

ABOUT OUR TOWN OFFICES

Serving in local office is a great way to give something back to your community. Your Town is always looking for those who wish to take part in their local government and who care to make a difference in their community. **We currently have the following vacant positions: *Two Auditors, 2^d Constable, Three Listers, Zoning and Planning and Cemetery Commission.*** If you are interested in any of these positions please contact any Woodford Town Officer.

MODERATOR (elected, 1- year term) -- Conducts the Town's meeting and other meetings upon request of services, using the "Robert's Rule" of conduct. 17VSA 2646(1)

TOWN CLERK (elected, 3-year term) -- Records, preserves and certifies the public records of the town, issues dog, marriage, and civil union licenses. Runs the local elections, serves as a Board of Civil Authority, and files tax abatement requests. Should be a good ambassador for the town. 17 VSA 2646(2)

TREASURER (elected, 3-year term) -- Is a Trustee of Public Funds. Keeps the Town's financial accounts, invests money, keeps a record of the taxes paid and pays orders drawn on by the officials. Should be very precise, detail oriented and good at math and communication. 17 VSA 2646(3)

SELECT BOARD MEMBERS (elected, 3-year term) -- General supervision and control over town, enacts ordinances, regulations and policies for town, oversees town property and personnel, prepares, presents and manages budget, oversees roads, including laying out, discontinuing and reclassifying roads. Sits as local board of health, liquor control commission. Should know the town well, be able to understand all sides of complex issues. 17 VSA 2646(4); 17 VSA 2649

TRUSTEE OF PUBLIC FUNDS (3-year term) Trustees include the three Select Board Members and the Treasurer. 17 VSA 2646(12); 24 VSA 2431 et seq.

GRAND JUROR (appointed, 1 year term) - Helps to prosecute criminal offenses that occur in the town by giving information to state and local law enforcement. 14 VSA 2646(10). This position was repealed as an elected position July 1, 2018 (H829) 24VSA 871.

TOWN AGENT (Repealed July 1, 2020 (H143) Act 84.

LISTERS (elected, 3-year term) -- Appraise property within the town for the purpose of property tax assessment. Should be able to conduct themselves in a polite, yet firm and fair manner. 17 VSA 2646(5)

DELINQUENT TAX COLLECTOR (elected, 3-year term) -- Collects delinquent taxes for the town. Should be good with numbers and also able to work with people who are in difficult circumstances. 17 VSA 2651(d)

CONSTABLES (elected, 1 year term) -- Confronts animal control issues through a civil process. Should be good at de-escalating and resolving conflicts. 17 VSA 2646 (7)

AUDITORS (elected, 3-year term) -- Review and audit all town accounts and prepare the annual town report. Responsible for the proper financial accountability of the Town by ensuring that an annual audit is done. Should be very detailed oriented through "internal controls". 17 VSA 2649

SCHOOL DIRECTORS (elected, 3-year term) - Develops educational policies, develops and follows school mission, responsible for keeping school property & equipment in good repair, reports to the public finances, conditions and needs of the school, determines budgets and tax levels, may serve as arbiter in disciplinary actions brought to the board. 16 VSA 563

MAUHS REPRESENTATIVE (elected, 3-year term) -Responsible for the same as school director. Consider the operations of MAUHS and MAUMS in the best interests of all sending districts.

CEMETERY COMMISSION (appointed, 3-year term) -- A board of five members. Maintains the mowing, cleaning, and Veterans graves. Records sales of lot purchases and locations of lots. 18 VSA 5373

REGIONAL PLANNING-- Independent. Two-member board. Works with the Bennington Regional Planning Commission.

HEALTH OFFICER-- Select Board Members. Enforces the rules and regulations for the prevention of public health hazards. 18 VSA 601

ZONING ADMINISTRATOR (appointed, 3-year term or longer) -- Receives and files sewer, water, and building/construction permits. Follows up on the progress of permits issued and records them for the lister's information. Also "warns" the permitting process, if necessary. 24 VSA. 4448

ZONING AND PLANNING-- (appointed, 1 year or longer) Five-member board. Prepares a municipal plan, making recommendations on matters of land development, conservation, preservation, and participating in a regional planning program. Makes site plan and subdivision permit decisions. Should have a good working knowledge of all aspects of the town and be able to listen to many sides of an issue. 24 VSA 4460

JUSTICES (elected, 2-year terms) -- Five-member board. Performs weddings and other pertinent duties for the town, such as notary requests, election officials at town elections by Australian ballot and statewide elections. They are Board of Civil Authority and Board of Abatement members. 17 VSA 2103(10)

Even with this pandemic, Town officials remained available to continue town business necessary for Woodford's taxpayers. At times, the office was closed due to mandates from the Governor, however, someone was always available during regular hours to address questions or concerns and handle any records requests. The year was a very stressful one and many times people had to choose between seeing family and being safe, particularly through the holidays. Hopefully everyone is surviving these unprecedented times and remain happy, healthy and safe. We can now put 2020 behind us and move forward to a healthy, happy and prosperous 2021.

This year we saw the departure of Mike and Betty Charette who moved back to Maine. Both Betty and Mike held positions in town government and willingly donated their time for the good of the townspeople. They will both certainly be missed but we wish them all the best in their new home and town. On behalf of the Town we would like to thank them both for their years of public service, dedication and knowledge.

When a town as small as ours that does not have a big staff, maintenance crew or a budget to fix things, volunteers are very important. There are so many things that need to be done that is not "someone's job" yet are done because of dedicated residents. Dick Frantz has volunteered to do so many jobs within the building without hesitation or being asked. Joseph Rutkowski has also donated his time to different jobs needing attention. The generosity of their time and skills are greatly appreciated and never taken for granted. Our Town Officials step up to do whatever is needed, many times while they are at their regular jobs. They answer their phones whenever needed and try to resolve whatever problems or questions that have arisen. We are very appreciative to these people for their service and dedication to the Town of Woodford.

ELECTION INFORMATION

Last year we had three elections. Due to Covid-19, election law revisions were made with the intent of protecting everyone's health. March and August's elections were held with normal procedures, however, the State decided to mail all registered active voters an absentee ballot for the presidential election. This was a temporary change from the law that requires voters to request an absentee ballot and verify where the ballot is being mailed. Woodford had a record turnout for this election with many voters choosing to vote in person. Election officials were very conscientious about following Covid protocols and the State's safety guidelines for masks, 6 ft. distance and sanitizing in order to provide the "vote in person" option a safe choice. We will continue do this for the Town meeting and Town elections. Absentee ballots are available upon request as always. If you are not a registered voter but would like to be, voter registration is available on any election day while the polls are open, through automatic voter registration at the motor vehicle office (the motor vehicle dept. automatically registers you to vote in the Town you live when you renew your license unless you specify otherwise), online at <http://olvr.sec.state.vt.us> and during the Town Clerk's Office hours.

Election Information:

- **Absentee Ballots:** Voters may vote absentee/early ballot in many different ways:
 - **Vote in Office-** Voters may fill out a request and vote in person at the Clerk's office, complete and sign the certificate and return the ballots without leaving the Clerk's office. This can be done during all regular business hours before the closing of the Town Clerk's office and on the day before each election.
 - **Take from Office-** Voters may fill out a request and, **only the voter**, may take the ballot from the Clerk's office. The ballot can be returned by anyone as long as it is in the certificate envelope.
 - **Mail-** Voters can request absentee ballots through the My Voter page, email or phone call. The ballot will be mailed to you and must be returned to the clerk before the close of polls on Election Day.
 - **Electronic-** Ballots can be electronically delivered to overseas or military voters and new this year, it also includes ill, injured or disabled voters for State elections. This process can only be done through My Voter Page. This allows voters with a disability to use the online accessible ballot marking device from home during the early voting period. Once the request is approved by the Clerk the system will send an email to the voter that night with instructions on how to access the ballot. Local ballots are sent through the Town Clerk's office with specific instructions. All electronic ballots must be returned by mail.

▪ **Home Delivery**- Pairs of Justices of the Peace may deliver absentee ballots to voters who are ill or voters with disabilities. The request must be made by the close of the Town Clerk's office the day preceding the election. Once the JP's have reached an absentee voter, the JP's must work as a pair to present the ballots and envelope to the voter, who may then vote in private or in the presence of both JP's.

The law allows a voter to make a single request for absentee/early ballots for all ballot elections scheduled in a given year (including Town/School votes, State primaries and general election) as long as the "mail to" address is the same for all elections. Please note that this single request must be made annually.

Any voter, family member, health care provider or authorized person can request an absentee ballot in Vermont without any reason. Voters who want to vote by absentee ballot may apply to the Clerk before the closing of the Town Clerk's office on the day before the election. Only a voter, family member (spouse, child, brother, sister, parent, spouse's parent, grandparent or spouse's grandparent), or health care provider may request a ballot for another person by phone. All requested ballots for any person other than the voter themselves will be mailed to the voter. An application for an early voter absentee ballot may only be valid for any elections within the same calendar year.

● **My Voter Page**, launched in 2016, is the State of VT's newest election management platform. By using My Voter Page, a registered voter can check voter registration status, view information on upcoming elections, poll location and hours, view a sample ballot, request and track an absentee ballot, view registration information on file with the Town office, challenge letter response and take the oath. To use this system registered voters can log in at: <http://mvp.sec.state.vt.us>.

● **The Accessible Voting System** is available for all State and Federal elections. It was introduced and used for the first time in 2018. The system was designed for those voters who may be blind or have any other disability but this voting option is available for any voter who may be interested in using it. It's a very simple system to use so if interested just ask any election official at the polls.

UNCLAIMED PROPERTY: Included in the Town report is a list of those people who currently live in Woodford or did at one time and has unclaimed property in 2020, usually money. If you have lived in more than one Vermont town then be sure you check those also. You can check at www.missingmoney.com for the most current listing. The process to claim your property is very simple and worth checking into.

DOG LICENSE: April 1, 2021 is the deadline to register your dog. Any dog that is more than six (6) months old must be registered and licensed annually on or before this date. Proof of sterilization and rabies certificate must be provided at the time of licensing if not already on file. The fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$9.00 (\$11.00 after April 1st) and \$13.00 for unneutered or unspayed dog (\$17.00 after April 1st).

▪ Rabies clinics are available at Tractor Supply in Bennington on 1/28/21, 2/25/21, 3/25/21, 4/22/21 from 5 to 7pm.

TAX HELP: You may be eligible for free tax help through the IRS, AARP or MyFreeTaxes.com. To learn where to find tax help visit tax.vermont.gov/free-prep. Tax forms and instructions are available online at tax.vermont.gov, call 855-297-5600 or email tax.formsrequest@vermont.gov.

HOMESTEAD DECLARATIONS: Homestead declarations need to be submitted by April 15th, 2021 in order to qualify for the resident education tax rate. By submitting this form on time you will receive an accurate tax bill and avoid any late penalties or fees. Filing for an extension for your income tax does not include the homestead declaration.

GREEN MOUNTAIN PASSPORTS: Green Mountain passports are available at the Town Office for \$2.00. This entitles you to free admission to Vermont State Parks (including Woodford State Park), Vermont Historic Sites and events which are fully State sponsored. To be eligible you must be a legal resident of Vermont and Woodford and be either 62 years of age or older or a veteran of the uniformed services.

APPRAISAL: New England Municipal Resource Center (NEMRC) and the Woodford Town Listers have completed the Town wide reappraisal. This was a major project entailing extra time and effort from our listers. The appraised values from the reappraisal were reflected in the 2020 tax bills. This was an appraisal mandated by the State of Vermont and hopefully we will not need another one anytime soon.

ZONING AND PLANNING

PERMIT INFORMATION

The Town of Woodford has zoning regulations in place. Before any land or building is devoted to a new use or change of use, or before the erection of any building or land development, a zoning permit shall be obtained prior to any activity. If you are planning on doing any construction or renovation projects, please inquire to see if you will need a permit before you start. This will save everyone time, money and frustration. You can contact the Town Office at woodfordvt@comcast.net or James Kinney, zoning administrator, at woodfordzoning@comcast.net.

Permits are required for:

- ◇ Construction of anything larger than 36 sq. ft. This includes new homes, additions, decks, porches, mud rooms, garages, outbuildings or sheds and cargo or shipping containers, portable and non-portable;
- ◇ Change in residential property use such as a home occupation or a business activity;
- ◇ Commercial property improvements or use change;
- ◇ Subdivisions or boundary line adjustments;
- ◇ Addition of a pond or swimming pool;

A permit application must be submitted with all required documentation as stated on the application form, including the fee of \$75.00. The application will be reviewed and forwarded to the governing body authorized to approve the permit, the Zoning Administrator, Zoning Board of Adjustments or Planning Commission. Once an application is approved the permit is good for 2 years before it expires and a new or extended application needs to be submitted.

In addition to the Town of Woodford Regulations, Woodford Lake lots must also comply with the Woodford Lake Association Regulations.


In some instances state permits may be required. Landowners are responsible for obtaining all necessary state permits pertaining to their particular project along with local permits. All septic and wastewater permits are issued through the State of Vermont and not approved at the local level.

The Planning Commission recently revised and updated the zoning regulations. These revised regulations were approved through separate public hearings by the Planning Commission and the Select Board. Final approval was completed on July 15, 2020. Revisions are made periodically in order to keep up with the current and future needs of the Town and to make them compliant with any new State laws. The board appreciates any suggestions, comments and ideas from Woodford tax payers and welcome all to attend any meetings. If you would like an electronic copy of these regulations or a zoning application, contact the Town Clerk or Zoning Administrator as noted above.



THE WOODFORD TOWN SCHOLARSHIP

Any present and former Woodford students who are going to graduate from Mount Anthony Union High School or other accredited secondary institute of education are eligible for the Woodford Town Scholarship. - Purpose:** To recognize the achievements and to encourage the potential of Woodford students graduating from High School.
- Eligibility:** The Woodford Town Scholarship Fund will be awarded after the review of the selection committee. The selection committee consists of the Woodford Hollow Elementary School Principal and the Woodford Town Treasurer. The award is to that graduating senior that resides in the Town of Woodford, has applied to and been accepted in a program of further education and who, in the opinion of the committee and on the basis of their high school record, has demonstrated the greatest potential for success in academic or vocational study. The Scholarship will be awarded by the Woodford Select Board based on the recommendation of the selection committee. Notification of the awardees' scholarship will be given to the Woodford Board of Education.
- Presentation:** Award will be made at the Mount Anthony Awards Night or other high school's awards night. The award is given to the college in the name of the awardee upon notification of the college that the awardee is in attendance.

The Bennington County Solid Waste Alliance works to reduce the amount of waste disposed in landfills by promoting recycling and reuse as well as resource conservation. The Alliance offers education and outreach to businesses, schools, institutions, and event organizers in complying with the Universal Recycling Law and other solid waste management requirements primarily by increasing reuse and recycling. These programs help residents, businesses, schools, and institutions find solutions to recycling, food scrap diversion and the disposal of items such as electronic waste, fluorescent bulbs, paint, and others that are banned from landfills.

The Alliance website at www.bcswvt.org and Facebook page (www.facebook.com/solidwastealliance) provide information on:

- battery recycling through the Call2Recycle program
- disposal of used motor oil at retail establishments and transfer stations that accept motor oil
- recycling of paint through the PaintCare program, including retail stores that accept paint
- prescription drug disposal including drop-off locations
- recycling of textiles by the One World Center, Goodwill, and others
- events for disposing household hazardous waste
- disposing of fluorescent bulbs, compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs) and other mercury items at transfer stations, retail establishments and at household hazardous waste collection events
- disposal of E-Waste at area transfer stations, Goodwill, and retail establishments
- diverting food scraps by composting and annual sales of compost bins and kitchen containers

This past year the Alliance assisted 40 businesses as well as several major event organizers primarily via phone, email, and webinars due to COVID-19. Given COVID-19, meals and snacks in most schools are served in classrooms rather than lunchrooms. To help with this, the Alliance received 170 food scrap buckets from the Agency of Natural Resources that we distributed to 17 schools along with instructional signage to allow for food scrap collections within classrooms.

The Alliance held two household hazardous waste events with nearly 500 participating households. We also sold over 180 backyard compost bins and 60 green cones to residents. In 2021, we will hold three household hazardous waste events for residents and small businesses of all thirteen towns. The spring event will be in Bennington and the fall in Dorset. We will hold a third event for residents and businesses of Searsburg and Stamford given the long driving distance they have to either of our other events. Check the website above for updates and details. The Alliance receives most of its funding from the 13 towns, but this past year received grants from the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources and the Agency of Agriculture and Markets.

COVID-19

2020 has been a challenging year for Vermonters. However, the Vermont Department of Health has been recognized as a national leader in managing the virus. This is what the Health Department has done in your community:

- COVID-19 Testing:
 - Since May 2020, the Health Department has provided no-cost Covid-19 testing. Through November 17, 2020, the Vermont Department of Health has held 509 testing clinics, testing 40,796 Vermonters. This important work helps to identify the spread of Covid-19 and is just one of the many ways your Health Department is promoting and protecting the health of Vermonters.
 - Statewide, 224,284 people have been tested as of November 30, 2020
- COVID-19 Cases:
 - As of November 25, 2020, Vermont had the fewest cases of COVID-19 and the lowest rate of cases per 100,000 population of all 50 states.
 - Statewide, as of November 30, 2020, there have been 4,172 cases of COVID-19

Additional Programs

In addition to the COVID-19 response, the Health Department has programs such as influenza vaccinations and WIC.

- Flu Vaccinations: Protecting people from influenza is particularly important in 2020, as the flu may complicate recovery from COVID-19. (Data is as of November 17, 2020)
 - Approximately 213,000* Vermonters have been vaccinated against the flu this season *(Due to technology outages, flu vaccinations given are underreported by approximately 25%-33%.)
- WIC: The Women, Infants, and Children Nutrition Education and Food Supplementation Program remains in full effect, though much of the work that was done in person is now being done remotely through TeleWIC. (Data is as of October 20, 2020)
 - 11,308 infants, children, and pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding people were served by WIC in Vermont, either in traditional format or TeleWIC

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A Little Woodford History

Did You Know?

- Woodford was chartered in 1753, however, settlement did not actually commence until some 25 years later.
- Woodford was probably named after a little village in England and not after a Revolutionary War officer as previously thought. Governor Benning Wentworth was the Royal Governor of the colony and he named all the towns.
- Woodford's first town clerk was Matthew Scott, about 1783.
- Arad Serril and Josiah Laurence were the first settlers of Woodford.
- Lumber producing interests had been the mainstay and support of Woodford's early population.
- The "Hollow" of Woodford was once known as Slab City and later called Harbourville brought about by the extensive industries operated by the Harbour brothers.
- Woodford City was located at the top of the mountain which includes a large body of water called Big Pond and now known as Woodford Lake. Also at Woodford City were two hotels – the Mt. Pleasant House and the Summit House.
- Woodford City was never regularly laid out but was established because of the lumbar and other industries in the area.
- The town had two churches; the one a Union church at Woodford City and the other known as the Advent Christian Church in the Hollow. That one is now the Woodford Town Offices.

A Little Woodford History

- In 1889, there were three schools in Woodford. The school houses were located in the Hollow, (our current graded school), one at Woodford City, and a third in the extreme eastern part of the township.



- Trenor Park, who was the principle owner of the Park McCullough house in North Bennington, was born and raised in Woodford.
- Stage Coaches of passengers used the trail at the end of Burgess Rd. to transport passengers up the mountain around the “Elbow” and Heartwellville.
- The Glastenbury railroad was put in in 1871-1872. Woodburning engines were used until it was electrified in 1895.
- Trolleys ran as far as Camp Comfort in 1895. They ran the trolleys until 1898 when a flood destroyed many of the bridges and so much of the road bed that it was never repaired.



Summary

Town and School budgets are set in anticipation of the collection of property taxes and taxes not paid by some property owners shift the cost burden onto those that do. It is the best interest of the Town of Woodford and its residents that property taxes be paid when they are due.

Woodford's collection policy recognizes that individuals may go through periods of financial difficulty, but in order to be fair to all town taxpayers, the policy asserts that, as a matter of principle, shifting the burden of one property owner's debt onto other property owners in the town is not appropriate. A taxpayer who becomes delinquent is encouraged to find alternative resources to pay in full as soon as possible.

Delinquent taxes represent a lien on the property that will remain in effect until the delinquent taxes, plus penalty and interest, have been paid in full.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to treat Woodford taxpayers fairly by establishing clear guidelines that relate to the collection of delinquent taxes.

Policies

Notices:

- The Delinquent Tax Collector will send a notice to each delinquent taxpayer indicating the amount of delinquent taxes, penalty and interest owed within 15 days of receiving the warrant from the Town Treasurer and each quarter thereafter.
- The initial delinquency notice shall include a statement explaining tax abatement options for the delinquent taxpayer (see attached), as well as the steps needed to make adequate payment arrangements (see below).

Penalty and Interest:

Delinquent taxes shall be assessed a penalty of 8% of the total tax due, plus monthly interest on the outstanding balance as follows: an interest rate of 1% per month (or partial month) for the first 3 months, increasing to 1.5% per month (or partial month) on months thereafter until the total balance is paid in full.

Payment Arrangements:

Payments in full are preferred but payment plans can be an option using the following criteria:

- Only payment arrangements that will pay the bill in full before the due date of the next year's tax bill will be accepted.
- Delinquent taxpayers shall submit a written payment arrangement proposal to the Delinquent Tax Collector by midnight, December 31st of same year taxes were due. The proposal shall outline the intended monthly payments and should be accompanied by a good faith payment to the Town.
- Delinquent Tax Collector shall have an approved payment plan with the delinquent taxpayer by January 10th of the **new tax year**.
- Partial payments will be applied first to the interest portion of the amount due. Any remainder will be divided proportionally between the outstanding principal amount of the tax and the 8% penalty.
- Violation of the payment arrangement including, but not limited to, a check returned to the Town for insufficient funds shall make the payment arrangement null and void and payments not fulfilled before the next tax due date will initiate a tax sale immediately.
- Costs, including those associated with returned checks may be included in setting the tax sale amount.
- The Town reserves the right to deny any payment arrangement that does not meet the above criteria.

Regular Procedures:

- Payments may be mailed or hand delivered to the Delinquent Tax Collector.
- The Collector will issue a receipt to the property owner for every payment.
- On a monthly basis, the Collector will deliver to the Town Offices a copy of each receipt issued during the previous month (and retain a copy for his/her records).
- A payment will be credited based on the postmark date or the Town official stamped date received.
- Postdated checks will not be accepted. Requests to hold checks for later deposit will not be honored.
- Cash payments will be accepted at the discretion of the Town official to whom the payment is tendered.

Moderator Dick Frantz opened the meeting at 7:30pm starting with the pledge of allegiance. Dick explained that he is also a member of the Elementary Union school board and that the annual meeting is being held the same time as this one. If a vote is needed he may have to excuse himself to participate in order to make a quorum. Upon hearing no objections Dick introduced Nelson Brownell, State Representative for Woodford and Pownal.

Nelson remarked that he would leave business cards with his contact information and an informational flyer for anyone who is interested. He also explained that if anyone is interested in knowing what legislation is being proposed they can go to legislature.vermont.gov. Here you can see any bills that have been submitted and the ability to send him an email with any comments you may have. He continued to explain current bills he is involved with. Discussion followed concerning Act 250 and the changes that were proposed, particularly elevation construction requirements. It was proposed that anyone building over 2000 ft. would need an Act 250 permit. In Woodford that would affect everyone since Woodford is at 2100 ft. so the proposal was changed to 2500 ft. Other bills included climate study, marijuana law, and 2% option tax. Questions were asked and discussed concerning other bills and all were reminded to go to legislature.vermont.gov for more information of any bill they are interested in. Ryan Thurber commented that Nelson must be confident to represent Woodford which is completely different from Pownal. What is good for one could be catastrophic for the other. He emphasized that the Act 250 proposed changes need to be polished and perfected and if not, to please vote no since Woodford would be greatly affected. Nelson responded that they are already aware that he will be voting no if the bill had a negative effect on Woodford.

All thanked Nelson for attending the meeting. Dick reminded everyone that only registered voters could vote on articles or anything else that was called to vote. Dick took the opportunity to thank the select board and the town clerk for their hard work and keeping the Town running. He then read the warning as posted:

THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF WOODFORD, VERMONT, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN THE TOWN MEETING, ARE HEREBY WARNED AND NOTIFIED TO MEET AT THE WOODFORD TOWN BUILDING ON MONDAY, MARCH 2, 2020 AT 7:30 PM TO TRANSACT THE BUSINESS SPECIFIED BELOW TO BE DONE FROM THE FLOOR:

FOLLOWING COMPLETION OF SUCH BUSINESS, THE MEETING WILL STAND ADJOURNED TO TUESDAY, MARCH 3, 2020 AT THE WOODFORD TOWN BUILDING FROM 7AM TO 7PM FOR ELECTION OF OFFICERS BY BALLOT AND VOTE AS TO WHETHER THEY WISH TO APPROPRIATE \$158,257.44 NECESSARY FOR SUPPORT OF THE TOWN AND \$30,000.00 NECESSARY FOR SUPPORT OF THE HIGHWAY TO BE DONE BY AUSTRALIAN BALLOT.

ARTICLE 1: TO HEAR THE REPORTS OF THE AUDITORS.

Motion by Chuck Suss, 2nd Wayne Tiff to approve. Ryan explained that an outside auditor conducts a financial audit and has found everything to be in line. Municipalities are now responsible for certain things that the State passed laws for and has cost the town budget to increase of up to \$5000 for certain items such as the new solid waste law. Mike Charette, Woodford's representative to the Bennington County Solid Waste Alliance, explained the Universal Recycling Law and other solid waste requirements. There being no further discussion, All in favor, Motion Carries.

ARTICLE 2: TO DETERMINE IF THE TAXES SHALL BE PAID TO THE TREASURER OR A NON DEFINED COLLECTOR OF TAXES.

Motion by Chuck Suss to approve, 2nd by Betty Charette. Chuck thanked the select board for doing the job they do for the amount of money they receive. There being no further discussion, All were in favor, Motion Carries.

ARTICLE 17: SHALL THE VOTERS APPROVE PART TIME SHERIFF DEPARTMENT COVERAGE WITH A SPENDING CAP OF \$11,000 PER YEAR? (NET AMOUNT IS COMPUTED BY: 12 MONTHS PAID TO SHERIFF'S DEPT. LESS 12 MONTHS OF FINES COLLECTED BY THE STATE AND GIVEN TO THE TOWN).

Motion by Chuck Suss to approve, 2nd by Betty Charette. There being no discussion, All were in favor, Motion Carries.

ARTICLE 18: TO CONDUCT ANY OTHER BUSINESS FOUND PROPER WHEN MET (NO BINDING ACTION CAN BE TAKEN UNDER OTHER BUSINESS).

Ryan stated that he had contacted the Town's portfolio advisor concerning how the volatility of the stock market had affected the Town's investment account. She responded that the account has not been affected since it is conservatively invested. Ryan continued to state that the account balance is currently \$450,000 which is \$50,000 less than the \$500,000 goal. Part of this account has been made liquid in order for the town to address capital improvements as needed.

Ryan urged property owners to do their due diligence concerning their property values from the reappraisal. Use the orange cards left by the appraisers to review what is being reported to be sure it is correct. The listers are doing the best they can but the appraising is being done by NEMRC.

Dick Frantz, being a member of the Southwest Union Elementary School District, explained the school budget. The board is struggling to create a budget that works for all students. Student counts are down, the Common Level of Appraisal (CLA) is down and health insurance has been taken over by the State which have all contributed to the increases in the budget. He continued to state that the merger has amounted to a great amount of work in order to make it good for everyone. Woodford still has a reserve fund of \$140,000 that will be used for the Woodford School building. However, we are paying for other towns' situations, as they in turn will pay for Woodford's situation if the need arises.. Ryan noted that Woodford has never borrowed money to run the school but because of the merger, we are now a part of other schools' financial situations. It is a shame that Woodford is now a part of this.

Motion by Chuck Suss to adjourn, 2nd by Betty. There being no further discussion, All were in favor. Motion Carries. Meeting adjourned at 8:12 pm until 7:00 am Tuesday March 3, 2020 for elections by ballot.







Dear Vermont Town Clerks,

The following is in hopes of getting this notice in your town report:

The VT Spay Neuter Incentive Program (VSNIP), under VT Economic Services, helps income challenged care-providers of cats & dogs neutered for \$27.00. The balance is paid ONLY by a \$4.00 fee added to the licensing of dogs, and put into a designated account.

VSNIP is now at "0" funding due to dogs not being registered at least by six months of age. Required by law, a rabies vaccination enables your dog to be licensed. While town offices may not be open to the public, dogs *can* be licensed. Call, provide the rabies certificate, include a check for that amount, and a SASE. **Rabies IS in Vermont and IS deadly.** Tractor Supply Stores are now holding monthly rabies clinics again! Call for their schedule.

Licensing a dog: 1) identifies your dog if lost, **2)** provides proof that your dog is protected from rabies in the event your dog is bitten by a rabid animal {but would still need immediate medical attention}, **3)** bites another animal/person, which could result in the quarantine of your dog or possibly euthanasia to test for rabies if your current vaccination isn't proven, **4)** helps support VSNIP to address the over-population of cats and dogs in VT, and **5)** **§3590. List of dogs and wolf-hybrids not licensed states, in part ...** "the municipal clerk shall notify the owners or keepers of all dogs and wolf-hybrids named on the list that have not already been licensed or inoculated, and after May 30 shall furnish to the legislative body a list of dogs and wolf-hybrids not licensed or inoculated as required by law. **Owners shall also be notified that unlicensed or uninoculated dogs or wolf-hybrids may be destroyed.**" (No one want this, so vaccinate & register – for the protection of your animals and people!

For an application for VSNIP, send a SASE to: VSNIP, PO Box 104, Bridgewater, VT 05034. Indicate if this is for a cat/dog or both. 802-672-5302

VT Volunteer Services for Animals Humane Society has held a "DRIVE UP & POKE! RABIES CLINIC" for several years now. This type of clinic allows us to maintain a safe distance from people while vaccinating dogs and cats. All people stay in cars, masks are required. Pre-registration is encouraged. If you would like the paperwork we've developed to share with whomever usually does rabies clinics in your area, we'd be happy to share.

BCRC Annual Report and FY 2022 Municipal Assessments

Dear Mr. Thurber,

The Bennington County Regional Commission (BCRC) provides planning and economic development support for seventeen towns and villages. Most of the BCRC's funding is derived from grants awarded by state and federal agencies, including the Vermont Agency of Commerce and Community Development, the Vermont Agency of Transportation, the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation, the Vermont Department of Emergency Management, the US Environmental Protection Agency, and the US Department of Agriculture. A critical component of the organization's funding, however, is obtained from the annual appropriations received from its member municipalities. These funds are necessary to meet local matching requirements for many of the grant programs and to support our direct assistance to municipalities.

The BCRC maintains an office in downtown Bennington; as of January 2021 we are relocating to a slightly smaller and less costly office suite at 210 South Street. The Commission is overseen by municipally appointed commissioners from each of the member towns and villages as well as commissioners representing specific interests such as economic development, housing, transportation, and public health. The BCRC currently employs eight full-time and one part-time staff, with additional assistance provided by a VISTA through the SerVermont program. Principal areas of work with assigned staff responsibilities include: municipal and regional planning, community and economic development, transportation, environmental planning, emergency management planning, energy planning, public health, and solid waste planning and management. The BCRC provides contracted staff support to the Bennington County Solid Waste Alliance and the Bennington County Industrial Corporation (BCIC), while working cooperatively with numerous community and business organizations.

Like everyone, the BCRC has been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. The office transitioned to remote work and meetings in April and, while staff have recently started spending some time in the office, it generally is easiest to contact us via email (see the contacts page at www.bcrct.org). Fortunately, technology has allowed us to continue work on all of our projects with little interruption in progress. Of course, significant staff resources have been dedicated to providing assistance to businesses and municipalities as they work to navigate the challenges associated with necessary changes to the way business is conducted, staffing and revenue disruptions, and charting a course forward through and beyond the current crisis.





Another change to be aware of is a recent update to the BCRC Bylaws that affects municipal representation and voting procedures. Each municipality (town, village, and the unorganized town of Glastenbury) is now entitled to one voting commissioner, appointed by the select board, trustees, or town supervisor. In addition, each town also will be represented by one non-voting co-commissioner (who can vote when the commissioner is not present or is unable to vote). Previously, towns were allotted two commissioner positions and two votes. The Bylaws also now specifically authorize the casting of votes for most matters via email, fax, or regular USPS mail. If a municipality fails to appoint a commissioner representative, the chair of that municipal planning commission shall be considered to be the commissioner, until such time that an official appointment is made. Please communicate with your existing commissioner(s) and consult with them regarding these changes. A form is included in this package requesting that you submit the name and contact information for your commissioner and, if applicable, co-commissioner.


The BCRC's budget for FY 2021 is \$1,481,442 of which \$102,686 is provided through town and village member dues. The organization's operating budget has increased significantly over the past decade as additional responsibilities have been assigned to regional planning commissions and with initiatives to improve efficiencies through the consolidation of regional programs (such as economic development, emergency management, and solid waste) under its umbrella. We have maintained the municipal dues at the same level for the past three years. **For the coming year, based on Woodford's population of 342, the BCRC appropriation request is \$3,000.**

Re: **Request for Town Appropriation, Vermont Rural Fire Protection Program**

Dear Board of Selectpersons, Town Clerks and Auditors:

On behalf of the Vermont Rural Fire Protection Task Force, I am writing to request your support of the Vermont Rural Fire Protection (RFP) Program, formerly called the Dry Hydrant Grant Program. The RFP program helps Vermont communities protect lives, property and natural resources by enhancing fire suppression resources. Program Manager and Engineering Technician Troy Dare helps local fire departments identify appropriate sites for dry hydrants and other rural water supply systems, design installations, and find financial support to support the costs of construction. During the **23+ years** of the program, almost **1200 grants** totaling **\$2.6 million** have been provided to Vermont towns for installation of new rural fire protection systems, as well as for replacements and repairs.

The Rural Fire Protection Program has made a successful transition from the Northern Vermont and George D. Aiken Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Councils to the Vermont Association of Conservation Districts (VACD). VACD is the membership association of Vermont's fourteen Natural Resources Conservations Districts, whose mission is to work with landowners and communities to protect natural resources and support the working landscape throughout the state.

We have made several adjustments to the Rural Fire Protection Grant Program, including changing the name from Dry Hydrant Grant Program to Rural Fire Protection Program to better reflect the diverse range of projects we support. We have increased the maximum grant award amount from \$5,000 to \$10,000 per project. New rural fire protection systems, along with repair, replacement, relocation, upgrades of existing systems, and drafting site development, are eligible for grant funding on an ongoing basis. And we now consider applications from Vermont towns and fire departments on a revolving basis throughout the year rather than just once a year.

The annual expense of the Rural Fire Protection Program in FY 2020 was \$200,432, of which \$107,524 was paid in grants to Vermont communities for construction costs. The remaining budget covered site assessments, project design and program oversight. Most of our funding comes from the Vermont Department of Public Safety through annual appropriations by the Vermont Legislature. In addition, the program receives support from the US Forest Service through the Vermont Department of Forests, Parks


and Recreation. Unfortunately, these grants do not completely cover the costs of the program. Therefore, we are respectfully requesting that you include a \$100 appropriation in your town budget to support the Rural Fire Protection Program. Since last year's appropriation request, we have received nearly \$10,000 in town appropriations from almost 100 towns, with contributions still coming in. We are deeply grateful for your ongoing support.

215 Vermont communities have benefitted from the Rural Fire Protection program. Our goal is to extend this support to all Vermont towns and continue to assist local fire departments in reducing the risk of injury, loss of life, and damage to property and natural resources, thereby improving the safety and welfare of Vermont communities.

Enclosed please find a summary report for the Rural Water Supply Grant Program, as well as an invoice and W-9 from VACD in case they are required. VACD's tax form 990 is also available upon request. In 2019, VNAHSR's dedicated staff made more than 141,507 visits to 3,212 patients. In the town of Woodford, we provided 153 visits to 3 individuals.

BENNINGTON FREE LIBRARY

Basic computing skills and the ability to navigate the Internet are necessary for citizens to succeed in our 21st Century society. As more and more government agencies, businesses and employers require online access and minimal computing skills, the library continues to bridge the “Information Divide” by providing access to timely and relevant information and technology resources. Expanded virtual services and assistance throughout the current pandemic are services we provide to fulfill this need.

In response to the pandemic and to avoid becoming a vector for spreading the COVID-19 virus, the library discontinued open access to the library in mid-March and instituted “library takout” services soon after. Throughout the governor’s mandated quarantine, the library continued to provide critical resources, including library takeout, online and phone reference assistance, summer reading activities, programs and handouts, deliveries to day care centers, book giveaways at the library and during food distribution events.

Library takeout allowed patrons to continue borrowing video and reading materials while the library was physically closed for public use. Online and phone reference continued 5 days a week and free 24/7 wi-fi service has been available without interruption. Fines for overdue books were suspended indefinitely to limit exposure.

The library subscribed to a video streaming service while library staff developed virtual programming including weekly story hours in order to continue to offer a high level of service to area residents. Expanded outreach through social media and our website continues to provide links to a broad variety of online health, educational and recreational materials which are updated frequently.

A “silver lining” of the mandated closure was that it provided an opportunity to complete building improvements with dedicated funds raised through our Capital Improvement Campaign. These included updating the Main Street building’s heating system, installing new flooring throughout the library and painting the library’s interior and portions of the exterior.

This summer a phased reopening allowed access to computers, reference and children’s room assistance and collections and expanded homeschooling resources, while a ramped up cleaning routine kept patrons and staff safe.

The Bennington Free Library is a unique institution, supporting the life-long interests of a diverse community. Our success is due, in part, to the financial support received from the Town of Woodford. Woodford residents have been enthusiastic patrons of the library for many years, and with your support we will continue to provide the relevant and quality resources they deserve. Thank you for your ongoing support.

CENTER FOR RESTORATIVE JUSTICE

It is with your town support, the Center for Restorative Justice (CRJ) was able to serve over 1,225 individuals this past year. Even in a year with an unprecedented pandemic, CRJ continued to provide county-wide, community justice programs and intervention services. CRJ's programs are based on the principles of restorative justice, a philosophy of justice that focuses on the people and communities harmed by crime; it emphasizes bringing together everyone affected by wrongdoing to address needs and responsibilities.

Some CRJ highlights from this past year include:

- CRJ launched a new program this past year called Threads. Threads is a teen clothing boutique shop that accepts donations of quality, gently used clothing. Any teen can come shop at Threads and all clothing and accessories are free of charge.
- 165 individuals with suspended licenses were assisted to get legally back on the road.
- 238 youth and adults participated in CRJ's Court Diversion Programs; after successful completion, including repairing the harms caused to their victims, the individuals' criminal records were expunged.
- 124 youth cited for underage drinking or possession of marijuana participated in CRJ's screening, education and treatment program; successful completions resulted in dismissal of civil charges.
- 173 students in Manchester, Arlington, and Bennington were served through CRJ's school-based Truancy Program and Restorative Alternative Program.
- 138 at-risk teens received services through one of CRJ's many youth intervention programs such as The Lounge (after school program), movie nights, mentoring and life skill development.
- 47 adults reentering the community from incarceration were supported through a variety of programs to help them positively reintegrate into the community.
- 340 individuals were served through CRJ's many other programs including victim impact classes, risk assessments and screenings, pre-charge programming and expungement assistance.

CRJ is grateful for your continued support in helping individuals to get their lives on the right track, empowering victims to have a voice in the justice process, and helping to restore and strengthen our communities.


We support the Town of Woodford by:

- Housing a child-friendly interview room and a private family waiting room.
- Serving as a resource to any adult working with children.
- Holding several community awareness events during the month of April. We have continued the #Benningtongoesblue campaign, Clothesline Project, Candlelight Vigil, and our pinwheel garden. We hope to find a spot in your community for a small pinwheel garden in April- hopefully, you will spot a bit of color.

Report to the Citizens of Woodford

This report describes the services that the Southwestern Vermont Council on Aging (SVCOA) provided to elders in Woodford in 2020:

Nutrition Support

SVCOA helped provide 147 nutritious meals to 6 Woodford elders who came together at a community luncheon site in your area while enjoying the company of others.

The Council also remained available to provide home delivered meals, often referred to as "Meals on Wheels," to homebound elders residing in Woodford.

Case Management Assistance:

SVCOA case management and outreach staff helped 1 elder in your community for a total of 21.75 hours. Case managers meet with an elder privately in the elder's home or at another agreed upon location and assess the elder's situation. They will work with the elder to identify needs and talk about possible services available to address those needs. If the elder desires, the case manager will link the client to appropriate services, coordinate and monitor services as necessary, and provide information and assistance to caregivers. Case managers also help elders connect with in-home assistance programs, including a program called Choices for Care. This program is especially helpful to frail elders facing long term care placement who still wish to remain at home.

Other Services and Support:

1) "Senior Helpline" assistance at 1-800-642-5119. Our Senior HelpLine staff provide telephone support to elders and others who need information on available programs and community resources; 2) Medicare and health benefit counseling information and assistance through our State Health Insurance Program; 3) Legal service assistance through the Vermont Senior Citizens Law Project; 4) Information about elder issues and opportunities via various agency articles and publications 5) Nutrition education and counseling services provided by SVCOA's Registered Dietician; 6) Senior Companion support for frail, homebound elders; 7) Outreach services to elders dealing with mental health issues through our Elder Care Clinician. This service is provided in cooperation with Rutland County Mental Health; 8) Transportation assistance; 9) Caregiver support, information and respite to family members and others who are providing much needed help to elders in need of assistance; 10) Money Management programs that offer either a volunteer bill payer or representative payee services to elders and younger disabled individuals.

Blood Drives


During the last fiscal year, we collected **852 pints** of lifesaving blood in **Bennington County**

Project Against Violent Encounters (PAVE) is the only domestic and sexual violence advocacy agency in Bennington County. For nearly 40 years PAVE has provided compassionate support, practical services and the pathway to healing and safety for countless victims of domestic and sexual violence, dating violence and stalking throughout Bennington County.

PAVE has grown from a crisis hotline to the multiple and comprehensive support services we now provide. These services include a 24-hour crisis hotline, court and social service advocacy, case management, emergency financial assistance, access to legal services, emergency shelter, supervised visitation services, parenting classes, community awareness, school-based prevention education and more. We are thrilled to announce the addition of a transitional housing program beginning in 2021.

In the past year, several residents of Woodford received comprehensive services through PAVE. In addition to the services listed above, 1 family with 2 children engaged in supervised visitation services through our Family Time Center; this is a critical, often court-ordered service that ensures safe and healthy contact for children with a non-custodial parent.

Domestic violence is the third leading cause of homelessness among families. Our emergency shelter program provides families with short-term housing and case management services with the goal of obtaining safe, permanent housing. In the past year we provided 65 adults and 39 children in Bennington County with 5,028 nights of shelter services.

To stop the generational cycle of abuse, we must start early and invest in prevention strategies that provide healthy parent-child relationships, friendships and dating relationships. Through our education and empowerment programs pre-kindergarten to college; Nurturing Parenting classes, Women's Support Groups, Healthy Mind, Body and Family workshops and Financial Literacy Program, we've helped over 3,500 children, teachers and other adults learn new skills and techniques.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, staff and families served, I thank the residents of Woodford for your ongoing support; it allows us to create greater opportunities for the people impacted by domestic and/or sexual violence who need our services each year.
