**Lt. Governor to work at Kingdom Creamery of Vermont Wednesday**

Lt. Governor Phil Scott continues his “Vermont Everyday Jobs Tour” on Wednesday, July 30, working alongside employees at Kingdom Creamery of Vermont’s ice cream production plant and farm in East Hardwick. Lt. Gov. Scott will learn first-hand just how much work goes into making a single pint of ice cream by: helping with the production run, filling orders, making the flavor mixes, cleaning the equipment, doing chores in the cow barn, and maybe even giving a hayride tour to local children.

Kingdom Creamery of Vermont is a family-owned ice cream company, founded by the Michaud’s in 2011. The idea of making ice cream came to the family in 2009, when falling milk prices forced them to look for new ways to make their dairy farm profitable. Kingdom Creamery now boasts a variety of Vermont-made ice cream and yogurt flavours, courtesy of their cows, which live on the family’s farm across the road from the plant.
