for the new radio consol. Their efforts save funds that were used on this project.

Services Provided

The department provides a municipal fire alarm system, fire suppression services, emergency medical assistance, fire prevention, public education, hazardous materials operations, and decontamination. In addition, we have teams trained and equipped to respond to swift water and boat rescues, technical rescue incidents involving extrication from heavy vehicles and machinery, structural collapse, rescue from confined spaces, trench collapse rescue and can perform high and low angle rope rescue operations.

This year, we renewed our commitment with the State of Vermont Urban Search and Rescue Team by signing a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Members of this department will respond to the call for help, as part of the Vermont Task Force 1, a state support team trained in multiple technical rescue disciplines. While gone, our members are State Employees, on the State payroll, with back coverage paid through this agreement. The training and experiences they receive are invaluable to our community

Those skills were utilized by our members to serve our community, this year. By assisting local businesses, by providing on-scene rescuers during maintenance procedures, and assisting our Mutual Aid Community, we lessened the risk to first responders, as well as the time they wait, for assistance.

The department provides contract fire protection to the Town of Mendon, several large businesses in Rutland Town and has a contract with the State of Vermont for Airport Rescue Firefighting (ARFF) services at the Rutland-Southern Vermont Regional Airport.

We provide safety and fire protection for the Vermont State Fairgrounds and for the promoters using the facility. We also responded to assist our neighboring fire departments through the Rutland County Fire Mutual Aid Agreement. This agreement has become the model for the state, where each community commits to assist their neighbors, in times of need. Mutual Aid Fire Departments have requested help with fire suppression, vehicle and machinery extrication, technical rescue, Safety Teams and forest fire suppression. In turn, the Towns of Rutland, West Rutland and Clarendon came to our requests for help.

In addition to emergency duties, members maintain apparatus and equipment. Their efforts are noticeable in many ways. The fire station and grounds benefit from their commitment to the taxpayers, and with their collective abilities, making many projects possible, with limited or non-existing funds.

The department also assists with school ride-a-long programs for Rutland, Mill River and Fair Haven High Schools. These outreach programs focus on students interested in a career as a firefighter, where they experience our job, through firsthand observation. Job Shadow, the Rising Leader Program and other community promotional efforts, such as National Night Out and Project Vision are welcomed by the students and your firefighters. These initiatives have far reaching benefits. Many of our present and past members were first attracted to the fire service, with these first contacts. We will continue these exposures and foster these individuals, as they move into the work force.

Master Box Checks: The fire department performed master box resets on 560 occasions in FY 2023. Once fire alarm or sprinkler system maintenance is performed on a building that has a master box, by a private contractor, the department checks and resets the box to ensure proper alerting directly to the station.

Four times a year, your firefighters perform box checks on 147 Gamewell fire alarm boxes. These mandated checks confirm that each box transmits its signal to the City Fire Station.

School Fire Drills: The department assisted with 108 school and daycare fire drills in FY 2023.

American Flag Details: The fire department is responsible for the care, maintenance, raising and lowering of 11 City owned American Flags throughout the city. The department raised and lowered those flags on 21 occasions in FY 2023, totaling over 57.5 personnel hours and 231 total visits to the flags. Flags are typically lowered by order of the Mayor, for a Line of Duty Deaths, the Governor or the President of the United States.

Smoke Detector Battery Replacement: Did you know your fire department can assist with replacing smoke and carbon monoxide detector batteries for citizens, unable to do so on their own? Our priority is for our citizens to be adequately protected by their smoke and carbon monoxide alarms in case of a fire. If we find a detector that needs its battery replaced and the

occupant is unable to replace one on their own, and no one else is responsible for the detector's maintenance, we do so without hesitation, in order to protect our citizens.

Training & Education

Typically, each firefighter spends many hours of the day training and presenting public education programs to both school aged and senior citizens.

Our ability to seek outside training was greatly diminished by the COVID pandemic, but a return to a "new normalcy" has occurred. Training styles and modalities have evolved, and your firefighters engaged these new mediums. They met and exceeded their training requirements. The department members gained a total of 3746.25 hours of training in 2023.

Child Safety Seats: The fire department is a Safe Kids Vermont Fitting Station for child safety seats under the Vermont Department of Health. The Department holds a stock of state funded car seats which we provide to citizens around the county who provide a Voucher from the State of Vermont. We have seven (5) Nationally Certified Child Safety Seat Technicians across all shifts to assist the public with their needs. Our technicians participate in Statewide Car Seat events and reciprocally, other technicians from around the state come to assist us in Rutland. In FY 2023, the department installed a total of 60 car seats for the citizens of Rutland County, a stark increase in the numbers above last year.

Rutland County TRIAD: The fire department has regularly partnered with the Rutland County Sheriff's Department, in community risk reduction, by joining Lynn Tucker at various senior living facilities throughout the city, providing fire safety education across all spectrums including cooking fires, evacuations, candle and heater safety, carbon monoxide, burn prevention, holiday fire safety, etc.

Open Burning

We receive numerous complaints about people burning anything from brush to trash in the city. The following information is provided regarding open burning within the City of Rutland. Open burning is **not** permitted without a signed permit from the Chief Engineer. Such permits are **only** issued for the occasional bonfire at a school or college or for municipal emergency situations. Cooking fires are permitted outside but only by using charcoal or LP gas for fuel. If an outside fire is creating a nuisance, it may be ordered extinguished by the department. In FY 2023, the department responded to 49 unauthorized burning complaints.

The burning of trash, painted/treated wood, shingles, tires and similar materials is prohibited by state law. Persons who have unpermitted fires or are burning illegal materials are subject to being issued a ticket for violation of the open burning ordinance and may be subject to additional state enforcement actions.

Fire Prevention

We encourage all residents to police their property. Unnecessary storage of unwanted materials has become a problem in some homes. Improper storage of gasoline powered tools

also causes concerns. Clean your chimney often and service your furnace or heating appliances annually. Your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors should be tested monthly. Batteries should be changed bi-annually, and the detectors should be replaced at least every 10 (ten) years. Have you checked yours, lately?

Remember the best defense may be gained by a good offense. Be pro-active when dealing with the safety of your family and property. If you have a question don't hesitate to call your fire department at (802)773-1812. We will gladly answer your home and fire safety questions, and if we can't, we'll find someone who can!

On behalf of the members of the Fire Department, I would like to thank Mayor Allaire, the Board of Aldermen, Rutland City Police Department, Department of Public Works, City Hall personnel, Rutland Recreation Department, the School Department, and all city officials and employees who assisted the Fire Department in any way during the past year. Our thanks, also, to the citizens of our city for their continued support of the Fire Department and our efforts at improving your quality of life and safety in our community. Finally, a very special thank you to our mutual aid partners for their continuing assistance. When we need assistance dealing with an incident, they respond professionally and with great enthusiasm and we look forward again to assisting them in their time of need.

FY 2023 Annual Report

To the Citizens of the City of Rutland,

As we begin another year, it is my pleasure to provide you with a summary of activity that kept us busy over the past twelve months.

Despite the challenges the Department, and law enforcement in general, has faced, we have remained dedicated to protecting and serving our citizens through professionalism, courtesy, compassion and community partnerships. While many law enforcement agencies have had to curtail services and hours due to critical staffing shortages, we remain a full-service 24/7 agency our community deserves and expects.

The demand on police services has risen steadily over the past couple of years. Analysis of our calls for service indicates 25% of those calls are for non-criminal matters and likely do not require a response from a sworn officer. Under the direction of Commander Greg Sheldon, working with Project; Vision's Community Policing sub-committee, the Community Resource Specialist (CRS) position was created. You can learn more about the position in Commander Prouty's Project VISION summary later in this report. Commander Prouty, who retired from the Department in 2021, re-joined us in August 2022 as our first CRS. We have since added two more CRS positions to respond to our non-criminal calls for service.

While we ended the year with two more sworn positions filled than we had at the beginning of the year, there was much roster activity in the interim, with several hires and separations noted below. Of note, Commander Greg Sheldon retired after over twenty-one years with the City, leaving us to become the Hartford Police Chief. Congratulations Greg, and thank you for dedicated service to the City.

I want to thank the entire Department for all the work you do every day to serve our community. Your dedication and commitment to our mission is not just recognized and appreciated by the Administration here at the Department and at City Hall, but it is evident throughout our community. The sacrifices you make are unlike those most others are ever asked.

To our entire community and all those we serve, thank you for your expressions of support we receive throughout the year. It is exactly what sustains us.

The Rutland City Police Department’s Patrol Division continues to be committed to public safety within community. We continue to struggle with staffing shortages all while trying to cover shift vacancies and maintaining responsive and professional interactions with the public. Our officers have really stepped up and continue to work tirelessly to provide police services to the city. From July 1, 2022 until June 30th, 2023 the Rutland City Police Department’s patrol division responded to approximately 10,911 calls for service. Included in the Patrol Division is our Dispatch Center which consists of 6 full time dispatcher positions. Over the last year we have had two dispatchers step down from their positions, one leaving the department due to personal reasons and the other moving to a different position within the department. Currently we have two dispatcher vacancies we are in the process of filling.

The past year has proven to be a challenge for our department as a whole and the patrol division based on staffing shortages and the seriousness of crimes we are responding to. We are committed to holding ourselves and others within our division to a standard that aligns with our department’s core values and mission.

PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS DIVISION

I have been the Commander of the Rutland City Police Departments Professional Standards Division since January of 2022. This division includes all of the Bureau of Criminal Investigations detectives, evidence custodian, records clerks and the staff operations specialist.

Our goal is to bring the most professional service to the people who live work and visit in our great community. We continue to work through a staffing shortage and our employees are going the extra mile to make sure those services and the safety of our citizens continue.

The Rutland City Police Department continues to search for qualified candidates to become the next generation of leaders within our department. We have a rigorous background process that takes time to find those qualified men and women who meet the needs of the community, and also meet our minimum standards. There are plenty of career opportunities within the Rutland City Police Department. In this last year, we continued to see a blend of local and out of state applicants who have been great additions to our team and community.

Over the past year, the Rutland City Police Department's Bureau of Criminal Investigations has handled many cases to include frauds, sexual assaults, aggravated assaults/stabbings, death investigations, armed robberies, drug investigations and homicides. Our team of Detectives have worked alongside our local partners to include the Child First Advocacy Center, DCF, Vermont State Police, the Southern Vermont Drug Task Force, the Rutland County Sheriff's Office, the Rutland County State's Attorney's Office, Probation and Parole and other local law enforcement agencies. We continue to work with our federal partners to include HSI, FBI, DEA, US Marshall's and the United States Attorney's Office. These partnerships continue to be effective and have resulted in successful prosecutions keeping individuals accountable for their criminal actions.

Our team has seen a transition this year as Detective Sergeant Charles Whitehead was promoted to Patrol Commander. Our team is currently supervised by Sergeant Jon Dickerson, and also consists of Detective Corporal Adam Lucia, Detective Tyler Billings, Detective Oscar Menjivar and our evidence custodian Eric Morgano. Our team has also been assisted by our criminal intelligence analyst Nathan Thibodeau. The team has been very proactive working many extra hours keeping the community safe. In addition to their case load, our team is also tasked with the background investigations of all our new employees.

Our records department consists of Records Clerks Nora Moore and Misty Jax. They have done tremendous work providing fantastic service to our employees, our community and other agencies. Our records team processes hundreds of cases for prosecution each year, to include additional court related paperwork for pre-trial preparation and hearings, and thousands of other reports for non-criminal calls for service, motor vehicle crashes, motor vehicle tickets and warnings and keep everything organized so the Rutland City Police Department can continue

to efficiently and effectively provide the quality of service to our community and all of our partners.

Our Staff Operations Specialist Ryan Brady works hard every day to make sure all of our equipment, technology and supplies are up and running. He spends countless hours taking care of building and vehicle maintenance, and making sure our applicants, new and current employees have everything they need for training and to get the job done. Ryan also spends time coordinating our third party vendors and making sure the daily needs of the department are fulfilled.

Thank you to all of my team for all that you do every day.

Project VISION

As the Executive Director of Project VISION and the Commander of Outreach for the Rutland City Police. I want to thank now Chief Gregory Sheldon of the Hartford Police Department, for his efforts and his support. Chief Sheldon did a tremendous amount of work to get our Community Resource Specialist position created and up and running.

Project VISION

Project VISION meets on the second Thursday of each month from noon to approximately 1:30pm. This past year we were without a Project VISION chair for quite some time but now have Co-Chairs Adam Sancic and Kiana McClure. Both of these individuals are professionals with tremendous talent and I look forward to working with them this year.

Project VISION has two main committees working at this time. The Health Committee, chaired by Jamie Bentley from Rutland Regional Medical Center and Community Policing, chaired by me and Pat Hunter. There are also several sub-committees. This past year I have asked the VISION partners to focus on prevention and intervention initiatives to reduce deaths from accidental overdose and to invest training time in prevention strategies, to include domestic/sexual violence prevention and suicide prevention. We are an abundant community filled with talented people. We recognized that providers in multiple professions are burning out. Kheya Ganguly provided services to Project VISION and we were able to host two separate trainings related to combating compassion fatigue.

Project VISION has some very exciting initiatives in the works. If you are interested in participating, please reach out to me at matthew.prouty@vermont.gov Project VISION has two core values. We agree to have a renewed focus on the positive and to collaborate for the greater good.

Community Response Team (CRT)

The Community Response Team is comprised of CRT SGT Jason Williams, Community Police Officer Emilio Rosario, Animal Control Officer Tim Jones, School Resource Officer Ernest LaGuardia, Crime & Data Analyst Nathan Thibodeau, Community Resource Specialists Kyle Dawson, William Gaiotti, and Julie Fitzgibbons.

For most of FY23 there was only one assigned CRS position. I worked in that position from August 2022 to January 2023. Kyle Dawson then transferred from dispatch to the CRS position. Since then we have added William Gaiotti and Julie Fitzgibbons.

The Community Resource Specialists are assigned non-criminal cases that require a response from the department but do not require a certified police officer. The Community Resource Specialist work with community partners in hopes that together we can improve our quality-of-life outcomes for our citizens. This is very challenging work. The CRS's are supervised by the Community Response Team Sergeant, Jason Williams.

Community Policing Officer Emilio Rosario is assigned to the Downtown Beat. He is responsible for parking enforcement in the downtown and is also assigned to support the state Treatment Court. SRO Ernest Laguardia is the School Resource Officer for all our city schools. ACO Timothy Jones is our Animal Control Officer tasked with enforcing city ordinance related to pets. Nathan Thibodeau is our Crime and Data Analyst and is responsible for collecting and analyzing department data for the Chief of Police.

The CRT collaborate with the Rutland County Turning Point Center and the Adult Substance Use Treatment Program with Community Care Network to assist citizens with accessing treatment or connecting with a recovery coach. This fiscal year the CRT also initiated a shower/laundry initiative with the support of the Housing Trust of Rutland County and the United Way to provide access to shower/laundry facilities to our homeless population. This initiative is helping the outreach division connect people to appropriate services and build relationships, both with citizens in need but also with service providers who have clients that could benefit from this program.

This has been a challenging year. I want to thank the citizens of the City of Rutland for supporting our outreach efforts.

We would like to thank the citizens of Rutland, Mayor, Board of Alderman and all the other city departments for their help and support throughout the year.

Engineering Division

The Engineering staff is involved with many day-to-day activities including the preparation of design plans, bids and specifications, issuance of water and sewer allocations, applications for design and construction grants, review of proposed plans for building permits and DRB applications, and the creation of seasonal construction plans and long-term infrastructure capital plans. At prescribed intervals, the department also performs inspections including landfill post-closure monitoring, combined sewer overflow (CSO) monitoring, annual city bridge and culvert inspections and various stormwater permit inspections and compliance activities. Assistance is provided upon request to many private sector projects within the City. Services often include the dissemination of City utility information to design consultants and property owners wishing to develop or redevelop properties.

The Engineering Division also provides engineering and technical support to each division within the Department of Public Works as well as to other departments within City government when requested.

The Engineering Division assumes the role of project management for all active DPW permitting, design and construction projects occurring within the City. An update for all active projects during this fiscal year are as follows:

2023 Bond Articles

Three DPW infrastructure bond Articles valued at a total of \$7.85M were placed on the ballot and approved by voters on March 7, 2023. The three Bond Articles were as follows:

Bond Article No. 1 - \$3.5M Public Highway Improvement Projects

(\$1M paving, \$1M sidewalks & \$1.5M structures)

These paving and sidewalk funds will allow the increased level of road rehabilitation performed over the last three years to continue. The additional structures funds will address an estimated shortfall so that the two remaining culverts from the 2019 Structures Bond (Grove St & Lincoln Ave) can be replaced.

Bond Article No. 2 - \$2.5M Water Distribution Main Improvement Project

These funds will be used to replace obsolete water mains. Water mains located below streets that have very poor surface conditions that require rehabilitation will be targeted. A Request For Proposals (RFP) was advertised on June 26, 2023, to design the water main replacement segments. Once proposals are received and reviewed, it is expected that the design contract will be executed in the fall.

Bond Article No. 3 - \$1.85M Pollution Control & Wastewater Improvement Projects

These funds shall be used to fill estimated shortfalls in the Moon Brook Pond Modification Project (\$750k) and the Meadow Street Sewer Separation project (\$1.1M).

2019 Bond Article No. 1 - \$7.4 Million Wastewater & CSO Improvement Projects

Northwest Neighborhood Sewer Separation Project - Phase 1A

All warranty issues including the spalling of several sidewalk segments located throughout the project were satisfactorily repaired by the general contractor.

Meadow Street Stormwater Separation Project

An Engineering Services Agreement was executed with Aldrich & Elliott on March 9, 2023, to design and provide bid documents for this project.

2019 Bond Article No. 2 - \$3.0 Million Culvert & Bridge Improvement Projects

Allen Street, Grove Street, Church Street, Park Street, Lincoln Avenue Culvert Replacement and Grove St Bridge #25 Rehabilitation

The design of the Allen Street Culvert Replacement project was completed by DuBois & King, the City's Consultant, and the project was put out to bid. The construction contract was awarded to Belden Construction on June 16, 2022. Due to several factors including material lead time delays, construction began on May 22, 2023. The project is expected to be completed in the fall of 2023.

The design of the Grove Street Culvert Replacement project was completed and put out to bid. The project was awarded to Daniels Construction on March 30, 2023. The structural design submittals of the precast arch components have not yet been approved by the engineer. Because of this unanticipated delay, installation of this new bridge structure scheduled for the summer of 2023 might need to be postponed until the 2024 construction season.

Once the Grove Street Culvert Replacement Project is complete, the only remaining structure scheduled to be replaced under this bond is the Lincoln Avenue Culvert at Tenney Brook.

VT Department of Environmental Conservation (VT DEC)

Progress continued to be made regarding VT DEC matters as detailed below:

Moon Brook Pond Modification Project

The City's Consultant, SLR Engineers, advanced the final design of the Moon Brook Pond Modification Project. Major milestones achieved include the ownership transfer of the Piedmont Pond property to the City. In addition, all the necessary temporary and permanent construction easements at this location were acquired. At Combination Pond, it was discovered that two additional easements were needed once the Division of Dam Safety established the physical limits of the dam. The project will be put out to bid once the acquisition of these easements and construction permits are completed, and final design work and bid documents are prepared. This is expected to take place in the fall of 2023.

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit

All necessary MS4 Application materials have previously been submitted to the State as required. VT DEC continued their work developing the City's Individual Permit. The City is expecting to receive the draft individual permit in the fall of 2023.

Phosphorus Control Plan

Fitzgerald Environmental Associates (FEA) and SLR Consulting completed their work preparing a Phosphorus Control Plan for the City. This work was made possible through a grant obtained from the Rutland Natural Resources Conservation District (RNRCD). The final report dated July 29, 2022, included project rankings and an implementation schedule, and was submitted to the Lake Champlain Basin Program.

2021 VTrans Small Scale Bicycle-Pedestrian Grant

The City received a \$75k grant to be used near Northwest Elementary School to make sidewalk safety improvements. This project was completed in the summer of 2023. Under this project, 1,340 lf of deteriorated sidewalk was replaced along Pierpoint Avenue and Crescent Street. In addition, the paved-over road shoulders were removed and replaced with curbed green belts to provide a safe buffer for pedestrians.

CSO Long Term Control Plan (LTCP)

Weston and Sampson Engineers completed the Long Term Control Plan, and the final report was submitted to VT DEC in July 2022. Twenty-two projects were identified in the LTCP. The total construction cost for all these projects was estimated at approximately \$140 million dollars. The Tentative Implementation Schedule (5-Year Plan) was comprised of eight separate projects. This plan was presented to and approved by the Board of Aldermen and was used as the basis of a new 1272 Order issued by DEC to the City.

Work began on the following projects that were part of the 5-Year Implementation Schedule.

CSO Check Valve Project

An Engineering Services Agreement was executed with Weston & Sampson on June 1, 2023 to design the check valves to be installed at the (CSO 001) Calvary Cemetery and (CSO 002) Home Plate outfalls. These check valves will eliminate backflow into the City's collection system when the creek levels rise above the inlet elevations of the overflow discharge pipes.

Connor Park Storage Project

An Engineering Services Agreement was executed with Aldrich & Elliott on March 9, 2023 to design this project. The conceptual design includes a one-million-gallon storage tank that will temporarily hold combined sewage during high intensity storm events which currently overflows into East Creek. After the storm subsides, this volume would then be pumped to the wastewater plant for treatment.

Urban and Community Forest Grant

The Engineering Department applied for a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Forest Service, Urban and Community Forestry Grant. One billion dollars of federal funding through the Inflation Reduction Act, was made available to qualified applicants throughout the country for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, and expanding tree canopy in urban settings, and to encourage long-term urban forest planning and management

The Engineering Department’s application specifically requested \$7.7M of funding to support the planting of trees throughout downtown, along both the Moon and Mussey Brook corridors, and within specific neighborhoods within the city’s limits that are considered as “disadvantaged”. Grants awards are expected to be presented in September 2023.

Road Reconstruction and Paving Projects

The Engineering Division assumes the role of project management for all road reconstruction and paving projects. Certain segments of the following streets were rehabilitated during the past construction season: *Jackson Avenue, Park Street, Killington Terrace, Westview Avenue, Giorgetti Boulevard, Grandview Terrace, South Street, Meadow Street, Saint Joseph Avenue, Forest Street, Cherry Street, Howe Street, Union Street, Chaffee Avenue, Greens Hill Lane, Smith Street, Summer Street, Maple Street, Crescent Street, Bellevue Avenue, Wendy Lane, & Northeast Drive.*

Business Office

The Business Office staff includes:

This staff provides years of knowledge and experience with the highest level of customer service in responding to all requested Department of Public Works (DPW) related inquiries. Meter reading and utility billing is reviewed and processed quarterly. Meter installations/replacements, reading investigations, permit processing and all other general requests are scheduled daily.

The Watersmart Customer Portal has proven to be a vital tool for Business Office staff and our customers in reviewing accounts, “real-time use” and any unusual use alerts. Customer registrations totaled 53% by the end of fiscal year 2023.

Customers can register on this portal by visiting rutlandvt.watersmart.com using their utility billing account number. They can then view their account balance, billing history, use history and use analysis with recommended actions based on that analysis. They can enroll in unusual use alerts via email, voicemail or text message. During this fiscal year, over 5,000 customers were sent unusual use alerts. Customers can also manage paperless billing enrollment, pay their bill on-line, and contact this office through email. They can watch instructional videos regarding looking for leaks, installing high efficiency devices, and tips on using water more efficiently.

In fiscal year 2023, the City implemented a program called GovPilot. Customers can access this program through the City's website at www.rutlandcity.org, "Permit Applications & Forms". Here they can conveniently apply and make payment for DPW related permits. Customers are encouraged to access the City's website for up-to-date information and valuable resources.

Forestry Division

Woodlands and Timber Management

Forested lands within the City's property holdings in Mendon are managed for multiple uses. Providing a reliable supply of clean water to the Water Treatment plant is the highest priority. This is accomplished by maintaining a healthy, productive forest, restricting motorized public access and minimizing soil disturbances from timber management activities.

Three additional stands of red pine timber containing 210,820 board feet were marked and put out for competitive bidding in June of 2021. The bids were required as lump sum bids and the highest bidder was awarded. Norm Brown Logging of Benson, Vermont was highest bidder at \$105 per thousand board feet. This sale has been completed during the fiscal year, marking the end of the red pine harvests within our watershed properties. Also, within this fiscal year 55,000 feet of mixed hardwood was harvested on 15 acres. The harvest was awarded to highest bidder Lathrop Forest Products of Bristol Vermont for \$15,201.96. The harvest area was affected by ice damage in the past 10 years, and all mature/damaged timber was removed to allow the residual stand to grow into a healthy, well stocked site. Revenues generated by these timber sales are deposited in the Water Fund and are used to defray expenses in managing and maintaining the City's watershed lands and the City's water supply system.

Future sales of timber will now focus on hardwood stands containing mature, valuable white ash trees in efforts to minimize economic loss due to the Emerald Ash borer. Urban Forest Management Managing Rutland's shade trees is a continual process that involves removing dead or dying trees, maintenance through structural pruning and replanting areas for the future.

During the fiscal year, 66 trees were removed. An additional 443 trees were pruned to improve form, aesthetics and public safety. A total of 16 supplemental support cables were installed, along with 3 brace rods to support structurally weak branch unions. Twenty-Seven stumps were ground and sites restored. One hundred sixty-six trees were planted during the fiscal year. Planting occurs both in the spring and fall within the streets right of ways.

The Forestry Division also continued to maintain countless miles of roadside and sidewalks from overhanging trees and brush to improve both pedestrian and vehicular travel as well as to promote better visibility of intersections and signs.

Rutland City earned its 31st anniversary as a Tree City, USA, and continues to be Vermont's longest running community awarded this honor. Our local Arbor Day took place at Stafford Technical Center with the preschool students. Sincerest thanks go out to all who have helped promote our community's trees.

City Forester Tim Smith continues to serve on the state of Vermont Urban and Community Forestry Council as well as the Stafford Technical Center's Natural Resource Program Advisory Council.

Any and all concerns of both private and public trees are welcome for review by our division. These concerns can be reported through calling public works or on the City's website through GovPilot, and the foresters will perform site visits.

Streets Division

The Street Department is responsible for street and sidewalk maintenance. This includes, but is not limited to, street sweeping, mowing, pothole/utility trench repair and snow removal. We also install, repair, and service all parking meters in Rutland's downtown area, along with repair, maintenance and replacement of all required street signs and poles.

The Street Department has spent a significant amount of time working with specialized contractors, and other Public Work Divisions, on the five million dollar paving and sidewalk bond that was approved by voters in 2020. The Street Department was involved with many facets of this project which included the removal of all curbs in preparation for a new concrete curbing, removal of compromised concrete sidewalks and establishing new greenbelts.

In addition to the removal and replacement of curbing and sidewalks around the city, multiple streets were repaved and reconstructed. The Streets Department worked with multiple contractors to repave the following streets: Jackson Ave., Howe St., Forest St., Chaffee St., Union St., Cherry St., South St., St. Josephs Ave., Meadow St., Green Hills Ln., Smith St., Crescent St., Bellevue Ave., Giorgetti Blvd., and Westview Ave.

During the 2022-2023 paving season the street department also a total reconstruction of Maple St., Park St., and Summer St. The road reconstruction projects consisted of the removal of 3-feet of unsuitable clay soil and the installation of a structural stone subbase We also began the reconstruction of Robbins St., which is set to be concluded during the 2024 paving season.

A total of 48 new ADA compliant ramps were installed at all newly paved crossings, along with the replacement of concrete sidewalks in all locations. The Street Department was responsible for removing and installing 1,870 feet of sidewalk on Maple Street, 813 feet of sidewalk on Summer Street, 110 feet of sidewalk at the City of Rutland’s Historical Society and 392 feet of sidewalk on Curtis Ave. The Street Department also replaced 90 feet of sidewalk on Pier Point Ave. in order to make sidewalk ADA compliant. Multiple locations of sidewalk on Crescent Street were removed and replaced.

Teaming up with Downtown Partnership and Recreation Department, the Street Department assisted in the installation of the Center Street parklets, and the colorful pavement markings associated with them.

In addition to repairing ditches from water and sewer repairs, paving, driveway aprons and potholes, over 1,100 tons of hot mix (asphalt) was used. A total of 118 tons of cold patch was used during the winter months as a temporary repair.

During the winter operations the division responded to several storm events, which resulted in the plowing and salting of city streets. The application of approximately 2,800 tons of treated salt was applied to the city streets and sidewalks.

Water Treatment Division

The City of Rutland’s Slow Sand Water Filtration Facility treated a total of 745,482,507 gallons of water during the last fiscal year. The chemicals used during the process were 1,500 gallons of fluoride, 1,500 gallons of zinc orthophosphate, and 12,775 gallons of sodium hypochlorite.

The Water Treatment Division has had some success combatting the Eurasian milfoil that has taken root in the reservoir. There are currently about 250 milfoil mats in the reservoir to try to stop the spread of new plants. Also, The City purchased a DASH (diver assisted suction harvester) boat to aid in the constant removal of milfoil in our reservoir. This has and will continue to be a major concern until we are able to rid the reservoir of this invasive weed for good.

In May 2023 Carbon Filtration Systems Removed twelve inches of old filter sand, and replaced it with new clean sand in Filter #3.

Since the second quarter of 2012, the City has been in compliance with federal haloacetic acid regulations. We are continuing to address the issues that affect our water quality in order to maintain this compliance.

We would like to thank Scott Taggart for his 35 years of service with the City of Rutland, and his twelve years as the Water treatment manager. We wish you well in your retirement. We appreciate the help from the other DPW Divisions throughout the year.

Water Distribution Division

The Water Distribution Division is responsible for the installation and maintenance of all water mains in Rutland City and maintenance of the water system for Rutland Town by contract.

The division is also responsible for the installation, service, repairs and flushing of approximately 650 fire hydrants in the City and Rutland Town twice a year.

We repaired 23 water main leaks and/or water main breaks this past year.

We installed 12 new iHydrant leak detectors which monitor pressure on a 24 hour basis giving us real time data and helping locate a water main break in a more timely manner. With these new iHydrants we now have a total of thirty two iHydrants located throughout the water distribution system.

We installed 14 New Fire Hydrants, 9 New valves, 5 new water taps, and repaired 19 Curb Boxes.

The Division also assists other departments as needed.

Wastewater Treatment Division

The Wastewater Treatment Facility is a 24/7/365 operation with operators working to treat wastewater and stormwater. This involves constant maintenance, repairs, and upgrades to equipment, buildings, and grounds.

In Fiscal Year 2023 we treated 1.62 billion gallons of combined wastewater and stormwater. The operators' professionalism and dedication to their jobs is impressive and everyone should be proud of their efforts and commitment.

Below is a list of major accomplishments for the WWTF from FY 2023:

1. Replaced 1,425 Feet of force Main Pipe from River Street Pump Station to the Waste Water Treatment Plant. We used 20" DR 11 High Density polyethylene pipe.
2. Cleaned out a 203,000 gallon digester at treatment plant.
3. Installed a new Variable Frequency Drive at River Street Pump Station.
4. Repaired aging/ Rusted flanges and bolts on suction side of pumps at River Street Station.
5. Removed aging Waste Gas Burner at Treatment Plant and installed a new burner.
6. Every Digester cover now has new flame arrestors.
7. Upgraded some of the outside lighting to more efficient and working on doing more.
8. General Maintenance throughout plant.
9. Did a lot of painting at River Street Pump Station to the piping inside to make them last as long as we can.

RUTLAND RECREATION AND PARKS DEPARTMENT

RECREATION PROGRAMS

Fall Youth Programs include K-8th grade football, K-6th grade soccer, Field Hockey, Rutland Youth Theatre, and Archery. This year we added “in-house” leagues for K-2nd grade which will include game play.

Winter Youth Programs include K-6th basketball and K-6th grade wrestling which all take place at the RRCC. Giorgetti Complex will turn over to the Ice Arena to accommodate Skating lessons, RAHA, Open Skate, Stick and Puck, and Curling. Adult opportunities also include Adult Basketball and Pickleball at the RRCC

Spring Sports include indoor soccer at Giorgetti Complex and Indoor Soccer league for adults.

The summer of 2023, specifically camps and pool attendance, was a full filled year. We offer 9 weeks of full day summer camps at four locations, Rotary Park, RRCC, Giorgetti Complex, and White Memorial Park Pool. This summer we had over 125 (25% increase) kids daily and served over 500 kids total. We also were able to successfully offer specialty camps: Football, Golf, Carnival camp, Theatre Camps, Basketball, Tennis, Skateboarding, and others.

The Summer Concerts Series was a success with only one cancellation due to weather.

National Night Out was moved to Meadow Street Complex which as proven to be a great move and many community members enjoying a free event.

We also experienced an influx in park and facility rentals from non-profit organizations, community members, and schools.

PARKS AND FACILITIES

Main Street Park has been identified as one of the projects to be funded by ARPA funds. The Main Street Park Project would include a gazebo, new walking path, and structure with bathroom and storage. Phase I to begin in Fall 2023

Pine Hill Park received the ERSA grant for improvements to the trail network. All work was completed in August 2023

Godnick Adult Center received the ERSA grant for a ADA compliant walking path in the courtyard behind the center. Work on this project will begin in Spring of 2024

Justin Thomas Memorial Park enhancements, which included a new fence, new playsructure, Walking path with bricks purchased by Community Members. Opening of the park was in August 2023. In the past year, the RRCC has undergone maintenance improvements with lighting throughout the entire building. An increase in rentals-including, but not limited to Business Expos, Sporting events, School Events, and Craft Fairs.

Courcelle Building continues to be used by Rutland Youth Theatre in the evenings and weekends while also available to the public for meetings or trainings. The Courcelle building offices are rented to Community Care Network, RSVP.

Godnick Adult Center continues to offer a variety of programs and events. Monthly newsletter is published the beginning of every month and available on the website. Included, but not limited to: Bus trips, OSHA seminars, strength training, Yoga, Foot clinics, lunches, Cake Decorating classes, Grieving groups, bridge, and many other events and activities.

The RRCC is a space for overall health and wellness for all ages and has been an asset to the Rutland Community.

ANNUAL REPORT RUTLAND FREE LIBRARY

Rutland Free Library was a busy place in Fiscal Year 2023, with an increase in circulation of almost 11 percent from the previous year. Library users checked out 125,000 items this year, including print books and magazines, audio books on CD, DVDs, downloadable audio and e-books, and streaming video and music.

Demand for online borrowing continues to blossom, increasing to 22,000 items from less than 9,000 in just five years, with double-digit growth each year. This is made possible because of the generosity of Nella Grimm Fox, whose bequest pays for all our materials. Most libraries are struggling to meet the demand for e-books and audiobooks, where publishers impose penalties on library purchases far exceeding the list price, and arbitrarily withdraw titles from our collections. Without the Fox Fund, which is restricted to spending on materials and programs, Rutland Free would also be in dire straits.

Also taking advantage of the Fox Fund, the library has greatly increased its programming, especially children's programs. In addition to a full schedule of events in the building, Children's Librarian Amanda Münch has been visiting city school Tapestry programs on a regular basis.

Thanks to a generous donation from the estate of Roger Pike, we are digitizing our local genealogy collection, which should be available online by the time this report is published. The largest part of that collection is hand-written family trees done by local genealogist Marvel Swan some decades ago.

The library also received welcome news on the building front. The state Department of Libraries announced \$16.2 million to be available in competitive grants for capital improvements statewide. Although the deadline has been pushed back, Rutland Free is applying and hopes to receive a substantial grant to enable a long-overdue renovation of the city-owned building at 10 Court St.

We continue to partner with a wide variety of organizations, including The Mint, Chaffee Art Center, Wonderfeet Kids Museum, Rutland County Parent Child Center, Partners for Prevention, Rutland City Public Schools, Rutland Homeless Prevention Center, VINS, Rutland South Rotary, Rutland Garden Club, Vermont Humanities, and a huge number of volunteers.

Of particular note is the hard work done by The Friends of Rutland Free Library, whose ongoing book sales generated over \$20,000 in direct support to the library last year, and to Dolly Parton Imagination Library, whose Rutland Free Library chapter mails books free of charge to children from birth until their fifth birthday.

RUTLAND REDEVELOPEMENT AUTHORITY

To the Mayor, Board of Aldermen and Citizens of Rutland City:

The Rutland Redevelopment Authority is pleased to submit the annual report for fiscal year 2023.

Formed by Charter in 1989 the Rutland Redevelopment Authority (RRA) has historically served as Rutland City’s community and economic development entity. Under the Charter the RRA was established to reduce the property tax burden on residential homeowners, redevelop dilapidated and blighted structures, revitalize the commercial and industrial sectors of the economy, and promote economic opportunity for all citizens.

The RRA consists of two staff, an Executive Director and Director of Grants and Outreach. It is overseen by a nine member Board of Commissioners nominated by the Mayor and approved by the Board of Aldermen.

In conjunction with the Charter, the RRA also operates under an agreement for services with the City to provide assistance in the following areas. 1) Grant Administration: The RRA will serve as the primary grant administrative agent for the City 2) Grand List and Job Development: The RRA will work to increase or improve the quality of the grand list and increase jobs. 3) Blighted Property: The RRA will focus significant effort and resources to redevelop vacant and dilapidated structures. 4) Downtown Designation: The RRA will ensure that the City maintains its State granted designation. 5) Planning: The RRA will perform planning duties in coordination with other City entities and represent the City and its interests in related planning initiatives.

The RRA is the taxing authority for the Special Benefits District, and uses those funds to support both the grants and projects specific to Rutland’s Downtown, as well as, the Downtown Rutland Partnership’s annual workplan and budget.

Grant Administration: As illustrated in the chart below the RRA has been active in applying for new grants and administering existing grants for various City projects and initiatives. The RRA will continue to seek both State and Federal grant funding sources to offset and leverage local investment in economic and community development initiatives and infrastructure improvements.

Grand List and Job Development: Specific to economic development the RRA’s role is to provide new or existing businesses with professional and confidential assistance related to site selection, financing, job creation incentives, workforce training, and all other factors related to their decision to invest, or to continue to re-invest, in Rutland City.

In recent years the RRA has developed, and the City has adopted, a number of innovative business incentive programs including property tax stabilization, water/wastewater rate reduction discounts, and a Business Incentive Assistance Program (BIAP). In FY ‘23 a number of businesses have taken advantage of these opportunities.

During FY'23 the RRA continued to focus on enhancing pedestrian safety and economic vitality in the downtown. The Downtown Pedestrian Wayfinding Signage project was finalized with the design and installation of 15 wayfinding signs throughout the Downtown and a larger sign in Depot Park. This project was completed within the grant deadline and under budget. Depot Park also benefitted from a collaboration with Come Alive Outside to install amenities in the park that were vetted by the community.

In addition to the signage, and as a way to continue to promote the City as a destination for economic growth, the RRA is taking part in the revitalization of the train station area. As part of the steering committee, the RRA will assist in hiring the consultant tasked with a design to make the area more pedestrian friendly and safe for bicyclists.

The City received a Placemaking Grant through CORI and the RRA has taken a role on the advisory committee to work with Lisa Glover, the consultant, to create a placemaking plan that would create an environment that encourages economic growth.

Housing Initiatives and Blighted Properties: The RRA continues to promote tools available to developers interested in investment of the City's blighted properties. Those programs include review and recommendation of City Owned Properties and the Vacant/Blighted Residential Tax Stabilization program. The latter program allows eligible applicants to purchase and rehabilitate a vacant and blighted residential housing unit and receive preferential tax treatment on the value of the improvements.

As a member of the Housing Ad Hoc Committee, the RRA has been actively working to create housing opportunities in Rutland by supporting the City's grant applications in conjunction with housing entities and developers, as well as supporting the creation or revision of revolving loan programs that encourage rental housing.

Downtown Designation: The State's downtown designation makes Rutland City and property owners eligible for additional state and federal funding opportunities. The RRA, together with the Downtown Rutland Partnership, worked to apply, on behalf of the City, for renewal of the designation by the State's Downtown Board. The renewal application was submitted in June and the Downtown Board plans to take a tour of Rutland in September.

Planning: The RRA continues to work with the Planning and Zoning Administrator, DPW and the RPC, to facilitate several exciting planning initiatives within the City. They include plans for the Center Street redesign and implementation, Zoning Bylaws Update and the development of a Tax Increment Financing District (TIF) which could attract future private sector development and investment in Rutland.

Additionally, the RRA kicked off its Strategic Planning process and hired Community Roots LLC as the consultant to help facilitate the plan.

Finally, the RRA found FY23 to be a transformative year and hired Ed Bove as its Executive Director to take us into the future. We wish to express our gratitude for the support received from the Mayor, Board of Aldermen, all City Hall employees, RRA Board, friends and family during this year of growth.

To the Citizens of Rutland City:


While Vermont schools and students continue to move beyond the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, Rutland City Public Schools address the challenges of today and anticipate the future's opportunities for growth.

With the support of our entire community and through the assistance of federal funding, our students are growing stronger due to the recovery process that began in 2021. The school district focused its plan on supporting all students, and most notably helping our most vulnerable children, providing targeted learning opportunities, tutoring, smaller group instruction, and support for social-emotional challenges. Additionally, where allowed by federal grants, the school district wisely invested in infrastructure improvements that greatly improve the environment and well-being in our buildings. These renovations include water drainage improvements, asbestos removal, new flooring in most of our buildings, increased classroom space, improved transportation options, and a large-scale HVAC project that will modernize our systems and improve air quality. These federal funds lessen the impact on the local tax rate in the future as we address facilities projects that we would otherwise have to solve on our own. We expect that we will have invested between \$5 million to \$6 million in federal money by 2024 in infrastructure, avoiding adding the cost of these renovations to the local tax rate.

All of that work concerns the current state of our school communities. As well, we look toward the future. In the school year 2022-2023, our staff, students, parents, and community members formed our collective vision for our students, our Portrait of a Graduate. Taking into account the societal and economic expectations for young adults as they graduate from our schools, our school district made a commitment to align our instruction and curriculum to seven important competencies that enable our students to navigate the world as adults successfully.

As of this writing in September 2023, the next step of the school district is the development of a strategic plan – our path to arrive at the vision of the Portrait of a Graduate. That work during the school year 2023-2024 will again include the contributions of all of our school community members. When complete, we will have a collective commitment to ensure that all of our students achieve our district vision.

The challenges of today’s society demand that more than ever, schools are front and center in fostering the growth and development of our young people. Our pledge always at Rutland City Public Schools is *Every Student, Every Day*. Our staff members devote their talents and skills toward supporting our community’s children and families. Our goal, always at a favorable cost, is to serve the community in reaching the values of our vision statement: *RCPS cultivates a passionate, diverse, and resilient community of critical thinkers who learn with purpose, create innovative and responsible solutions, and lead lives of integrity.*

Fiscal Year 2023 Annual Report

Mary A. Markowski, City Treasurer and Delinquent Tax Collector

To The Honorable Board of Aldermen, Mayor and the Citizens of Rutland City:

I am pleased to report that the financial condition of the City of Rutland is sound for the year ended June 30, 2023. The audit for FY23 is scheduled to begin in November and will be completed on a timely basis to meet state and federal compliance requirements. Prior year Audited financial statements are available on the city website—www.rutlandcity.org under City Departments/Treasurer’s Office/financial reports. Financial information included in this report is unaudited.

At the end of fiscal year 2023 the amount of the City’s unassigned fund balance in the General Fund was approximately \$3 million. At the setting of the tax rate for fiscal year 2024 the Board approved using excess fund balance of \$460,000 to fund three new positions at City Hall and applied \$497,000 to offset the municipal tax rate. The remaining unassigned fund balance is held in the General Fund and provides the reserve necessary for ongoing City operations. The Board approved a policy in 2010 which requires the City maintain 10-15% of annual revenues as a reserve for operating funds. This policy has served the City well and provides for uninterrupted government services and eliminates the need for short-term borrowing.

Unfunded liabilities associated with the City’s pension plans for municipal employees continue to be a significant financial issue for the City. In July 2016 the Board of Aldermen committed to a long-term payment plan to complete the address the municipal portion of the pension liability. In 2019, the Board furthered its commitment to address the unfunded pension liability by increasing the amount to be applied to the pension by 1.5% annually. These were important decisions by the Board and the appropriation is included in the annual city budget. As of January 31, 2023, the municipal pension obligation is over \$21 million. The pension liability impacts the City’s audited financial statements in the same way that a debt obligation does. In FY24, the city plans to utilize a portion of the 1% local option tax revenue to allocate additional funds to the unfunded pension liability.

While the General Fund and Water fund are stable, the Sewer, Parking and Transit Funds continue to operate at a cash deficit and negatively impact the General Fund. The negative cash position in the Sewer Fund reflects project expenses that are pending reimbursements, as well as increased costs of operations. The Parking and Transit funds continue to operate with negative results. The BOA approved budget changes that will help offset the expenses in the parking fund and additional receipts from the state offset the transit maintenance expenses.

Property Taxes are billed annually with quarterly installments due in August, November, February, and May. The Board of Alderman is responsible for setting the tax rate annually, during the first 20 days of July. The municipal tax rate increased from 1.7794 in FY23 to 1.8860 in FY24. Prior year rates are outlined below:

The Treasurer’s office works to ensure that the financial resources of the City of Rutland are managed and accounted for in an effective and efficient manner. In the Treasurer’s office, we strive to provide financial information in a timely, accurate and meaningful format and continually work toward financial and operational improvements while providing professional service.

The daily duties in the office include collecting payments for taxes and water/sewer accounts, processing accounts receivable, accounts payable, and payroll. Property tax and water/sewer billing and collection continue to be a major task and often payment agreements can be worked out to assist taxpayers who fall behind.

The Treasurer's Office continued to place a high priority on delinquent tax and utility collection in FY 2023 and reduced the delinquent tax debt in both taxes and water & sewer over the prior year. Collection efforts include entering into payment agreements, water/sewer shut offs and property tax sales. The Treasurer's office will continue to focus on collection efforts in FY 2024.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the staff of the Treasurer's Office for their hard work and continued service to the taxpayers and residents of the City.

It is a privilege to serve as City Treasurer and I would like to thank the citizens of Rutland for your support.


