Dear Members of the Public Service Board:

On Monday, March 14, 2016 I visited Melodie McLane at her home at 1179 Georgia Mountain Road in Georgia, VT. My visit was prompted after learning that Melodie and her family were living uncomfortably with the sounds produced from the wind turbines on Georgia Mountain.

I arrived at the McLane residence at 5:30 PM, or thereabouts, and stayed for roughly an hour. I spent time in the front of their home, on their porch, inside their living room, and across the road at their neighbor's home. Although I did go indoors, the television was on and we were in conversation, thus the atmosphere was not such that I could properly evaluate sound from the turbines.

However, while outside, I have no other way to qualify my experience than sharing that I found the sound made by the turbines as too loud and not likely conducive to my being comfortable outdoors for an extended period of time.

I hope you will take my experience into consideration as you move forward with your examination of sound from wind turbines.
