I am a speech language pathologist working in Rutland city public schools. I am 1.5 years away from retirement so naturally I have been alarmed lately as I follow the news in regards to the underfunded pension fund and the proposed cuts and changes.

I can recall a time about 10-15 years ago when we as teachers were asked to make sacrifices for the sake of the pension's long term health. Years were added and we made higher contributions to help. Now we are asked again to make significant sacrifices during a time when we have never worked so hard under more stressful circumstances.
