1. The meeting was called to order at 9:08 a.m.

9. **Miscellaneous Correspondence**

- a. **Julia Smith, D.V.M.**, sent the Board a letter asking if she was eligible for licensure in Vermont. Diane was requested to send her an endorsement application and to highlight the section of the application that outlines the 3000 hours of experience. Dr. Smith may be able to apply for licensure on the basis of endorsement if she is able to show proof of experience.
- b. **Susan McMillen, D.V.M.**, was granted a temporary license. She however, was not able to attend the Board's meeting for licensure due to family matters. She requested that the Board grant her an extension on her temporary license. Approved. Dr. McMillen's temporary license will be extended until July 10, 2003.
- c. **Donald Thompson, D.V.M.** wrote the Board asking if oxytocin could be distributed to farmers without a prescription from a veterinarian. He also indicated that dairymen have told him that they are now able to purchase 50 gallon drums of formaldehyde for use in foot-baths, from another route truck. He is wondering if this is legal. Dr. Basol will check for the answers to these questions and update the Board at their next meeting.
